## France (CNOSF)



● *Under the patronage of Mr. Jean-Pierre Soisson, Minister of Youth Affairs, Sport and Recreation, the Museum of French Sport is presenting a remarkable exhibition from 6th November to 3rd January in the Forum of Les Halles in Paris. "One Hundred and Fifty Years of Sport" is a sort of fresco reviving for an enthusiastic public the sporting feats, some forgotten, some not, that dot the pages of the history of French sport. Manuscripts, posters, photographs and objects used by the athletes in their struggle for victory form the major part of this kaleidoscope of success.*

These exhibits needed to be arranged in some order : the Museum of Sport has divided them into three main periods, the "Early Days" from 1830 to 1914 with the first hesitant appearance of a few sports, "Coming of Age" from 1919 to 1932, marked by a few great French sports figures—Carpentier, the boxer, Guillemot, the winner of the 5000 m at the Games in Antwerp, Suzanne Lenglen, the tennis player—and "From Yesterday to Today" featuring a number of Olympic medal-winners with well-known names : Christine Caron, Jean-Claude Killy, Marielle and Christine Goitschel and Pierre Jonquère d'Orliola to mention but a few.

## Poland (COP)



● *At the height of preparations for the Winter Games in Lake Placid and the Summer Games in Moscow, Polish television has embarked on a tremendous endeavour in support of Olympism. On the 19th of each month Polish viewers are treated to the French series "The marvellous history of the Olympic Games", with commentary provided by highly capable specialists. Seeking to pursue this highly commendable avenue, it has also organised two round table discussions, one on amateurism and the other on doping.*

## People's Republic of China (COC)



● *To mark its return to the Olympic fold at the XIIIth Winter Games, the COC has decided to send 28 athletes to Lake Placid. The delegation will consist of 15 speed skaters (8 men and 7 women), 4 figures skaters (1 + 1 + one entry in the pairs competition), 2 Alpine skiers and 5 biathlon competitors.*

## Sweden (COS)



● *Sigge Bergman (SWE), having reached the age of retirement, has stepped down from the many posts he held in both national and international sport, among them Secretary General of the FIS and member of the Executive Board of Sweden's NOC. Following his retirement, several honorary titles were bestowed upon him, including those of Honorary President of the Swedish Skiing Association and Honorary Member of the Swedish Olympic Committee, the FIS and the Swiss Skiing Association. Mr. Bergman will continue to contribute to the "Olympic Review" with his reports on the activities of the FIS.*
