MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Year 12 Farewell Activities

During last week we held a number of farewell activities for our Year 12 students before their final examinations which began this week.

The induction of our 2010 Service Captain and Head Chorister is an important event in our School calendar. We have the opportunity to acknowledge the efforts of the current students who hold these positions and to formally induct our 2010 recipients of these positions.

He spoke about his first day at CGGS and the fears he had about moving from Queensland to Canberra and starting a new job. Our Year 12 students are about to embark on a new phase of their own lives and no doubt, they will have similar fears and worries to Francis. His message to the students was simple, but important, in that we need to face new challenges and know that we have the confidence to meet whatever obstacles may be put before us. Kirsty Nitschke and Elizabeth Morris have undertaken their respective roles as Chapel Captain and Head Chorister with confidence and energy this year. We thank them and wish Christabel Richards-Neville, Services Captain for 2010 and Elyse Heslehurst, Head Chorister for 2010, every success in their forthcoming roles.

I would like to offer our thanks to the Old Grammarians' Association who hosted a lunch for the Year 12 students.

The final Chapel for the Year 12 boarders and the dinner which we held for the Year 12 boarders were filled with tears and laughter. My thanks to Head of the Boarding House, Tina Twigg, and the Boarding House staff for the time and effort they put into the planning of these events.

On the final day for the Year 12 students, we began the day with breakfast and a Chapel service. Our Chaplain, the Rev Paul Harris, asked the students to write down something which each was thankful about and had made their years at school memorable for them. It was positive for all of us to hear that the students valued the friendships they had made and the opportunities they had been given at CGGS. Paul now has a record of the comments written by the Year 12 students for the last three years. Science teacher, Richard Kent, was asked to speak at the Chapel Service. Using his own impeccable sense of humour, he exhorted the students to make the most of their talents and take the opportunities they would be given in the future years.

The Year 12 students offered their own farewell to the School at an Assembly. It is difficult to be witty without offending individuals and the rituals of the School which form an important part of its identity. There were sections of the Assembly in which people were offended and I would like to offer my apologies, on behalf of the staff, for this. We do not believe that the material offered during the Assembly reflected the thoughts or feelings of the entire Year 12 cohort.

End of Term tests and activities

Our students are completing or will be completing their final tests and assignments for the year. Our focus at this time is on maintaining a calm and structured environment in which the students can undertake their work and our teachers can complete their marking and report writing.

Construction Control, which is the company responsible for our current construction, has been provided with dates for testing and School activities. They are working closely with us to ensure that there will be limited disruption for students and staff.

As we move towards the end of Term, there will be a number of activities which the teachers will take responsibility for. We have asked the teachers to continue to provide meaningful activities for all students. There will be a limit to the viewing of DVDs and other activities which do not have a direct educational purpose.

I have read an interesting short article by Professor Timothy Sharp. "What ever the cause, stress and anxiety are distracting and ultimately, in addition to being unpleasant in and of themselves, they negatively impact on daily functioning and happiness. It is not good for these normal but damaging negative emotions to persist for too long."

Professor Sharp has offered a three step approach to remaining focused during difficult and distracting times.

- Step 1: Begin every day by asking, "What is going to go well today?" or "If everything worked out great today, what would that look like?" In your mind, run through the tasks for the day and imagine that each and everyone will be successful.
- Step 2: Set aside time in the middle of the day and ask yourself, "Am I on track so far?" It would be useful to think about what is going well or what needs to be done to get back on track and achieve what you want for the day.
- Step 3: It is important to finish the day by focusing on at least three good things. "What are the three good things that have happened today?" These do not have to be world changing or enormously significant events but regardless of the size of the success it is worth celebrating achievements.




