

RECIPIENTS OF GRANTS UNDER THE NATIONAL COMMUNITY CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMME (NCCPP):

ROUND 1:

- **Shire of Broome – The Broome Hype Project (Helping Young People Engage) - \$307,714 (WA).** A collaborative initiative to reduce anti social behaviour among youth and to build positive community relationships.
- **Lutheran Community Care – Rural Men and Relationships - \$256,000 (SA).** A project to better equip service providers in the Mount Gambier region to work with men who are perpetrators of domestic violence.
- **Mission Australia – Family Enhancement Program - \$400,000 (QLD).** A project strengthening support for primary school aged children and their carers in the Inala area.
- **Barnardo’s Australia – Kids Friends Program – Queanbeyan - \$200,000 (NSW).** A program that fosters resilience in children through mentoring and providing positive adult role models.
- **Glenorchy City Council – The Chance on Main Programme - \$267,410 (TAS).** An early intervention project for young people at risk aged 14-19 years.
- **Lismore City Council – Closing the Gaps - \$274,000 (NSW).** A project to reduce the incidence of youth crime.
- **Hills Community Support Group – Intervention and Diversion Project - \$331,000 (WA).** A project to build positive skills and self esteem in young people who are at risk of becoming involved in crime.
- **Aboriginal Resources and Development Inc – Rom Ga Dharra - \$150,000.** A project to develop educational materials about the Australian legal system in local indigenous languages.
- **Tangentyere Council – Night Patrol Brokerage - \$150,000.** A project to provide prompt, responsive and flexible brokerage support to remote area night patrols.
- **Brisbane Indigenous Media Association – Keepin’ Safe - \$120,000.** A project to prepare on air programs addressing local crime prevention issues.
- **Kabbarli Home and Community Care – Walparra Kaduwna - \$133,217.** A project to provide leadership training to 15 nominated indigenous youth and to organise activities with a view to addressing truancy, violence and anti-social behaviour.

- **Bibelmen Mia Aboriginal Corporation – Crime Prevention through Culture - \$137,000.** A project to utilise the Wardan Aboriginal Cultural Centre to provide crime prevention through cultural awareness programs for people at risk of drug abuse and family violence.
- **Joining in the Dreaming – Nortá Nortá Ngallia - \$150,000.** This project offers a holistic approach to learning by providing an environment where young indigenous youths can develop a respect for themselves and their culture.
- **Kowanyama Justice Group – Kowanyama Crime Prevention, a community approach - \$150,000.** This project involves the implementation of a prevention program that looks at modifying or eliminating risk factors for indigenous school children in Year 7.
- **Uniting Care Burnside – Kinks and Bends - \$50,219 (NSW).** An educational package for young people which explores sexual violence in young people's lives.
- **Community Solutions Inc – Sunshine Coast SafeLink Project - \$150,000 (QLD).** A project to reduce the fear of crime among older Australians through improved access to information about improving personal, financial and property safety.
- **Strathbogie Shire Council – Nagambie Youth for Youth - \$76,500 (VIC).** A peer support project to reduce the incidence of underage drinking and minor criminal activity through a program of educational and other support activities.
- **City of Cockburn – City Drive through Art Gallery - \$110,500 (WA).** A diversionary program for youth to prevent graffiti by working with local businesses to provide space for youth to paint murals while being mentored and provided with ongoing skills.
- **Newington Security Sub Committee – Translation of security manual - \$6,000 (NSW).** A project to translate the Newington security booklet into their community languages.
- **St John of God Family Services – Day Respite - \$130,935 (NSW).** A project to provide respite care for the children with challenging behaviours and for parents to attend behaviour management education.
- **Shire of Laverton – Active Youth Active Futures - \$80,000 (WA).** A project to assist youth and families at risk of crime and drug dependence.
- **Primary After School Sports Inc – The PASS Program (NSW) - \$97,421.** A program aimed at primary school age children who are already displaying anti-social and undesirable behaviour. It will offer sporting and recreational programs during school time, after school and during school holidays.

- **Chinese Australian Services Society – CASS Chinese Crime Prevention - \$150,000 (NSW).** A project aimed at reducing the fear of crime among Chinese speakers by raising awareness through a media campaign, a Chinese crime prevention booklet and web page and counselling services.
- **Townsville City Council – Crime Prevention Advice Translations - \$58,133 (QLD).** A project to translate the Townsville City Council Crime Prevention Advice Guide into community languages other than English for migrants and international visitors.
- **Yoorana Women’s Domestic Violence and Resource Service – B-Safe Maryborough - \$44,046 (QLD).** A project aiming to reduce the negative effects on children’s actual experiences (as witnesses and victims) of domestic violence through the use of education awareness programs.
- **City of Greater Dandenong – Safe Streets through Community Arts - \$148,500 (VIC).** A project involving a variety of agencies engaging the whole community in the arts, graffiti prevention and community safety initiatives.
- **Armadale, Gosnells and Districts Youth Resources Inc – Stairways Project - \$138,398 (WA).** A project to provide a range of services to support young people at secondary school who may be at high risk of exclusion or truancy.
- **Patricia Giles Centre – Women’s Safety project - \$44,490 (WA).** A project providing individual level strategies for single women including women with children who are at risk of property crime, family violence, antisocial behaviour and fear of crime.
- **Liverpool Women’s Resource Centre – Women’s Safety Project -\$78,653 (NSW).** A project focusing on reducing women’s fear of crime and improving women’s safety and security at home, at work and when out and about by developing community education programs targeting women.
- **Primary After School Sports Inc – The PASS Program (QLD) - \$150,000.** A program aimed at primary school age children who are already displaying anti-social and undesirable behaviour. It will offer sporting and recreational programs during school time, after school and during school holidays.
- **Mission Australia – Keep it Real - \$129,000 (SA).** A community education project led by young people to address negative media myths and break down the barriers between younger and older residents in the northern Onkaparinga area.

- **Plenty Valley Community Health Inc – Northern Community Intervention Program - \$149,363 (VIC).** An early intervention and crisis program targeting both adult offenders who have re-offended, have substance abuse problems are perpetrators of domestic violence and/or may have committed violent crime, and their families.
- **Victorian Arabic Social Services – Australian Arabic Community: Contribution to Safety and Crime Prevention - \$150,000 (VIC).** A project facilitating the active participation of the Arabic community in the northern region of Melbourne in local community safety and crime prevention initiatives.
- **Wyndham City Council - Graffiti Free-Wyndham Proud - \$130,651 (VIC).** A project aiming to reduce the negative impact of graffiti in the Wyndham municipality through a partnership with Council, police, local agencies, residents and traders.

ROUND 2:

- **Regional Extended Family Services - \$470,000 (NSW).** Funding will enable two youth workers to work alongside the existing service system in Armidale, as a front line link between services and young people involved in anti-social or crime related activities.
- **Big hART Inc - \$404,700 (NSW).** Funding will facilitate the creation of community Safety Ambassadors and resources promoting safety with tenants of the Northcott Public Housing Estate, Surry Hills Sydney.
- **Berry Street Victoria - \$368,411 (VIC).** The project will train mentors to work with young people living in Latrobe City not engaged in education and training, to build positive skills and self-esteem and reduce incidents of anti-social and criminal behaviour.
- **North East Support & Action for Youth Incorporated - \$150,000 (VIC).** This project, in collaboration with Somebody's Daughter Theatre Company, targeting young people who have disengaged from school and are at risk of offending in the District of Wangaratta. The project will work with their parents, school, workers and their local community.
- **Centacare Rockhampton - \$451,435 (QLD).** A collaborative partnership between key community leaders in the Central Highlands area of Queensland, to develop a coordinated response to domestic and family violence through the provision of programs for perpetrators and education programs for victims.

