The gateway to the Staffordshire Hoard

'Such is the wealth of stories that relate to the Staffordshire Hoard, that they deserve to be told and retold across the region, and further afield, for many years to come.'

The Staffordshire Hoard Partnership is working on plans to develop a Mercian Trail across the region to help bring the story of the hoard to life for residents, school children, students and tourists alike.

The proposed trail will take visitors on a voyage of Anglo-Saxon discovery - from exploring ancient Britain's international significance as a trading hub, and early jewellery making at Birmingham Museum & Art Gallery, through to experiencing Staffordshire's own Anglo-Saxon history, and unearthing the county's early pottery history, in the Potteries Museum & Art Gallery in Stoke on Trent. The hoard's links to early Christendom, the Lichfield Angel and the Chad Gospels will be seen at Lichfield Cathedral. The trail will then move to Tamworth Castle, where the bloody battles and the history of the King's Seat will come to life.

To make sure that everyone can experience this new and momentous piece of the region's history, a touring exhibition, that will start life in the Shire Hall in Stafford, will tell the story of the hoard through the archaeologist's eye.

Councillor David S. Smith, Leader of Lichfield District Council, Chairman of the West Midlands Regional Assembly and Member of the West Midlands Marketing Board, said: "We're hoping to develop the Mercian Trail as we believe it will be a fantastic way to tell the thrilling stories of the hoard to as many people as possible. It will also be a great way to instill pride in our communities, and engage as many local people as possible in the hoard, as its captivating story unfolds. We are incredibly grateful to our partners for working alongside us to help bring forward plans for the Mercian Trail across the county and region."









The Staffordshire Hoard partnership includes Birmingham, Stoke on Trent, Lichfield District, Tamworth Borough and Staffordshire County councils. The development of the Mercian Trail is dependent on the success of the initial fundraising efforts. Future fundraising will also be needed to help fund displays and exhibitions in venues across the region.
