Under the leadership of Artistic Director Molly Smith and Managing Director Edgar Dobie, Arena Stage has become the largest theater in the country dedicated to American plays and playwrights. Founded in 1950 by Zelda Fichandler, Thomas Fichandler and Edward Mangum, Arena Stage was one of the nation's original resident theaters, and has a distinguished record of leadership and innovation in the field. With the opening of the new Mead Center for American Theater in 2010, Arena Stage will have emerged as a leading center for the production, presentation, development and study of the American theater. In the Hippodrome (1950-1955) The Hippodrome Theatre, a former movie house at Ninth and New York Avenues, NW, was converted into a 247-seat, arena-style theater to become the first home of Arena Stage. Arena spent five seasons at the Hippodrome, from its first performance on August 16, 1950, through the 1954-55 season.

The converted "Hospitality Hall" of the Old Heurich Brewery served as a second home for Arena Stage from November 7, 1956 through the 1960-61 season. The 500-seat theater-inthe-round was nicknamed "The Old Vat" in reference to the brewery's huge kettles and Britain's Old Vic.

In the New Arena

On October 30, 1961, Arena Stage opened the first production in its permanent home at 6th and Maine Avenue, S.W. The building containing the 827-seat arena and the adjoining administrative offices and shops was designed by architect Harry Weese in association with Zelda Fichandler and the entire Arena Stage company and staff.