- **Injinoo Community Council - \$264,228 (QLD).** Funding will establish a respite centre in Cape York on an outstation 150kms south of the Injinoo community for young people with substance abuse issues. The centre will provide an environment away from destructive peer pressure where counsellors and elders can work with young people, acting as positive role models, reinforcing positive cultural values and build self esteem.
- **Anglicare SA Inc. - \$499,375 (SA).** A community partnership project with the City of Playford which will provide a series of arts and sports projects for 8 - 18 year olds, operating 4pm - 6pm on weekdays, targeting children and young people at high risk of entering the offending cycle. These activities will be available from five different sites across Elizabeth.
- **Escape Youth Centre - \$167,997 (WA).** Funding will be used to provide an outreach and centre based service for children, young people and their families across four communities in the Shire of Harvey to promote social and healthy behaviour, lower the offending rate of several forms of crime and reduce perceived risk factors present within the community.
- **Investing in our Community - \$171,594 (WA).** The project aims to provide youth workers in the Kalgoorlie CBD area to increase knowledge about resources for young people, minimize incidents of antisocial and criminal behaviour and improve the community's knowledge about the needs for young people.
- **Big hART Inc - \$500,000 (TAS).** A three year project based in North West TASmania which will use TASK focused workshops, cultural activities and a media strategy to divert participants from crime and break down distrust between three social groups - teenage mothers, the elderly and young men at risk.
- **Good Beginnings Australia - \$364,770 (TAS).** An early intervention project to be conducted in Glenorchy and Derwent Valley that enhances parenting effectiveness and family functioning while building a sense of community belonging.
- **Aboriginal Medical Services Alliance Northern Territory - \$360,000 (NT).** This is a collaborative partnership project that will implement 'head-start' style interventions. The project will target children in the early years of development, across three Aboriginal communities in the Northern Territory to reduce levels of anti-social behaviour and disadvantage in the areas of health and education in the long term.
- **Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation - \$410,181 (NT).** The project will provide information and community education to ensure that Indigenous people visiting Darwin region, or exiting prison in Darwin, are informed about available services, so that if needed, they can effectively access income support, accommodation and transport to their home community.

- **Men's Link - \$466,000 (ACT).** This is a school based mentoring project for 'at risk' boys in the ACT and NSW South Coast. The project targets grade 3 to year 6 boys as they make the challenging transition from primary to secondary school. The project utilises mentoring based relationships to enhance the participant's sense of self and community.
- **Gurriny Yealamucka Health Services Aboriginal Corporation - \$150,000 (QLD).** This project will work with Yarrabah youths at risk of becoming involved in the adult criminal justice system, and with their families.
- **Marrickville Youth Resource Centre Inc - \$11,250 (NSW).** The centre will work with Indigenous young people to produce three short videos to be uploaded onto the ABC's Us Mob interactive website.
- **Protective Behaviours WA Inc - \$150,000 (WA).** Funding will provide 'Train the Trainer' and parent workshops for the Kimberley Region to teach Indigenous children at risk of abuse, protection strategies and how to seek appropriate help.
- **Arabunna Nulla Kari-Ku Wanga Association Inc - \$114,800 (SA).** The project will work with young people exhibiting offending behaviour or at risk behaviour.
- **Gunyangara Men's Group - \$150,000 (NT).** Funding will go towards three community-based programmes: 'Men's Camps' in outlying homeland communities; fortnightly 'Men's Meetings'; and diversionary activities for young people.
- **Killara Refuge/Inarr Nura Aboriginal Women and Children - \$138,135 (NSW).** The project will focus on awareness, prevention and early intervention of family and community violence working with Aboriginal Women, children and youth and the La Perouse Aboriginal community.
- **Shellharbour Aboriginal Community Youth Association - \$126,144 (NSW).** This project aims to reduce the likelihood of young Koori people offending through a Koori Driver mentoring program and safe driving education workshops.
- **Black Suns Inc - \$50,000 (NSW).** The project will focus on crime reduction though after school and weekend activities for the local community.
- **Men's Health and Well-being - \$148,760 (NSW).** The project will work with Aboriginal offenders to reduce recidivism and decrease contact with the criminal justice system.

- **Anglicare NT - \$75,000 (NT).** Innovative self defence classes for young women will be delivered in four areas of the Top End -Darwin, Palmerston, a rural area and in Nhulunbuy (East Arnhem). Each of the 12 courses will involve a set of six classes providing participants with practical self defence skills including sessions on respectful relationships and anger management.
- **Big Brothers Big Sisters (Melbourne) Inc - \$76,440 (Vic).** This is an 18 month collaborative project that targets disadvantaged young people (6-15 years) at the North Richmond (high rise) Housing Estate to participate in recreational and social activities using group mentoring strategies.
- **Centacare Catholic Family Services - \$110,096 (SA).** The project will engage women exiting the criminal justice system by offering a holistic approach to enhance skills and exclude social isolation. Through a creative experience women will develop links with the wider community and have the opportunity for re-unification with their children and families. There will be a focus on reducing recidivism.
- **Co.As.It (Italian Assistance Association) - \$140,000 (Vic).** The project will focus on crime and crime prevention for the older Italian community in Australia. It will adopt a multi-faceted approach in developing appropriate and effective strategies for interventions, including gathering qualitative and quantitative data, establishing collaborative efforts, conducting workshops and forums, and developing appropriate resources for the community.
- **Constable Care Child Safety Foundation (Inc) - \$139,750 (WA).** The anti-bullying crime prevention strategy is an educational Life Skills awareness project aimed at teaching children the difference between dobbing and telling. Dobbing will get someone into trouble, telling is seeking help and support.
- **Ethnic Broadcasting Association of Queensland - \$116,000 (QLD).** The project will provide a community education campaign to increase awareness and community capacity for crime prevention among people from ethnic backgrounds in the greater Brisbane region.
- **Hobart City Council - \$129,983 (TAS).** This project will provide social support and a three step program of realistic and appropriate life and work skills based programs to assist transition to employment, education and training for young people who are offenders or at risk of offending, in the Justice system or making the transition from imprisonment back into the community.
- **Integrated Family and Youth Service Inc. - \$147,820 (QLD).** It is proposed that the Integrated Family and Youth Service will run four, three phase programs with its core components being a twelve day intensive adventure based residential followed by a ten week project based training program. Upon the completion of each twelve week program, the third phase – a fifty two week mentoring support component will be value-added to provide one to one support to each program participant.

- **Ipswich Women's Centre Against Domestic Violence - \$81,184 (QLD).** The Goodna Assisted Referral Project (GARP) will establish a process for the police in the Goodna Police Division to actively link persons affected by domestic and family violence into the Ipswich Women's Centre Against Domestic Violence and other appropriate supports. The GARP partnership will support the Goodna community to deal more effectively with the crime of domestic and family violence and improve community safety.
- **Islamic Women's Welfare Council of Victoria - \$123,914 (VIC).** This project seeks to develop culturally appropriate resources to combat violence against Muslim women and children in the home.
- **Migrant Resource Centre of Newcastle and Hunter - \$92,992 (NSW).** The project will work specifically with the African refugees settling in the Hunter area, in order to develop in these new and emerging communities greater understanding of, respect for, and compliance with the laws which apply to all residents in Australia, and which underpin the interpersonal and social relationships in the civic society to which all Australians aspire. It will also combat the negative stereotyping of this target group that is impacting on perceptions of community safety in the Lower Hunter where they are settling.
- **Mission Australia - \$122,628 (SA).** The project will build the self protection mechanisms of young women and girls who are vulnerable to assault as a result of homelessness, drug and alcohol intoxication and other high risk activities that may exclude them from mainstream education and assistance programs.
- **Mornington Peninsula Shire - \$77,884 (VIC).** This project will work with young people on the Mornington Peninsula, tackling local issues of safety and alcohol related harm to develop and produce two short films to be screened locally.
- **Nimbin Neighbourhood and Information Centre Inc - \$70,485 (NSW).** A project focussing on women and girls to improve community safety in Nimbin by raising awareness of violence and domestic violence, information aimed at strengthening families, providing goal setting opportunities and workshops for women and girls aimed at skills for safe and healthy relationships, developing a Nimbin Girls' Survival Guide, the Nimbin Aunties' program and a local Victims' Support Group.
- **Police and Citizen's Youth Club - \$44,435 (WA).** The Bike Re-Building Workshop is a free after school activity for young people in Armadale. Participants will re-build old bikes for charity and for their own personal use. Senior men from 'Men in Sheds' will participate in the Bike Workshop to mentor young people and share their skills. The program supports intergenerational collaboration and provides young people with a positive male role model.

