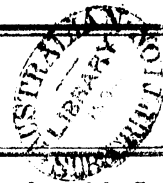

REGULATIONS FOR THE LEVEE OF HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR TO BE HELD IN HONOR OF HER MAJESTY'S BIRTHDAY, ON MONDAY, THE 24TH MAY.
