Note: From 1948 to 1966 **all but one** of the Academy Awards for costume design for a Black and White Film was given for contemporary movies. At the time, color films were the preferred choice for epics, musicals, and fantasy films – while gritty realistic dramas and comedies were made in black and white. Since 1967, when the black and white category was dropped, **only two of the 36** costume design Oscars has been for **contemporary "modern" films**. Contemporary film costume is rarely recognized with Oscars, although representing the majority of our work.
