



AMPHIBIAN KEEPERS' LICENCE SPECIES LISTS (September 2005)

Native frogs, their eggs and tadpoles, are protected under the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974. It is against the law to take them from the wild or to have them in your possession without an appropriate licence from the Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC). Frogs may be kept as pets under a licensing and record keeping system that allows the DEC to monitor what species are being kept, bred and traded amongst enthusiasts. A person who wishes to keep frogs may do so only if an Amphibian Keepers Licence (AKL) is held by that person. People who hold a licence may obtain frogs from other people who legally hold them, but they are not allowed to be sold through pet shops and must not be taken from the wild.

The DEC recommends that all frog enthusiasts join an amphibian or reptile organisation such as those listed below. This will put you in touch with other people who have similar interests and who may have animals that may be traded among licensees. Benefits will also be gained from the knowledge, experience and expertise of other frog keepers and perhaps the opportunity to participate in field observation and research activities. The classes of AKL are described below.

EXEMPT SPECIES

With the exception of tadpoles collected for observation of metamorphosis referred to below, there are no species exempt from the requirement for a licence to hold or trade.

CLASS 1- BASIC FROG KEEPERS LICENCE

The following common amphibian species may be kept under a Class 1 AKL. All of these species have been assessed by herpetologists as species that are readily maintained in captivity by any keeper with a basic knowledge of amphibian care. A Class 1 Licence must be granted by the DEC prior to obtaining any of these species and the licensee's records must be submitted to the DEC in August each year. The Class 1 Licence is issued for a period of up to two years (depending upon the month that the original application is lodged) and records must be submitted to the DEC in August each year. The licence fee is \$60 for up to two years or \$120 for five. A Class 1 licence may be granted to a person over the age of 10 years, but a person under the age of 16 years must have a parent or guardian's consent.

CLASS 2- ADVANCED FROG KEEPERS LICENCE

A Class 2 licence permits the licensee to hold the species listed below for Class 2 licence and those that are listed for a Class 1 licence. Class 2 species may be either rare or extremely difficult to maintain in captivity. A Class 2 Licence is available only to persons who are over the age of 18 years who can demonstrate a minimum of 2 years relevant amphibian keeping experience. A Class 2 licence must be obtained before any of the following species are acquired. Written notification of all transactions involving Class 2 species is required from both parties within 10 days of the transaction. Records of all species held and all transactions must be submitted to the DEC every August. Class 2 licences are issued for a period of up to one year for \$60, two years for \$120 or five years for \$240.

UNCLASSIFIED NATIVE SPECIES

Native species of amphibian that are not listed above may not be kept under the AKL system. Proposals for classification of native species that are not listed above, or for the review of the classification of listed species, may be forwarded to the Director General of DEC. Proposals must demonstrate the legal availability of the species and detail their captive husbandry. Proposals will be referral to the Native Animal Keepers' Consultative Committee for advice.

EXOTIC AMPHIBIANS

Exotic (non-native) species of amphibians cannot be kept under the DEC AKL system. The keeping and trading of exotic amphibians is administered by NSW Primary Industries under the Non-Indigenous Animals Act, 1987

TADPOLES

A licence is not required for the collection of small numbers of tadpoles by children and institutions for the purpose of observing metamorphosis. Persons who collect tadpoles for this purpose are expected to return frogs to the same location, and water body from which the tadpoles were collected. Please refer to the DEC publication 'Hygiene protocol for the control of disease in frogs' for guidelines on the collection and release of tadpoles.

RESCUE & RELOCATION OR REHABILITATION OF AMPHIBIANS

An AKL does not authorise the rescue and relocation of tadpoles or frogs, or the care of sick or injured animals. Appropriately qualified people are licensed by the DEC to provide capture and relocation services and specialist wildlife rehabilitation organisations are licensed to care for sick and injured animals and these animals must eventually be returned to the wild.

INTERSTATE IMPORT & EXPORT OF AMPHIBIANS

An AKL licensee must obtain a licence from the DEC to authorise the interstate import or export of amphibians.
