Celebrity Car from “2 Fast 2 Furious” to be Auctioned

The Auction will be held June 12-14 in the QuikTrip Center at Expo Square

TULSA, Okla. (May 22, 2009) — The infamous bubblegum pink Honda S2000 that was featured in the movie “2 Fast 2 Furious” in 2001 will be auctioned at the 37th annual Leake Collector Car Show & Auction, June 12-14. The Honda was also featured in Pink’s music video for Stupid Girl. The car has its original custom airbrushed graphics, digital dash screen and 18 inch Montegi wheels.

The car was driven by Suki (Devon Aoki) in the movie, and boasts a VeilSide kit, full neon lights and fuzzy seats. The winning bidder will receive complete documentation on the car, including the original title to Universal Pictures, a copy of the movie, a signed photo of actress Devon Aoki with the car and a certificate of authenticity from Picture Car Warehouse.

Leake Auction Company has worked with Haven Miller’s Car Collection to bring several high-profile celebrity cars to auction. During the 2009 San Antonio auction, a 1970 Dodge Challenger from “The Bucket List” sold for \$38,340 and a 2001 Harley Davidson from “Transformers 2” auctioned for \$16,416. Both cars were consigned by Haven Miller. Haven Miller has been around the movie industry both behind and in front of the camera.
