2010 National Post-Election Study

Prepared for C-SPAN

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Methodology

The following results are taken from the 2010 Penn Schoen Berland National Post-Election poll.

The study was conducted online from November 6-8, 2010 among 1200 Americans who voted in the 2010 mid-term election.

The margin of error for the study is +/- 2.83% at the 95% confidence level and larger for subgroups. Certain questions were split sampled to reduce respondent fatigue.
