## Freedom of Information request - RFI20101420

Thank you for your email of 25<sup>th</sup> October requesting the following information:

"...how much is the donation given to the poppy appeal by the BBC?"

The reference number for your request is RFI20101420.

The BBC does not have a formal relationship with the charity The Royal British Legion. The BBC does not corporately support charities other than the BBC's own charities such as Children in Need and the BBC Performing Arts Fund, and Comic Relief with whom it has a close and long established editorial relationship. The BBC also supports those charitable causes which bring the nation together and which if not supported, would cause the BBC to be see to be out of step with public opinion. The Royal British Legion's Poppy Appeal is formally supported in this way by allowing collection boxes in our buildings during the time leading up to Rememberance Sunday.

The BBC's UK public service broadcasting does not make cash donations to charities. The donation to The Royal British Legion is solely the money donated by BBC staff and visitors via collection boxes.

Through broadcast appeals on Radio 4, BBC One and local radio, the BBC supports a range of charities by facilitating fundraising and raising awareness of the needs of many communities throughout the UK and the world. raised for different charities in the last three financial years; please note this money came from public donations rather than from the BBC.
