ome and celebrate the West Cork Chamber Music Festival's 15th anniversary and enjoy all that it has to offer - the world's finest musicians playing glorious music in Bantry House, St Brendan's Church and other venues around the town. The 15th West Cork Chamber Music Festival will be celebrating the world of the string quartet with top international ensembles performing core works from the heart of the repertoire. The quartets that join the RTÉ Vanbrugh Quartet this year have had fantastic success recently. 



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A Taste of Cork

Our critic, Paul J. Kiernan gives his reflections on Restaurants in Cork

Zaks a flawless performance

aks is located on Marlboro Street, conveniently sandwiched between Cork city's two main shopping thoroughfares - Oliver Plunkett and Patrick Street. The premises has recently been renovated. I didn't see what it looked like before, but it is certainly very elegant and contemporary now, while still managing to maintain an intimate feel.

I went along after work on a Friday and spent a very enjoyable two hours gorging myself and surveying the fine youth of Cork tottering and

swaggering by outside on their way to the pubs. How I wish I was young again so I could do things like that.

There was just one waitress on duty at the early hour we were there and she was charm and solicitousness personified. She told me that she has been waitressing at Zaks for two years, and it showed in her flawless performance.

For starters my wife had the Baked Goat's Cheese Salad (€6.90). Served with toasted sourdough bread, leaves, and walnut dressing, this rich and satisfying dish can also be ordered as a main course for €12.95 in the event that you are a complete cheese fiend. My own starter, Duck Liver Parfait (€6.95) - basically duck pate with port and orange sauce - was absolutely divine. Other starter options include Atlantic Seafood Chowder (€7.50), Ballycotton Mussels (€6.95), and Black Pudding & Crispy Bacon Salad (€6.75).

I was unadventurous in my choice of mains, opting for the Market Fresh Fish & Chips (€15.95). Still, this simple dish is often a good barometer of what level a restaurant is punching at. In its worst incarnation, it can be bland, limp rubbish that deadens the soul. Thankfully that wasn't the case here; the haddock firm and flavoursome beneath the fluffy beer batter, the thick crispy, chips starchy and golden. Washed down with Sancerre, it made

for exceedingly agreeable living. Next time I go back I would like to try the French Cut Pork Rack (€15.95), which is served in a wholegrain mustard cream sauce - pork is a very underrated meat. My wife went for the fish special – sole. Excellent again, all but leaping off the plate with freshness.

Because I am a wine diploma student and I write a wine blog, I tend to forensically examine restaurant winelists to see if anything can be improved on. While decent, I think there is ample scope for Zaks to expand


its list. Most drinkers will be able to find something on it, but six reds (with no Pinot Noir or Rioja) and five whites (including three Sauvignon Blancs but no Riesling – a superb, if divisive, grape) is a bit short for a good restaurant like this. I would also prefer to see a small selection of wines-by-theglass offered instead of joyless quarter bottles and, while Champagne Jacquart Brut Mosaique

(€56) is certainly beautiful, a non-Champagne sparkling wine, such as Cava or Prosecco, is needed for diners of modest means.

We plumped for the Brochard Sancerre (€25), a well-priced Sauvignon-based white from France's Loire region. Refreshing and bursting with zingy gooseberry, nettle, and mineral flavours, it proved a textbook foil for our goat's cheese and fish feast. My pick of the reds was the Chateau de Chenas Fleurie (€25), a light and aromatic red that is ever popular with the ladies but deserves to be sampled by more men too.

These two wines were the most expensive on the list, and prices start at €19. Zaks also offers a good Early Bird Menu – two courses for €18.50, and three courses for just €20.



Lal Quila more than your average curry house

t takes a brave restaurant to invest in premises expansion these days, and an even braver one to diversify away from its firm Indian-Pakistani focus to bring Thai, Chinese, and Italian food into the fold. Lal Quila in Douglas is doing both.

I spoke to the proprietor, Omar, on a recent visit and he was very excited. Even though I was there to review the restaurant, it was strange because everything would be different in just a few short weeks – revamped premises, new menu, and new drinks list. But I assume that he will retain a good portion of the current Indian menu, so this review is still relevant ... okay?! The staff were laughing and joking when we walked in and it was great to see such playful gambolling out of them.