- **South Australian Institute of Justice Studies Inc - \$51,127 (SA).** This is an innovative collaborative project between the SA Institute of Justice Studies Inc and Radio Adelaide. The project will produce 100 one-minute messages to inform and inspire community members to prevent and reduce crime and the fear of crime. These messages will be broadcast by 170 community radio stations via the most accessible and low cost medium.
- **Warilla Pride Inc - \$134,200 (NSW).** The project targets young people who are chronic truants, in danger of leaving school early or who are in some way disengaging from the school system; and their families. As these young people are also at risk of becoming involved in drugs and/ or crime, this is an interventionist program which seeks to work co-operatively with families and schools to reduce the number of long suspensions by offering advocacy for students. It also offers mentoring, tutoring and a safe place to serve unavoidable suspensions.
- **Wesley Mission Brisbane - \$114,895 (QLD).** Young people design and operate youth crime reduction ventures around Beenleigh and Eagleby. Each semester, 15 new participants undertake a 13 week course in youth leadership and personal development. It includes preparation for a community venture, which is then implemented by the participants over 10 weeks.
- **Whitelion - \$139,252 (TAS).** A Business and Youth Partnerships coordinator based on the North West Coast will provide outreach services based on both client and community needs to enhance young offenders' community reintegration through economic participation.
- **Women's Health Loddon Mallee - \$96,461 (VIC).** "Sowing the Seeds of Hope" is a community education program that aims to work with the community and key stake holders to facilitate community events, school programs and specific resources to educate all living on the Mallee Track about the reality and impacts of family and other violence. The objectives of this project are to change a culture of ignorance about and acceptance of, violence and to work towards generational change where safety and peace are central to living on the Mallee Track.
- **YWCA NSW Shoalhaven - \$147,000 (NSW).** The project is a holistic, community-based approach to reducing the incidence of alcohol abuse and associated crime in the Shoalhaven by integrating education, community awareness and policing strategies to reduce community acceptance of excessive drinking, raise awareness of associated risks and connection to crime, identify factors influencing young people to drink and empower the community to develop and implement ongoing, practical solutions.
- **Youth Legal Service - \$140,230 (WA).** This project is a schools law information program for secondary schools in Western Australia. The program will provide lesson plans, group work sessions, workshops and resource kits for secondary schools with the aim of heightening moral mindfulness as a result of increased knowledge about the law and its impact on everyday life.

- **Airds Bradbury Community Centre - \$120,000 (NSW).** This project is for all ages offering community skill based educational courses. The project is designed to advance community cohesion, and promote health and well being through strengthening parenting skills and the family unit, and supporting early childhood initiatives. The objective of the project is to bridge the gap between disadvantage and participating fully in mainstream community activities. The project will run a number of workshops and courses by professional educators to strengthen parenting and life skills.
- **Blacktown Migrant Resource Centre – \$149,180 (NSW).** The project aims to reduce crime and improve community safety through improved support systems for newly arrived African migrants. These include employment initiatives, family support, recreational activities and community awareness.
- **Cumberland Women’s Health - \$145,386 (NSW).** The project brings together religious and community leaders to reduce domestic violence in the community. It aims to enhance the responsiveness of community leaders to family violence and to reduce the impact of violence. It will achieve this by educating leaders in issues relating to family violence and promote family harmony within their communities/congregations. The project involves a number of forums, and training workshops for religious leaders, and the production of press releases, brochures and pamphlets.
- **Mount Druitt Ethnic Communities Agency Inc (MECA) - \$127,781 (NSW).** The *Pacific Let's Talk* project will research, develop, pilot and evaluate a family and community focused project that aims to bridge the intergenerational divide between parents and young people. The project will be delivered in a family camp setting. It targets young people between the ages of 12-17 years and their parents and grandparents who are caregivers.
- **Salvation Army NSW - \$150,000 (NSW).** *Café Horizons Penrith* targets preventing or reducing youth crime and anti-social behaviour by providing life skills and vocational training, for disadvantaged young people (15 - 25 years) particularly those who have been involved in drug abuse and/or crime, within the Western Sydney, in a supported, enterprise environment. The principal goal of the project is to provide a thirteen week training program in hospitality leading to Certificate 11. A range of support services will be offered focusing on non-work issues.
- **Youth Off The Streets - \$150,000 (NSW).** *Leading your Community'* addresses the incidence of youth crime and community safety in the Airds area by introducing leadership workshops and peer to peer learning as well as reducing the fear of crime by providing regular community consultation and volunteering opportunities for the wider community.
- **Hillsong Emerge Ltd - \$414,479 (NSW).** The project builds strategic partnerships that deliver pathways to crime prevention in two high risk target areas in the Blacktown LGA. It focuses on finding solutions to the problems and challenges facing Indigenous and Sudanese young people and enabling them to make a positive contribution to community safety and harmony.

- **Royal Society for Welfare of Mothers & Babies (Tresillian) - \$447,421 (NSW).** *Mothering at a Distance* establishes a self-sustaining education and support program to assist with the case management and addressing the criminogenic needs of incarcerated mothers and enhance their ability to provide appropriate and sensitive parenting, reducing the emotional and social impact of separation due to incarceration on their children 0-5 years with the aim of breaking the inter-generational cycle of crime.

ROUND 3:

- **Albany Youth Support Association Inc - \$150,000 (WA).** The *Open Access Youth Arts Studio* project will involve the establishment of an art studio targeting at risk young people aged 13 and over with a history of substance use, mental illness, homelessness, and experiences of social exclusion. Sessional artists will be employed to work with young people to develop their artistic skills and facilitate self expression. The project will also include the employment of a youth worker who will provide referrals to appropriate treatment, family mediation, life skills development, community support and relationship building.
- **Anglicare Southern Queensland - \$140,714 (QLD).** The *Big Brothers Big Sisters of Roma* project is a school based early intervention mentoring program. The project will target young people aged seven to 17 years who are at risk of entering, or have entered, the criminal justice system. These young people will be matched with a professionally screened and trained adult volunteer who will spend time with the young person and share activities and interests within a supervised school environment.
- **Armidale Dumaresq Council - \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Girraween Community Cottage* project will employ a community development worker in a public housing area in Armidale. There is a high incidence of assault and domestic violence, with drug and alcohol issues identified as major contributing factors. The focus of the project will be to work with the community to identify local issues and develop effective strategies.
- **Association for the Blind of WA Inc - \$28,500 (WA).** This *Safe Without Sight* project will involve eight weekly sessions involving activities such as aikido supervised by trained instructors, educational presentations on crime prevention by police and self-defence workshops.
- **Australian Vietnamese Women's Welfare Association - \$150,000 (VIC).** The *Viets Do Sports* project, involving sports training and community education, is aimed at the Vietnamese community, particularly young people living in Melbourne's west. Its focus is to prevent and reduce crime by developing youth resilience and pro-social behaviours and by improving Vietnamese people's awareness of, and support for, crime prevention.

