Grade Point Average and Ranking

Official GPA is based on all semesters of work in all classes and is computed on a 4.0 scale.

AP courses and Dual Credit courses are assigned an additional 10 points on the numerical grade.

Honors and upper level foreign language are assigned an additional 5 points. Rank in class is determined by cumulative GPA. AP and Honors courses are assigned additional quality points according to the newly adopted (fall, 2007) scale above.
