It was the first Irish American golf tournament organized by Peg Rowan to honor her son, John, missing since February 2001, and to raise money for the Justice Coalition. More than 100 golfers played the 18 holes, and the winning foursome was Millennium Electric; runner-up Nader Pest Raiders.

Prior to tee-off, Swedish golf pro Anders Forsbrand, who generously donated his time and expertise, was auctioned off for \$1,050 to the Nader team. Larry Freeman, administrator of Wolfson's Children's Hospital, facilitated Forsbrand's participation.

Following a typical Irish meal of corned beef and cabbage, delicious and efficiently served by the Club's special events staff, FirstCoast News Sports Director Dan Hicken emceed the

recognition program. Charlene Shirk (PGA Community Relations Director), assisted by Dan, auctioned off such items as a hunting trip to North Carolina, a signed photograph of Larry Bird and Magic Johnson and a Jaguars helmet autographed by Jaguars LB Mike Peterson. Mike and his wife came early that day to lend their support and pose for pictures with all who desired

The Waterford Crystal Company from Ireland donated first, second and third prizes, and many other lovely items were sold in the silent auction: more Waterford crystal, Irish linen, Tiffany lamps, choice sports memorabilia prints, pictures, jewelry, knives, and so on. JSO Undersheriff Frank Mackesy told how close he and his family have become with the Rowans since John's disappearance six years ago and how frustrating it is not to know what happened to him. He pledged JSO's continued efforts to solve the case and bring justice. Charlene Shirk also spoke of knowing from the first time she interviewed the Rowans (for FirstCoast News) that John would not have willingly walked away from his beloved family.

Peg Rowan, her family, the tournament committee and other volunteers worked tirelessly to coordinate this event, described by many as the best tournament in which they have participated. Peg gives credit and her endless appreciation to Jack Aschenbach, head golf pro at Queens Harbor, for his time and expertise in pulling it all together.

Special thanks to all the media coverage by FirstCoast News, Fox News and WIXT Channel 4. Dan Hicken said when he was asked to emcee the event, he immediately cleared his schedule to ensure he would be available because he believes so much in what Coalition the Justice contributes to the community. 
We are so grateful to all who helped make this a memorable, fun-filled and beneficial event, and we look forward to an even greater tournament next year. –Shirley Shaw