- **Banyule City Council - \$150,000 (VIC).** The *MoOVing 4ward* project aims to enhance social connectedness and understanding between local young people (nine to 18 years) and the community, particularly with residents, traders, police and the Olympic Village Leisure Centre, through recreation and leisure opportunities.
- **Bayside City Council - \$150,000 (VIC).** The *Graffiti Awareness Education Program for Bayside Schools* project will educate students in Year Five (10-11 year olds) and Year Eight (13-14 year olds) on the personal and crime-related consequences of graffiti. It will involve the delivery of a dramatic performance which will be reinforced within five weeks of the first performance to increase the impact of the program with students.
- **Caloundra City Youth Partnership - \$143,631 (QLD).** The *Early Support Program* will aim to reduce the risk factors associated with criminal and anti-social behaviour in young people aged 10 to 13. The project will involve a community partnership providing case management and family support to young people who are demonstrating dysfunctional behaviour at school (e.g. truancy and suspension) or criminal behaviour in the community.
- **City of Casey - \$150,000 (VIC).** The *Underage Binge Drinking Education Program* aims to educate secondary students about underage and binge drinking and the consequences of these behaviours. The program aims to influence attitudes and reduce the incidence of criminal behaviour linked to alcohol use.
- **City of Gosnells - \$32,600 (WA).** The *Thornlie Square Precinct Crime Prevention* project will aim to address a high incidence of minor crime in the immediate vicinity of a successful skate park near to major community facilities. The project will involve a design review of the precinct with an aim of "designing out" crime, and will also fund youth workers to address local crime prevention issues.
- **City of Greater Bendigo - \$73,232 (VIC).** The *Safe Shuttle Proposal* aims to establish a bus shuttle service within Bendigo's Entertainment Precinct to transport nightclub patrons within and around the precinct. The goal of the initiative is to reduce the level of migration and subsequent anti-social behaviour and improve the capacity of the taxi industry to disperse crowds as quickly and orderly as possible. The Safe Shuttle project will also include an education component targeting nightclub patrons aimed at improving the standard of behaviour within and around the precinct.
- **City of Stonnington - \$150,000 (VIC).** The *Graffiti Awareness Education Program* will educate students in Year Five (10-11 year olds) and Year Eight (13-14 year olds) on the personal and crime-related consequences of graffiti. It will involve the delivery of a dramatic performance which will be reinforced subsequently to increase the impact of the programme with students.

- **Community Broadcasting Association of Australia - \$86,500 (NSW).** *Older, Safer and Bolder* is a community education and capacity building project for older people in regional communities in New South Wales that plans to combine radio broadcasts and educational packages with community contact to increase awareness of crime prevention strategies and support services.
- **Community Solutions Inc - \$149,700 (QLD).** The *TourSmart Hervey Bay* project aims to address crime perpetrated against tourists to Hervey Bay by increasing awareness of relevant safety issues. The project will involve a broad public education program that will assist tourists and tourism operators to obtain a better understanding of methods to maximise personal, financial and property safety. It will be supported by local community strategies to reduce crimes against visitors to the region.
- **Community Technology Centres Association - \$122,000 (NSW).** Through a network of technology, information and resource centres called Community Technology Centres, the *Safe Cyber Communities* project will aim to increase the public awareness of online crime prevention. It will target children, parents and seniors in regional, rural and remote areas of NSW.
- **Council On The Ageing (South Australia) Inc - \$130,102 (SA).** The *Safety for Seniors* project aims to promote safety and security strategies for older people. Volunteer peer education and community radio announcements will be used to reach people over the age of 50 years including culturally and linguistically diverse communities. Making older people feel safer living within their own community will also be prompted by informing people of available support service.
- **Ethnic Communities Council of WA Inc - \$149,705 (WA).** The *Multicultural Crime Prevention* project will develop a DVD which provides socio-legal information to newly arrived migrants, refugees, people on temporary visa including overseas students and professionals. The DVD will provide crime prevention information in different languages with the aim of reducing the language barrier and improving people's awareness of their rights and responsibilities.
- **Family Child Care Services Central Coast - \$148,265 (NSW).** The *Partners in Parenting* project will involve a mentoring program for vulnerable families which focuses on building relationships, supporting parents by building capacity, and decreasing the incidence of family violence. A training program will be developed for mentors to enable them to work with vulnerable families on the issues they face. This training program will be made into a package available for other services.

- **Greater Taree City Council - \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Safer Community – Taree* project aims to build capacity and empower various sectors of the community from business to individuals. The project will develop a local campaign on crime prevention issues addressing alcohol abuse and domestic violence. Forums will be conducted and resources developed and distributed providing home protection information and educating young people on the impact of shoplifting. A safety audit will also be conducted.
- **Home-Start National Inc - \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Navigating Fatherhood – A Guide To Parenting For Dads* project is a parenting course for incarcerated young fathers who are experiencing difficulty in their parenting role. The project aims to lessen the effect incarceration of a father has on the lives of children, including difficulties at school and offending behaviour, by re-establishing and improving child/parent communications. The program includes a 10-week course to enhance the parenting skills of these fathers.
- **Hornsby Shire Council - \$146,000 (NSW).** The *Including and Involving Young People in Public Malls* project will aim to modify anti-social behaviour, decrease the incidence of criminal behaviour and increase the amenity for all users of the Hornsby Mall. The Council's Youth Outreach Team will work with key stakeholders to positively engage young people who use the mall facilities. A series of events and initiatives will be designed to support a protocol of acceptable behaviour at the mall. The project will also involve the installation of appropriate infrastructure and a support network to assist with crime prevention initiatives.
- **Illawarra Ethnic Communities Council - \$128,700 (NSW).** The *Kids Making Choices* project will assist young people to understand and identify values that are important to them and society, to set personal goals and to develop positive habits when making choices and decisions. The project consists of a two day workshop program focusing on developing positive habits and living by principles. An interactive art program will be used to explore and express artistically, values and choices. Outdoor activities will be facilitated by the Police and Community Youth Club in Wollongong.
- **Investing in our Youth Inc - \$99,976 (WA).** The *Linking Education and Families* project is aimed at providing opportunities and support to families and children in six school catchment areas. The aims of the program are to support families in recognising that early child development is a priority for future well being; to connect families to appropriate early intervention services, and to work with families and children in their homes and communities to ensure children are ready for school. The program involves a positive engagement framework based on Family Partnership Training and includes home visiting services and a Play Café for parents at kindergartens.

- **Kangaroo Flat Community Group Inc - \$98,163 (VIC).** The *Enough is Enough* project aims to improve perceptions of safety within the community, strengthen community support networks, engage young people, improve relations between police and residents and reduce property crime, family violence and antisocial behaviour. A community reference group will be established and a community worker will be employed to coordinate these activities. Programs that will be delivered include parenting programs, sessions with men discussing violence and abusive behaviour, and personal development courses for young people to improve self-esteem.
- **Kensington Police and Community Youth Centre - \$134,318 (WA).** *Teaching Youth Road Education* is a comprehensive driver training and road safety program for disadvantaged clients, young offenders and those perceived to be at risk of offending. The aims of the project include the reduction/prevention of criminal activity of young people with respect to motor vehicles including driving offences and car theft. The project will also improve opportunities for obtaining employment.
- **Lead On Australia Ltd - \$148,653 (QLD).** The *Your NICK.ed* project is a community-led initiative connecting schools, police, youth, service providers and the wider community. The program will educate youth, parents, youth sector professionals and senior Australians about 'Stranger Danger' when using the internet, up skill local professionals to become program facilitators and provide ongoing information and advice to the local community.
- **Mission Australia - \$148,257 (NT).** The *Community Safety Through Family Participation* project helps young people and their families understand the implications of involvement in the juvenile justice system and the behaviour which led to it. It provides skills and support on entry to 'the system', during involvement, and later to help break the cycle of offending behaviour.
- **Mission Australia - \$150,000 (NSW).** *Linking Lifetimes* is a preventative, early intervention mentoring program designed to assist adolescents who live with grandparents, kinship carers or foster carers. The project will complement the existing Custodial Grandparents program that operates from Mission Australia's Nowra Centre and will build emotional resilience in and teach communication and relationship skills to these adolescents through mentoring.
- **Northern Rivers Social Development Council Inc - \$149,041 (NSW).** The *Elder Abuse Prevention* project will develop a framework for identifying, responding to and intervening in situations where older people are considered at risk of abuse. The project also aims to enhance the capacity of an existing crisis telephone service for identification and referral of abuse and build the capacity of service providers and the community to deal with situations of elder abuse. The project will involve the implementation of a community awareness campaign to raise awareness and support of older people at risk of abuse.

