Running on Day 6, 13 August

Cheng Siew Peng, 21 Special Olympics athlete

Siew Peng was born with joint laxity in her right knee, but became stronger and fitter with her active participation in sports. Taking part in sports competitions has helped Siew Peng to gain self confidence. Her outstanding performance at the Special Olympics Singapore 6th National Games in 2005 earned her a place to compete at the Special Olympics World Summer Games in Shanghai in 2007. Siew Peng won a Gold medal in the 800m run and 2 Silver medals in the 400m run and 4x 100m relay. Siew Peng also competes alongside able-bodied athletes in 5km and 10km races. She was previously a torchbearer during Special Olympics Singapore's 7th National Games in 2009.

Low Wei Jie, 12

Wei Jie ran for almost 15km in flip flops to follow the Youth Olympic Flame on the morning of 10 August, snapping pictures of the torch bearers along the way. He kept on running for two and a half hours despite bouts of rain and scratches on his ankle, and caught the attention of the media and the Singapore public. Since then, he has become a national torch relay hero. The Singapore Youth Olympic Games Committee (SYOGOC) announced that it would make Wei Jie a torchbearer, and he will run at the headquarters of the SYOGOC.

Koh-Leong Swee Ling, 52 Winner of Watermark Award 2009

Dunman High School math teacher Mrs Koh-Leong Swee Ling, a passionate water conservation activist, will be carrying the torch on a boat across the Marina Bay. The award-winning educator has worked tirelessly for her cause, always seeking innovative ways to impress upon youths the importance of saving Singapore's precious water resources. As the teacher in-charge of the Dunman High School (DHS) Environment Club, she has been instrumental in spearheading initiatives to raise water awareness amongst students of other schools, including organising the 1st Youth Water Conference in 2007. She also formed and leads the Environmental Education Committee at DHS. Her latest project is the Marina Barrage Art project to engage primary school students on water issues.

Eugene Heng, 61 *Chairman of the Waterways Watch Society*

Eugene and his group of volunteers have spent many weekends cruising along Kallang or Singapore River to ensure that the rivers are clean. Set up nine years ago, Waterways Watch Society (WWS) aims to bring together like-minded people to monitor, restore and protect the aesthetics of our waterways. Apart from river patrols, WWS develops and implements public education programmes, spreading the important message of keeping our waterways and riverbanks clean to the community.