While perusing the menus, we ate a scandalous quantity of poppadoms served with three tasty condiments, pictured. Eventually we opted to share Lal Quila Khas (combination of starters, €11.50). The best bits of this feast were the Dil Bahar Jhinga (huge, juicy prawns, tandoor cooked and served with a balsamic berry sauce) and − especially - the Lahori Chop (lamb chops tenderised with garlic and cumin, cooked on charcoal). The latter was one of the most delectable dishes I've eaten in my life and I hope with all my heart that it makes the cut

for the new Lal Quila menu.

Whenever I have Indian I go for the Peshwari Naan (€3.50), a sweetened flatbread made with nuts. It's tasty enough to eat by itself but is also superb for mopping up sauce and the like. As an aside, it isn't correct to ask for "naan bread", as naan already means bread, so it would be like asking for "bread bread" – how waiters must laugh to themselves when they hear that one.

For my main I enjoyed the Chilli Masala Gosht (€15.95, basically a lamb and green chilli curry) while my friend had the Jalfrizi Murgi (€15.50, a Pakistani chicken curry finished with fresh coriander). Both were very, very good, though we had shot ourselves in the foot by gorging so heavily on the poppadoms and were by then starting to feel the pace.

Mustering all out manly strength we managed to finish both mains and all the naan, but to attempt to force down dessert too would have been sheer folly. The Death By Chocolate Cake (€5.50) looked particularly dangerous!



And the drinks report? Matching fine wines with very hot curries is problematic, better to stick to beer – or water! But where curries are warm, rather than searing, clean, fruity whites with good acidity will offer a pleasant palate-refreshing cooling effect. If the wine has extroverted, tropical flavours that complement those of the curry, so much the better. Riesling or Gewurztraminer from Alsace, or Marlborough

Sauvignon Blanc, are all winners. Avoid heavy reds as the tannins in them will accentuate the heat of the chillies.

Lal Quila has plenty of wines fitting the bill for its cuisine. For fans of white I would recommend the Marques de Riscal Sauvignon Blanc (\in 24.95); if red is your tipple, try the Louis Jadot Pinot Noir (\in 27.95). I followed my own advice and drank Cobra Beer (\in 4.75) – when in Rome!

Amaizing fare at the Cornstore

ext time you come out of TK Maxx weighed down by bags of things you don't need, cross Cornmarket street and its messy roadworks and settle down in one of the Cornstore's spacious booths for a reviving feed and watering. I did so recently during the *Dine Out in Cork* promotion and the place was rocking, showing that if the price is right and the product good punters can forget their recession woes.

We had the baby with us again and when a friendly waitress tried to engage with her she burst into tears – it was very satisfying to see that happen to someone else besides me. While perusing the menus and comforting our

little angelface, we supped on glasses of crisp, appley *Alvarinho* (€6.50) - Portugal's lighter version of fashionable Spanish grape, Albarino. Both of us were famished and we quickly ordered, and then quickly ate, *Wild Mushroom Risotto with Truffle Oil* (€7.95) and the *Goat's Cheese Crostini with Fig Jam and Balsamic Reduction* (€9.95) to start. Both really hit the spot.

For my main course I was torn between the *Magret Duck Breast* (€23.95), *Belly of Pork* (€19.95), and the *Half Lobster Mornay* (€24.95). After some soul searching I settled on the latter, a sumptuous dish where the lobster meat is first removed from the shell, then put back in with a creamy wine and cheese sauce. My wife went for the *Crab and Tiger Prawn Risotto* (€23.95).

I tried stylish Lebanese wine *Massaya* (€8.50) next, a full-bodied and spicy blend perfectly suited to hearty food, if not lobster. Our waitress recommended *Don David Malbec* (€6.95) then, a smooth and berryish Argentine that I have enjoyed on many other occasions – great choice by her. I really like the Cornstore's winelist. Nicely split between "regular" wines (all of which

are available by the glass or carafe – take note other restaurants, this is good!) and more prestigious "reserve" ones, it covers all the wine styles that a happening restaurant should be hitting.