- **Power Neighbourhood House - \$15,000 (VIC).** The *Secure Homes Safer Neighbourhoods* project will adopt a multi-layered approach to decrease property crime, increase community perceptions of safety and provide support for low income earners to improve home safety. The project will involve home safety audits. This will be followed by subsidised improvement work completed through a work-for-the-dole project. This work will be led by a qualified builder providing support and training to local people.
- **Raymond Terrace Neighbourhood Centre - \$29,315 (NSW).** *Positive Pathways* is a recreation and education based project that will engage young people in and around Raymond Terrace. The project will offer a range of activities including aerosol art projects on legal walls, the development of music videos, a skateboard design project (culminating in a community skate event hosted by participants), and anger management counselling incorporating drug and alcohol education. The project will also refer participants to relevant TAFE courses.
- **Russian Ethnic Representative Council of Victoria - \$150,000 (VIC).** The *Russian Community Crime Prevention* project works with Australian-Russian families to discourage criminal behaviours such as domestic/family violence. The project also aims to reduce fear of crime, facilitate activities to strengthen youth to withstand criminal influences and improve community safety, especially for the older Russian community.
- **Shire of Coolgardie - \$105,000 (WA).** The *Engaged Youth – Engaged Community* project is a collaborative program between the Shire of Coolgardie, local community groups and government agencies. The project will focus on youth and their families living within the Shire to help them overcome specific social problems which lead to youth crime and drug dependency. The key objective is to engage the community's young people in meaningful community projects which will work to enhance relationships between families and the wider community.
- **Shoalhaven City Council - \$133,106 (NSW).** The *There's No Excuse for Abuse* project aims to reduce the incidence of violent crime by spreading the message that "There is No Excuse for Abuse". Groups in the community will be encouraged to spread this message and concept through focus groups, art/poster competitions and a comprehensive media campaign.
- **Streetwize Communications - \$60,478 (NSW).** *Be a Real Artist – You're a Dag if You Tag* will aim to engage, divert and up-skill young people involved in illegal graffiti practices and convey to them the high cost of graffiti to the community. The project will comprise a 13 week workshop series in which young participants will develop art pieces. The project will also include the development of a peer prevention resource on the issue of graffiti.

- **Tamworth Regional Council - \$5,000 (NSW).** The *Domestic Violence Resource File* project aims to engage the community through the provision of a reader friendly, supportive and discrete information source for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault.
- **The Corporation of the Synod of the Diocese of Brisbane - \$150,000 (QLD).** The *Creating Resilient Children* project aims to equip primary school-aged children with the knowledge and skills to avoid sexual abuse, stranger danger and engaging in anti-social behaviour. Primary school students from Ipswich schools will participate with their parents in groups on protective behaviours, keeping children safe, anger management and social skills. Three such groups per school term are planned. Information and tip sheets on the topics will also be distributed.
- **Townsville and District Education Centre Ltd - \$150,000 (QLD).** The *Juvenile Empowerment and Development Initiative* will assist young people aged 10 to 14 to make positive choices and increase their connection and support network within the community. The aim is to address risk factors that lead to later offending. The project will involve mentoring, personal development programs and camps incorporating recreational and personal development elements.
- **Victorian Arabic Social Services - \$150,000 (VIC).** *No Excuse for Family Violence* will inform, support and assist newly arrived families from Arabic speaking backgrounds to understand, avoid and resolve family violence in a culturally sensitive and appropriate framework. The project will also establish partnership arrangements between VASS and other domestic violence agencies to ensure on-going benefits to the community.
- **Young Media Australia - \$147,746 (SA).** The *Reducing Reel to Real Violence* project will develop resources and an early intervention program to encourage minimisation of exposure to violent media. The resources will be provided to parents of children under the age of seven, who attend childcare, preschool and junior primary centres in the Adelaide metropolitan area. The resources will be developed to help reduce the likelihood of exposure to violent media. The resources will also be distributed to local libraries and media outlets.
- **YWCA Victoria - \$115,054 (VIC).** The *Girl Power: Young Women's Self Protection & Leadership Program* aims to build individual resilience, personal safety, self-confidence, assertiveness, and communication skills amongst young women. Group-based early intervention, self-protection and leadership programs will be delivered to young women aged 15 to 23, focusing on protective behaviours, self-esteem and assertiveness in relationships, problem solving, personal motivation and awareness of and links to support service.

- **Central Australian Aboriginal Media Association (CAAMA) - \$499,080 (NT).** The *Central Australian Youth Media project* is designed to assist young people in the development of music, radio and video skills to increase their training and employment opportunities and address their social and economic needs. CAAMA will work in partnership to deliver these outcomes.
- **City of Casey - \$479,205 (VIC).** The aim of the *Promoting Peace in Families project* is to educate and strengthen the capacity of diverse communities within the City of Casey to identify, prevent and respond to family violence.
- **Devonport City Council - \$496,996 (TAS).** The *Lighthouse: Can Do, Will Do* program focuses on community participation and development to equip at-risk young people and young offenders with role models and mentors who will provide them with knowledge, skills and attitudes to be successful in life.
- **Glendyne Education and Training Centre - \$352,046 (QLD).** *Bridging the Gap* is a community partnership project by Glendyne Education and Training, Department of Communities Juvenile Justice and Hervey Bay Council, for youth at risk of offending, or who are already involved in the criminal justice system.
- **Good Beginnings Australia Ltd - \$498,741 (NSW/SA).** The *Elizabeth Connect Turn Around Program (TAP)* is a support program for young children and students that extends beyond the boundaries of the classroom to provide educational, social and health services for students and their families.
- **Hervey Bay Neighbourhood Centre Incorporated - \$496,088 (QLD).** The *Fraser Coast Youth Mentoring Program* utilises the Community's capacity to provide early intervention to at-risk or disengaged youth aged eight to 17 years at critical transition points in their lives.
- **Lachlan Shire Council - \$295,040 (NSW).** The *Widening the Circle project* will help young parents join those who are involved in positive parenting within the Shire. Information, workshops and family activities will be supplemented by two Parent Helpers facilitating a support network, up skilling young and potential parents, referring them to assistance available from service agencies and encouraging participation in the project's activities.
- **Mission Australia - \$302,096 (SA).** The *Youth Central project* is designed to bring service providers, young people and the wider community together to address the issue of crime in Whyalla. The project will be based on the provision of activities to provide information for young people while engaging them in constructive activities.
- **Northern Tasmania Development - \$499,937 (TAS).** The *Northern Tasmania Youth Centre project* will establish the Northern Tasmania Youth Centre and demonstrate the centre's capacity through the provision of a holistic youth support/development service to improve outcomes in self esteem, skills base and social networks of the region's at-risk young people.

- **Salvation Army (Tasmania) Property Trust - \$354,051 (TAS).** *The Young Women Offenders Collaborative Action Strategy project* takes a collaborative case management approach to identify and address the needs of female offenders aged 13-17 who are at high risk of entering detention.
- **Y-Care (South East Qld) Inc. - \$499,710 (QLD).** The *U-Turn* program specifically targets recidivist offenders aged 14-20 who specialise in property offences, in particular car theft, but will be expanded to now include burglary offences.
- **North Australian Aboriginal Justice Agency Ltd. - \$120,000 (NT).** Under the *Indigenous Family Violence Offenders Program for Remote Indigenous Communities project*, a programme coordinator located in Darwin will be trained to deliver a 50 hour workshop-based programme for perpetrators of family violence. The program's participants will be offenders found guilty of family violence-related offences referred by courts and also those identified by local police and Community Councils.
- **Tangentyere Council Inc. - \$150,000 (NT).** The *Volatile Substance Abuse Supply Reduction project* will address the abuse of inhalants (including petrol) by working with retailers in Alice Springs and remote locations to reduce supply. In addition a community education programme will be conducted to ensure that Indigenous communities are aware both of methods to report dealers and relevant legislation.
- **Aboriginal Prisoners and Offenders Incorporated - \$150,000 (SA).** The *Intensive Prevention and Diversion project* will work directly with a small group of Indigenous male and female recidivists for periods of six to 12 months. The project will include life skills training and camps with guest speakers, emphasising cultural links and networks.
- **Cairns Basketball Incorporated - \$136,000 (QLD).** The *Hoop Dreaming project* is a pilot programme that combines a series of initiatives providing Indigenous youth, aged 12 to 18 years, with opportunities to become more successful and knowledgeable in various aspects of life including education, employment and health.
- **Kalumburu Aboriginal Corporation - \$141,944 (WA).** *Gone Out Bush* is a programme to engage the youth of Kalumburu in activities designed to build self reliance and a connection to their culture and country.
- **Kummara Association Inc - \$150,000 (QLD).** The *Indigenous Family Resilience project* will develop a programme to strengthen culturally appropriate parenting and caring for Indigenous children.

