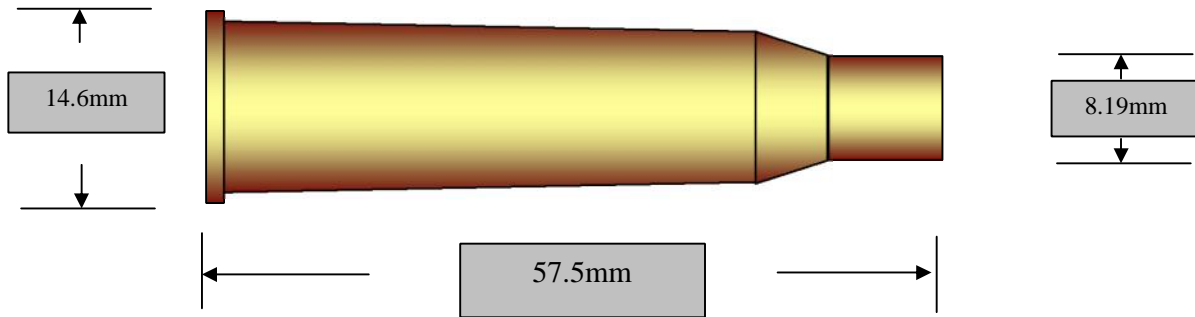


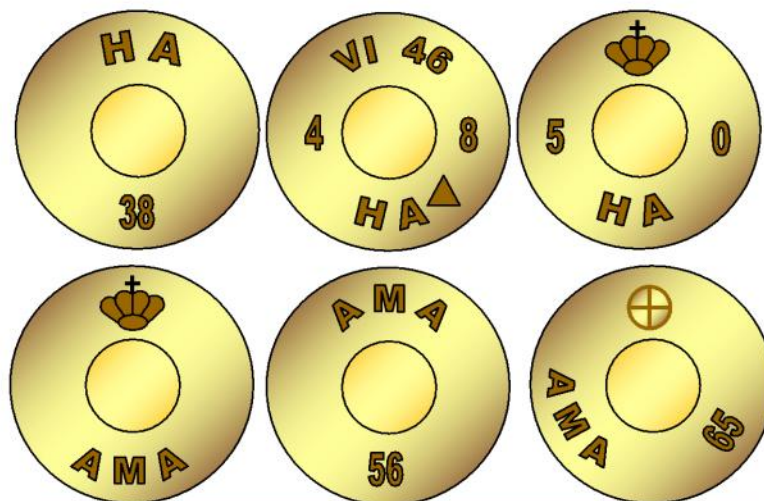
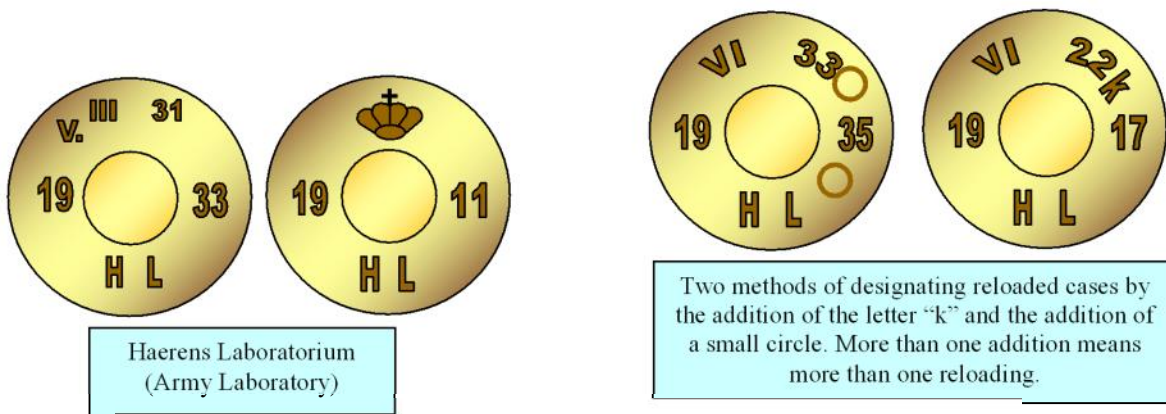
## 8x58R

The Danish 8x58R was developed in 1888 and adopted by Norway at that time for use in her Remington RB Carbine. Sweden adopted the cartridge in 1889 for use in their Remington RB rifle and Denmark adopted it in the same year for use in her M1889 rifle, which was based on the Norwegian Krag-Jorgensen.

The cartridge was little used by Sweden and Norway but Denmark used it as their sole cartridge from 1889 to 1945. Such a long span ensures that there are many variations of the cartridge to be found.

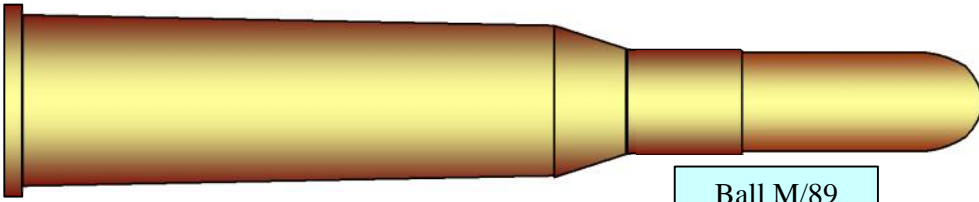

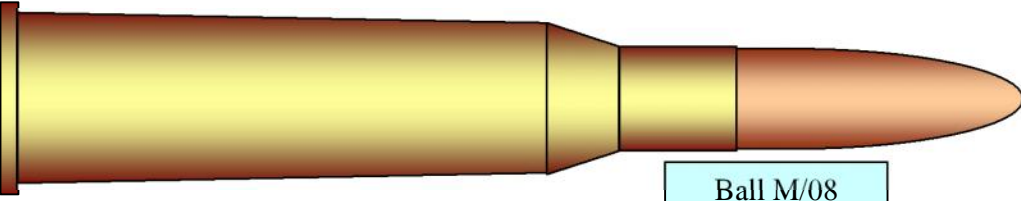


HAERENS AMMUNITIONSARSENALET, COPENHAGEN.  
The bottom three are the modern version of the top three, the change occurred in or about 1951.

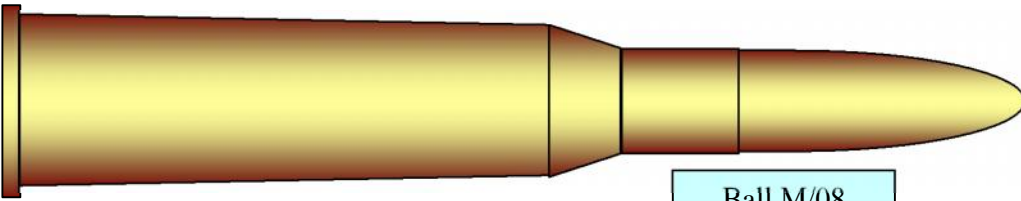
