

Vintrasian Carmelite Succession Line (Eglise Gnostique Apostolique)

"I want the man bearing the cross to be its only victim" - Eugene Vintras.

Vintraism and the Church of Carmel was a French occult church founded by Pierre-Michel Eugéne Vintras, a psychic medium and prophet. In 1839 Vintras founded the "Work of Mercy" (l'Oeuvre de la Miséricorde) and proclaimed visionary communications from the Archangel Michael, the Holy Ghost, Virgin Mary and St. Joseph. He had been informed in the visions that he was the reincarnation of prophet Elijah, and that a man named Charles Naundorf was the true king of France. Vintras used upsidedown crosses, sexual magic in prayers and performed miracles with bloodstained hostie, some of which is described in the works of Eliphas Levi.

Vintras died in 1875 and the notorious and infamous Abbé de Boullan (Joseph-Antoine Boullan) assumed control of the Church of Carmel. Accusations of Satanism against Boullan were made by Stanislas de Guatia and Oswald Wirth, among others. Boullan was the rolemodel of Dr. Johannes in J.K. Huysmann's book La Bas.

Boullan's and Vintras' teaching was based on a sex-magick which were called celéstification and consisted of two different forms: a) sexual intercourse with the higher spiritworld and chosen human individuals through unions de sagesse, or b) sexual intercourse with the lower and elemental spiritworld and ordinary human individuals through unions de charité. (Carl Kohl, 1904).

This Succession Line, from Jean Bricaud and forward, is sometimes refered to as Eglise Gnostique Apostolique.