- **City of Holdfast Bay - \$90,000 (SA).** As part of the Moseley Square Upgrade, the City of Holdfast Bay is proposing to install basic infrastructure to facilitate a surveillance system for the Moseley Square Area. CCTV will also greatly assist in the maintenance of public order, reducing nuisance and vandalism offences and enhancing a sense of safety by members of the general public.
- **Gosford City Council - \$320,000 (NSW).** The Gosford Community Vitality Project aims to reduce anti-social behaviour and crime and peoples' perception of crime to create a safer community. This project will extend this strategy as it introduces an increased fear of detention and apprehension in potential offenders while fostering a feeling of safety in the community.
- **Sutherland Shire Council - \$399,751 (NSW).** The Cronulla Safety and Security Strategy is a multifaceted program designed to increase the safety of residents, businesses and visitors to this entertainment district.
- **Wollongong City Council - \$445,000 (NSW).** Wollongong City Council's 'City Centre CCTV Camera Program' will be an integral part of a wider city centre crime prevention strategy. It is a strategic partnership between Wollongong Council, Wollongong City Centre Ltd and the NSW Police.
- **Belgrave Traders Association Inc. - \$42,000 (VIC).** This project will include the installation of CCTV security-monitoring equipment in the main street and some car parks in Belgrave Township to ensure the safety of individuals visiting entertainment and eating establishments.
- **Centre Safe Committee Lilydale Inc. - \$150,000 (VIC).** The Centre Safe Committee has established a partnership with Local Police to provide resources and assistance for the maintenance of a crime- and intimidation-free transport, commercial and retail centre in Lilydale.
- **City of Bayswater - \$20,896 (WA).** This project will undertake the installation of mobile CCTV cameras in identified trouble spots throughout the precinct, including laneways between shops. The cameras will be used as part of a local crime prevention strategy.
- **City of Bunbury - \$150,000 (WA).** The City of Bunbury operates a CCTV network within the Bunbury CBD, installed in specific locations identified as "hot spots" for crime and antisocial behaviour. This project aims to extend the coverage of the network to cope with changes in the area.
- **City of Rockingham - \$135,846 (WA).** This project is for a Project Officer-City Safe (Graffiti management and CCTV volunteer project) for a two year period. The officer will coordinate graffiti programs and integrate these with local crime prevention strategies. The position will also assist in the continued implementation and development of the community CCTV program.

- **City of Whitehorse - \$20,000 (VIC).** This submission requests funding for the supply and installation of seven CCTV cameras to put within Box Hill Mall in the 06-07 financial year.
- **Elliott District Community Government Council - \$28,373 (NT).** The project will provide a safer environment for vehicular and pedestrian traffic by improving street lighting in Elliot, Ngurra Gurungu, Ngurra Wilyuku and Marlingja communities.
- **Finley Livestock Exchange - \$17,855 (NSW).** The Finley Livestock Exchange aims to provide enhanced safety and security for the benefit of members of the rural community who use the saleyards to buy and sell livestock.
- **Frankston City Council - \$44,635 (VIC).** This project involves the installation of a CCTV system to enhance the Frankston Safe Taxi Rank to help reduce the incidence of alcohol related violence. A camera system will help patrons feel safer and will provide full high quality visual coverage of the local area.
- **Katherine Town Council - \$65,000 (NT).** The Council will install pedestrian lighting in First Street, providing for significant crime prevention and reduction of negative perceptions and lack of 'feeling safe' by decreasing the likeliness of continued criminal behaviour.
- **Mornington Chamber of Commerce - \$76,740 (VIC).** The Safe City Project CCTV is a project to install six strategically-placed 'Pan Tilt Zoom' cameras along Main Street Mornington and adjacent car parks with appropriate signage. The cameras will enhance the feeling of safety, reduce crime and increase the detection of offences in the main street area.
- **Narrandera Shire Council - \$14,465 (NSW).** This project seeks to improve community safety and security and to maximise the benefits from the Council's existing CCTV infrastructure by extending access to the network, including certain duplicate control functions, to the Narrandera Police Station.
- **Perth Hebrew Congregation Incorporated - \$60,000 (WA).** This project is to design and erect a perimeter security fence complete with access controls around the premises of the Perth Synagogue. This will protect the premises and persons on the property in the event of a potential attack on the Synagogue.
- **Wyndham Telecentre - \$15,000 (WA).** Wyndham is a remote outback community, where the telecentres are community owned and managed not-for-profit organisations set up to deliver a range of services. The project will involve the implementation of programs aiming to reduce antisocial behaviour and crime by implementing early intervention strategies.

- **Campbelltown City Council - \$98,500 (Campbelltown).** The Cultural Conflict project aims to reduce hostilities between different cultural groups in the area and manage fear of crime through the use of information kits and implementation of a media campaign.
- **Holroyd City Council - \$57,090 (Holroyd).** The Holroyd Web Watch project will design and establish a community safety website to provide information on crime prevention and safety with a focus on reducing the fear of crime. The information will be available for individuals and organisations and will target specific groups and current issues.
- **Horizon Theatre Company Limited - \$129,150 (Bankstown and surrounding areas).** The C Red - Creative and Performing Arts Skills for Conflict Resolution project involves partnering with police and other community organisations to provide early intervention arts-based activities for at-risk and marginalised youth, and equip them with alternative methods for crime prevention.
- **Karitane - \$137,732 (Lidcombe).** Through the Adolescent Mothers in Custody - Linking to a New Future for Families project, the Juniperina Juvenile Justice Centre and Karitane partnership will support extended day visits for children, facilitate parenting education, and evaluate policy and protocols associated with mothers at the facility.
- **Macarthur Diversity Services Inc. - \$150,000 (Campbelltown, Camden and Wollondilly).** The Focus on Youth Diversity project aims to reduce the incidence of culturally and linguistically diverse youth at risk becoming involved in criminal activity within the Macarthur area. Working collaboratively with various government and non-government agencies and families, the project aims to build positive community relationships, enhance self-esteem and develop skills.
- **Macquarie Legal Centre Inc. - \$150,000 (Holroyd).** Rights and Responsibilities: Your Guide To Staying Out of Trouble is a cooperative project between high schools, police, the legal centre and NSW Legal Aid Commission to conduct a series of crime prevention workshops for high school students in the Holroyd Local Government Area.
- **Parramatta City Council - \$104,660 (Parramatta).** The Suspended: A Youth Support Program will provide assistance for students in years 10 to 12 who are under suspension from Granville Boys and South Granville High Schools. It will provide workshops to support the students' literacy and numeracy needs and develop their social and behavioural skills.

- **Rosie's Place Incorporated - \$150,000 (Mt Druitt area).** The Just A Little Respect project is a primary prevention partnership between Rosie's Place and Streetwise Comics, and addresses relationship violence among young people aged 12 to 18 in the Mt Druitt area. The project will develop an educational prevention media resource complemented by a program for young people in local secondary schools.
- **Youth Off The Streets - \$137,626 (Macquarie Fields).** The Doing It Ourselves, A Youth Community Crime Prevention Initiative for Macquarie Fields project will build on the strengths of young people attending the Youth Off The Streets Macquarie Fields Outreach Program. Initiatives will include building bridges between youth and local police, peer leadership and mentoring, service learning, safety for young women and diversionary activities to provide positive alternatives to juvenile crime.
- **Women's Activities and Self Help House - \$286,850 (Mt Druitt).** The Staying Home Leaving Violence project is a pilot casework and community development model enabling women ending a violent relationship to remain in their own home. Through supporting women who choose to stay in their home the project will assess safety needs, seek to improve social, health, economic and legal outcomes for women and their children and promote accountability for offenders of violence.

