ORDER ARMS ON THE LAST NOTE OF THE MUSIC. OUR
CIVILIAN GUESTS SHOULD PLACE THEIR RIGHT HAND OVER
THEIR HEART DURING THE NATIONAL ANTHEM. WE
REQUEST CELLULAR PHONES AND PAGERS BE TURNED OFF
AT THIS TIME. THE CEREMONY WILL BEGIN SHORTLY,
THANK YOU."

OPENING NARRATION/INTRODUCTIN OF OFFICIAL PARTY

0900 Hours, Start Narration

Narrator "GOOD MORNING LADIES AND GENTLEMEN. WHO WERE PRISIONERS OF WAR AND/OR WHO ARE STILL
UNACCOUNTED FOR FROM OUR COUNTRY'S CONFLICTS."

MISSING MAN TABLE READING

Narrator "TODAY WE HAVE SOME HONORED GUESTS WHO CAN NOT BE WITH US. SO WE REMEMBER THEM IN THE FOLLOWING WAY. PLEASE RISE.

PLEASE DIRECT YOUR ATTENTION TO THE POW/MIA TABLE SETTING IN FRONT OF THE PODIUM, AS A PHYSICAL SYMBOL OF THE THOUSANDS OF AMERICAN PRISONERS OF WAR AND MISSING IN ACTION STILL UNACCOUNTED FOR FROM ALL FOREIGN CONFLICTS. AND AS A REMINDER FOR US ALL TO SPARE NO EFFORT TO SECURE THE RELEASE OF ANY AMERICAN PRISONERS FROM CAPTIVITY, THE REPATRIATION OF THE REMAINS OF THOSE WHO DIED BRAVELY IN DEFENSE OF LIBERTY, AND A FULL ACCOUNTING OF THOSE MISSING IN ACTION.

PLEASE BE SEATED... WHILE I EXPLAIN THE MEANING OF THIS SPECIAL TABLE, AND JOIN ME FOR A MOMENT OF SILENT PRAYER AT THE END.

THE TABLE IS SMALL, SYMBOLIZING THE HELPLESSNESS OF ONE PERSON, ALONE AGAINST HIS OPPRESSORS. (REMEMBER)

THE CLOTH IS WHITE – SYMBOLIZING THE PURITY OF THEIR MOTIVES WHEN ANSWERING THE CALL TO DUTY. (REMEMBER)

THE SINGLE RED ROSE REMINDS US OF THE LIVES OF THESE MEN....AND THEIR LOVED ONES AND FRIENDS WHO KEEP THE FAITH, WHILE SEEKING ANSWERS. (REMEMBER)

THE RED RIBBON SYMBOLIZES OUR CONTINUED

DETERMINATION TO ACCOUNT FOR THEM. (REMEMBER)

A SLICE OF LEMON REMINDS US OF THE BITTER FATE OF THOSE CAPTURED AND MISSING IN A FOREIGN LAND.

(REMEMBER)

A PINCH OF SALT SYMBOLIZES THE TEARS OF OUR MISSING AND THEIR FAMILIES WHO LONG FOR ANSWERS AFTER DECADES OF UNCERTAINTY. (REMEMBER)

THE BIBLE REPRESENTS THE STRENGTH GAINED THROUGH
FAITH IN OUR COUNTRY, FOUNDED AS ONE NATION UNDER
GOD, TO SUSTAIN THOSE LOST FROM OUR MIDST.
(REMEMBER)

THE GLASS IS INVERTED – TO SYMBOLIZE THEIR INABILITY
TO SHARE THIS EVENT WITH US. (REMEMBER)

THE CHAIR IS EMPTY - THEY ARE NOT HERE.

REMEMBER THEM...FOR SURELY THEY HAVE NOT FORSAKEN
US...REMEMBER THEM

PLEASE JOIN ME IN A SILENT MOMENT OF REFLECTION

Narrator pauses for 10 – 15 seconds in silence

REMARKS

Narrator "TODAY'S THREE SPEAKERS HONORING AMERICA'S POWS

AND MISSING HAVE SOME THOUGHTS TO SHARE WITH US.

FIRST, ONE OF TODAY'S HOSTS AND THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE AIR FORCE SERGEANTS ASSOCIATION, CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT (RET) RICHARD DEAN."

Chief Dean proceeds to podium, makes remarks, & returns to his seat.

Narrator "LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, PROVIDING HIS THOUGHTS IS THE SECOND OF TODAY'S HOSTS AND THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE AIR FORCE ASSOCIATION AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE AIR FORCE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION, LT GENERAL (RET) MICHAEL DUNN.

General Dunn proceeds to podium, makes remarks & returns to his seat.

Narrator "LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, PROVIDING HER PERSONAL
THOUGHTS IS THE NATIONAL LEAGUE OF POW/MIA FAMILIES
REPRESENTATIVE AND HERSELF A FORMER UNITED STATES

Ms. Shine proceeds to podium, makes remarks, & returns to her seat.

POW/MIA FLAG HISTORY READING

Narrator "COLONEL (RET) PETE LINDQUIST, MANGING DIRECTOR OF

THE AIR FORCE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION WILL NOW

PROVIDE THE HISTORY OF THE POW/MIA FLAG"

Flag bearers to front of audience beneath spires and bring POW/MIA flag taut for audience to view.

Colonel Lindquist proceeds to podium, reads history & return to his seat.

AF HYMN

Brass Quintet plays AF Hymn.

CLOSING NARRATION

Narrator "THIS CONCLUDES TODAY'S CEREMONY. WE THANK YOU ALL FOR ATTENDING AND HOPE TO SEE YOU BACK HERE NEXT YEAR FOR THIS ANNUAL REMEMBERANCE OF OUR RETURNED PRISIONERS AND THOSE WHO REMAIN PRISONER, MISSING OR OTHERWISE UNACCOUNTED FOR IN SERVICE TO OUR GREAT COUNTRY.
