


In remembrance of
fallen ‘Currahees’






The 506th Airborne Infantry Regiment first saw combat on June 6, 1944 – D-Day.

country.**





recognize their sacrifice.**




**Brigade Commander

The Fort Campbell monument will include six granite stones.


The regiment was the sixth airborne unit formed during World War II.