ROUND 4:

- **Mildura Rural City Council – \$494,000(Vic).** The *Mildura CBD Safety Strategy* project aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour and improve community safety in the Mildura CBD, particularly at night time. The project will revise the Liquor Licensing Accord and offer education, enforcement and engineer strategies to improve safety in the CBD. The project will also include CCTV, safety audits, design considerations and a transport safety strategy.
- **City of Geraldton – \$414,220 (WA).** The *CBD/Foreshore Redevelopment – CCTV System* project aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour and provide a safe and secure environment for local residents and businesses. It will install a CCTV system in the redeveloped CBD/Foreshore and the entertainment precinct. The project is a partnership with the local chamber of commerce and the WA Police.
- **Women's Health Goulburn North East – \$230,420 (Vic).** The *Bsafe* project aims to improve community safety, deter offenders and reduce the fear of crime. The project will build on a successful pilot project to supply Emergency Safety Kits to people at high risk of violence in diverse rural locations. It will also develop Keep Safe kits for a broader audience. The project will enhance existing partnerships between local police and the family violence sector.

- **Belmont Services Bowls Club Inc – \$14,000 (Qld).** The *Video Surveillance* project will install CCTV for surveillance of the Belmont Services bowling greens and clubhouse. The project aims to deter vandalism and safeguard the club from break-ins.
- **City of Ballarat – \$150,000 (Vic).** The *Central Business District Public Closed Circuit Television* project aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour and improve community safety. The project will install a high quality CCTV system in the city's CBD and entertainment precinct.
- **Inverloch Tourism Association Inc – \$136,000 (Vic).** The *A Safer Inverloch* project aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour and improve community safety in Inverloch. The project will implement a CCTV system, along with prominently displayed signs and upgraded lighting.
- **Balonne Shire Council – \$150,000 (Qld).** The *St George CCTV Security* project aims to deter and detect criminal activity by installing CCTV cameras at strategic locations within the St George CBD. In particular, the project seeks to reduce the fear of crime and the incidence of vandalism, property damage, theft, alcohol-related violence and anti-social behaviour.
- **Cobargo Agricultural, Pastoral & Horticultural Society Inc – \$2,660 (NSW).** The *Increase Security Lighting and Safe* project aims to improve safety and security at the Cobargo showground by installing security lighting.
- **Corporation of the City of Port Augusta – \$136,820 (SA).** The *Extension to Existing CCTV* project aims to reduce crime and improve community safety. It will expand the current CCTV surveillance system to assist in the identification of offenders. In particular, the project seeks to reduce the incidence of driving offences, property damage and anti-social behaviour.
- **Katherine Town Council – \$20,000 (NT).** The *Maluka Park – Lighten Up!* project aims to deter crime and anti-social behaviour in Maluka Park and reduce the fear of crime experienced by nearby residents. The project will install seven additional lights in the park.
- **Moree Plains Shire Council – \$150,000 (NSW).** The *CBD Video Surveillance* project aims to enhance safety in the main street and adjoining parking areas and laneways of Moree CBD. The project will install a CCTV system to assist in the deterrence of anti-social behaviour and vandalism.
- **Albany Chamber of Commerce and Industry Inc – \$150,000 (WA).** The *Albany Safe CBD CCTV* project aims to deter crime and anti-social behaviour. The project will install a wireless CCTV Network at specific locations and hotspots around Albany CBD.

- **Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Association – \$17,180 (Qld).** The *Mooloolaba Flotilla QF6 Security System & Surveillance Cameras* project aims to deter crime and support investigations into criminal activity. It will install surveillance cameras and other security measures to monitor coast guard and public vessels, walkways and car/trailer park activity.
- **Beenleigh & District Historical Society – \$52,490(Qld).** The *Beenleigh Historical Village Surveillance* project aims to protect the historic precinct from criminal damage and deter criminal activity through the installation of CCTV security cameras.
- **City of Joondalup – \$150,000 (WA).** The *Joondalup CCTV* project aims to support investigations into criminal activity, deter crime and reduce the fear of crime. It will install CCTV cameras within the City of Joondalup to complement other community safety initiatives undertaken by the City.
- **City of Stirling – \$44,030 (WA).** The *Carine Skate Park Safety* project aims to deter anti-social behaviour and vandalism and increase the feeling of safety and security at the facility and its surrounds. The project will implement a CCTV system and engage the YMCA to operate an outreach program at the skate park on selected evenings.
- **Griffith City Council – \$138,500 (NSW).** The *CCTV for CBD* project will install CCTV infrastructure in Griffith CBD and also provide mobile CCTV security cameras. The project aims to support investigations into criminal activity and deter crime and anti-social behaviour in and around the CBD.
- **Mount Evelyn Township Improvement Committee – \$81,450 (Vic).** The *Mount Evelyn Safety Cameras* project will install a CCTV security system in Mount Evelyn CBD. The project aims to improve community safety and reduce the incidence of crime in the area.
- **Nelson Bay Town Management Inc – \$95,000 (NSW).** The *Nelson Bay Sustainable Crime Surveillance* project will install CCTV cameras at key identified hotspots in the Nelson Bay shopping precinct and adjacent Apex Park. The project aims to support investigations into criminal activity and deter crime and anti-social behaviour in the area.
- **Noosa Shire Council – \$5,860 (Qld).** The *Installation CCTV & Security Equipment at Pomona & District Community House* project will install video surveillance and security equipment within the community house premises. It aims to deter vandalism and break-ins and support investigations into criminal activity.
- **Rural City of Murray Bridge – \$150,000 (SA).** The *Identifi-EYES CCTV Installation, Murray Bridge* project will install CCTV in Murray Bridge CBD and riverfront reserves. The project aims to increase personal safety and decrease property crime in and around the town's important tourist attractions.

- **City of Perth – \$120,000 (WA).** The *Portable CCTV Wireless Cameras Network* project will have an industry specialist develop, supply and install a portable CCTV wireless camera network. The project aims to manage the ongoing graffiti damage problem in the City of Perth by focusing on problem areas when and where required.
- **City of Swan – \$104,640 (WA).** The *Malaga Community Safety and Crime Prevention Strategy* aims to implement a range of strategies to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in a large industrial area in the City of Swan. The project will employ a part-time project officer and use CCTV in problem areas.
- **Croydon Main Street Traders Association Inc – \$150,000 (Vic).** The *Community Safety Real Time Surveillance Program* aims to supply additional resources to enhance safety in shopping and transport centres. The project will place cameras in and around Main Street in Croydon and electronically monitor these areas in ‘real time’ at the Croydon Police station.
- **City of Palmerston – \$150,000 (NT).** The *Palmerston Indigenous Community Support* project aims to achieve positive outcomes and reduce re-offending by supporting young indigenous people entering the justice system, and their families. The project will assist young offenders and their families to understand, and work within, the justice system, and will establish a supportive network of service providers, families and peers to assist young people to avoid re-offending.
- **Great Lakes Community Resources Inc (Homebase Youth Services) – \$121,930 (NSW).** The *Understanding Me Understanding You* project aims to prevent crime by improving the relationship between local indigenous youth and police, and by promoting alternatives to crime. The project will provide a series of physical challenges and cultural awareness activities and will support indigenous youth to undertake appropriate education and job placements.
- **North Queensland Prisoners’ Aid Society Inc – \$150,000 (Qld).** The *Mentoring Program for Post Released Prisoners* project will provide a mentoring program designed to provide individual responses to the needs of post release prisoners exiting Townsville Correctional Centre and returning to indigenous communities outside and within the Townsville area. The project aims to reduce re-offending and support lifestyle choices and alternatives to crime.
- **Tangentyere Council – \$149,860 (NT).** The *Anmatjere Regional Community Safety Strategy* will develop a regional safety plan, and operate a regional night patrol service, to address identified community safety issues. This regional service will be complemented by community safety plans to target localised issues in the Yuelamu, Laramba and Ti Tree communities. The project aims to address anti-social behaviour and alcohol related crime and violence.

