
The Singer and His Song



We often forget that *Gitanjali*, the book of poems for which Tagore was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1913, was actually a collection of songs. In his lifetime, Tagore was most renowned for his songwriting, but today his music remains largely unknown and his songs are scarcely understood. Much of what Tagore experienced in life—his frustrations, his grief, his sense of devastation—were expressed in songs. The distinction of his musical oeuvre lies in the near-perfect balance that he achieved between the evocative lyrics, the matching melody, and the rhythmic structure in which each song is bound. This biography maps the musical journey of the poet with anecdotes and allusions, and includes translations of some of Tagore's most evocative songs. It is illustrated with photographs and paintings that are crucial to the understanding of Tagore as a musician.
