Students' memories live on through scholarships

Designer chairs and a scholarship fund will honour the memories of three QUT students killed in a tragic car accident earlier this year. Gerard Cutcheon, Adam Neykoff-Davies and Helena Wood lost their lives on a country road north-west of Brisbane when returning home from a research trip to Carnarvon Gorge. Gerard, 21, and Adam, 32, were in their final year of study and Helena (a 20-year-old French woman) was on an exchange from the University of Westminster. In their memory, QUT has established the Communication Design Honours Scholarship, a perpetual scholarship valued at \$5,000, and a student lounge at QUT's Creative Industries Cultural Precinct. QUT, the students' families and friends, and the University of Westminster in the UK, have contributed a combined total of \$100,000 to the fund.