For wine buffs and those who may be celebrating and would like to splash

out, there are plenty of more blue chip wines in the Reserve sections. White Burgundy and red Bordeaux feature heavily, as you might imagine, but my two picks for special occasions would be the Weinbach Riesling Grand Cru (€78) for white and "Super Tuscan", Varvara Castello di Bolgheri (€54) for red. Popular "Irish" Bordeaux house, Chateau Lynch-Bages (sometimes affectionately called Chateau Lunch-Bags by mischievous connoisseurs), can be enjoyed for just €195 per bottle too!

One small point though – I wouldn't have the Fino and Manzanilla sherries in the dessert wine section. These dry, fortified wines are much better as aperitifs and would certainly disappoint any intrepid diner attempting to match them with sticky



toffee pudding or apple tart. Still, it's good to see Sherry – a much underrated style – on a winelist at all.

I resisted the temptation to go with the safe dessert option (Homemade Cookies with Vanilla Ice Cream and Caramel Sauce) opting instead for the Banana and Pecan Frangipane Tart with Chocolate Ice Cream (€5.50) enjoyed with a small glass of unctuous dessert wine, Filhot Sauternes (€12). Dessert wines are often expensive because they are produced by concentrating the sugars in grapes, which means a drastic reduction in yields – an entire vine may produce only one tiny glass of Sauternes, for example! Anyway, it was beautiful, and well worth the cash - sure, I might be dead tomorrow. My missus had a punt on the Flourless Chocolate Cake with Whipped Cream and Raspberry Coulis (€6.95). The absence of flour, a staple of

desserts, didn't impact unduly on it and, if anything, it made for an even denser, more concentrated cake that generated much satisfied uhm-ing and ahh-ing before it was dispatched.

Getting sponsors for the show is key especially in the current downturn "as marketing budgets are being cut".

VIP Ideas is an action marketing agency predominantly dealing in the 'goodie bag' concept and are responsible for making a goodie bag a must have at events such as, Off the rails, Xposé live, Ideal homes, Electric Picnic and bespoke and premiere corporate events. Setting up the company over six years ago dynamic marketer Laoise Downes fits brands with events and is "passionate about people and loves developing ideas". "Not everything starts and ends with Dublin, it's so refreshing to come down to Cork and see so many beautifully dressed women so excited about the show". Laoise's working day is very varied and what she enjoys most about her work is "that an idea

discussed over a cup of coffee a few month's previously turns into a massive event". Working with some thirteen top Companies to help create brand awareness for their products, the goodie bag is a great way to get new brands and products to the market. Laoise certainly has a flair for marketing and event management and her energy is infectious. Spending six years working in Australia in various roles helped Laoise to nurture her entrepreneurial gene; "it taught me to be self sufficient being so far away from family and friends".

I thought I spoke at a million miles an hour until I met the PR machine aka Sonia Harris of Harris PR. The Harris PR Duo mum and daughter certainly know their business and have a knack for getting exclusive events. Sonia assures me it has been 10 years of hard graft, "I worked as a Journalist for two years with The Sunday Independent" and PR was the natural route for this ambitious chick. What Sonia loves most about her work is the relationships she makes along the way. I get a sense of her loyalty to clients and the creative people she works with. Choosing the right PR Company for an event or product launch is key to its success. The event needs to be previewed and reviewed correctly, photographers on the ready, celebs co-ordinated and available for press. Working with artists is not easy, however, Sonia takes it upon herself to listen to the people she is working with to ensure she can deliver on what their expectations are, "I will be totally honest with you if I feel the event is not PR-able". Shopping is a full time job for Sonia who lists Cork as one of her favourite places to pick up original fashion. "I dressed myself for the weekend here in Cork; I didn't have to wear anything I brought with me". I know from trying to tie Sonia down over the weekend that she works hard, it's very fast paced "it's not the champagne lifestyle that you would think it is; it IS the high heels though". Harris PR are currently working on some top secret events for Cork. I am sure it won't be long before we hear about them!