- **Protective Behaviours WA Inc – \$150,000 (WA).** *The Child Safety a Priority* project aims to prevent sexual and physical abuse of children and reduce the likelihood of re occurrence of abuse of children. The project will provide training in the Protective Behaviours Child Safety/Abuse Prevention Program to human service support workers, parents and carers of indigenous children in the Pilbara region of Western Australia.
- **Constable Care Child Safety Foundation Inc – \$149,234 (WA).** *The Sporting Chance* project encourages indigenous primary school children in the Kimberly Region to develop problem solving abilities and life skills in response to specific problems they currently face in their families and communities. The organisation will implement a specialist 12 month intensive program in 38 schools over a 12 month period; this program will involve parents and other community members.
- **Coomalie Community Government Council – \$96,790 (NT).** *The Coomalie Community Bus* will provide transport for youth and other community members to travel to social, recreational, sporting and other events in the Coomalie region and other towns. The project aims to improve anti-social behaviour and reduce instances of petty vandalism, which are mainly attributable to boredom.
- **Kurbingui Youth Development Association Inc – \$101,460 (Qld).** *Three Facets* aims to connect young indigenous people to positive support, mentoring and participation opportunities. The project will operate in northern Brisbane and provide resources, staffing and support to emerging crime prevention strategies, including after school activities, outreach programs and sporting associations.
- **Mungullah Community Aboriginal Corporation – \$148,800(WA).** *Family Visions* aims to address cycles of offending in Aboriginal communities on the outskirts of Carnarvon. The project will work with at risk youth over a 2 year period and will enhance individuals' skills and self esteem through encouraging reconnection with culture, supporting educational achievement, and working with families to develop visions for the future.
- **City of Darebin – Youth Services – \$150,000 (Vic).** *The Darebin Youth Outreach and Activities Project known as 'yUTE Project'* will engage marginalised, at-risk young people in the City of Darebin, with particular emphasis on the East Preston and East Reservoir areas. The project will engage young people using a mobile yUTE that can provide recreational activities, and information and referral for young people who are at risk of becoming engaged in anti-social behaviour and criminal activities.
- **Coorow & District Technology Development Association – \$28,910 (WA).** *The Youth Coordinator* project will provide recreational activities for young people on a regular basis and will coordinate these activities in collaboration with the Leeman Police Youth Group. The project aims to divert young people from crime, particularly anti-social behaviour and vandalism, and promote a sense of community.

- **Mission Australia – \$93,290 (NSW).** The *Hornsby Children’s Court Support* project aims to reduce re-offending and juvenile crime levels. The project will provide young people appearing before Hornsby Children’s Court with information, support and post-court follow up to gain effective outcomes from the legal process. It will also provide training to local professionals to build their capacity to support young people in the criminal justice system.
- **Mission Australia – \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Great Lakes Mentoring Project* aims to reduce crime and increase community safety by improving school retention rates, reducing truancy and engaging young people in activities that connect them to their community and empower them to make positive life choices. The project will target two groups of young people: those transitioning from primary to secondary school and those aged 11 to 18 years who have disengaged from education or training and are at risk of leaving school, or have been involved with Juvenile Justice.
- **NAPCAN Foundation – \$149,370 (NSW).** The *Smart Online Safe Online* project aims to educate young people aged 11 to 14 years about the risks and dangers of disclosing personal information in the online environment. By educating young people on how to be smart online, the project aims to make them safer from harm offline. With the support of online communities, the project will employ an online digital communication strategy to remind young people of the risks involved. The project is based on a model developed by the digital marketing firm Profero for the United Kingdom’s Home Office and Central Office of Information.
- **Rotary Club of Mildura Deakin – \$47,220 (VIC).** The *Community Liaison & Support* project aims to improve home and community safety and address the fear of crime in the Sunraysia region. The project will work with seniors, people with a disability and their carers, victims of crime, and other vulnerable community members. The project will assess home safety and arrange for improvements to be made by local service clubs and businesses. It will also provide strategies to deal with crime and will involve the local retail sector in improving safety in local shopping precincts.
- **Safer Toowoomba Partnership – \$147,000 (QLD).** The *Establishing ‘THE HEIGHTS’ Community Centre* project will work in partnership with government, local agencies and the community to establish a local community centre. The centre will provide community support and early intervention for diverse groups that are at risk of becoming involved in anti-social behaviour, family violence and other criminal activities. The project will provide for a community worker to operate a range of activities, and provide information and referral to other support services.

- **Shire of Carnarvon – \$98,140 (WA).** The *Carnarvon Youth Engagement Holiday Programme* aims to reduce youth crime and anti-social behaviour in Carnarvon by engaging young people in structured school holiday programs. The programs will provide a range of activities that foster the development of life, leadership and teamwork skills, and promote the uptake of personal safety strategies and behaviours. The school holiday programs, and other related strategies, will be developed and implemented collaboratively with a range of local agencies.
- **South Eastern Region Migrant Resource Centre – \$149,410 (VIC).** The *Refugee and CALD Youth Mentoring* project aims to increase school retention rates of those at risk of leaving school early and becoming involved in anti-social behaviour and crime. It will provide support and mentoring to young people from refugee, and culturally and linguistically diverse, communities.
- **Southern Sydney Women’s Therapy Centre Inc – \$122,860 (NSW).** The *Domestic Violence Proactive Support Service* project aims to increase the safety of victims of domestic violence and improve their ongoing safety. The project will increase opportunities for early intervention by working closely with local police, facilitating referrals from general practitioners, and assisting victims to navigate pathways through the network of relevant agencies.
- **St Bartholomew’s House – \$150,000 (WA).** The *Moving Up and Out* project aims to reduce re-offending behaviour and encourage people who have a previous experience of homelessness and the criminal justice system to participate in activities that will enhance social interaction, communication, motivation and self esteem. The project will provide clients with one to one social support by local volunteers and will provide structured activities that address drug use, conflict management, employment and recreational opportunities.
- **Sunshine Coast Family Contact Centre – \$140,400 (QLD).** The *Early Intervention in Domestic Violence* project will work collaboratively with the local Police Domestic Violence Units and the Magistrates Courts to reduce domestic violence related to parental contact with their children in the Cotton Tree and Gympie areas. The project will provide a safe environment for parents and children at the point where children move from spending time with one parent to the other.
- **Upper Hume Community Health Service – \$100,000 (VIC).** The *Family Violence Early Intervention Project: Fathers & Children Together* project aims to prevent the inter-generational transmission of family violence in the Upper Hume area. The project will conduct community forums, educational activities and workshops to enhance the capacity of fathers to build positive relationships, and improve communication and problem-solving skills, with their children.

- **Wishart North Neighbourhood Watch Association Queensland – \$4,720 (QLD).** The *Personal Property Marking and Recording* project aims to deter thieves by increasing access to, and promoting use of, equipment that marks or photographs personal property with a personal identification number. The project will purchase engraving equipment, digital cameras and a laptop for use by residents of the Wishart area.
- **Panthers on the Prowl Community Development Foundation - \$500,000 (Penrith and surrounding areas).** The *Playing for Success - Tackle it Now* project will address the early factors associated with transition to criminal behaviour by engaging young people in educational and sporting activities. The activities will be provided for selected students within Penrith.
- **Ted Noffs Foundation - \$495,000 (Liverpool, Cabramatta and Fairfield).** The *Liverpool Hiphoperations* project aims to increase community safety by engaging with young people and promoting the protective factors that reduce anti-social behaviour and crime. The project will provide a forum for young people to explore social issues through art, music and theatre workshops.
- **Wise Employment - \$380,000 (Windsor, Parklea and Blacktown).** The *Straight for Work* project aims to reduce drug taking behaviour, drug related crime and re-offending by engaging high needs and at risk offenders in community mentoring, support and training. The project will match participants with trained volunteer mentors and will offer life skills training, supported referrals to essential services and after prison community care.
- **WorkVentures Ltd - \$333,999 (Claymore, Macquarie Fields and Airds).** The *Engaging at Risk Youth in Information Technology* project aims to reduce youth crime by engaging young people in information technology skills development activities. The project will provide access to information technology facilities and training, and aims to develop employment skills and encourage re-engagement with formal education and training.
- **Inner West Skills Centre Inc - \$90,000 (Auburn).** The *Crime Prevention Contracts Programme* will target youth who are at risk of becoming involved in criminal activities. Participants will complete an action plan designed to develop skills, opportunities and protective factors to mitigate negative factors that may lead to criminal behaviour.
- **Self Advocacy Sydney Inc - \$20,200 (Blacktown and Penrith).** The *Be Aware not Scared* project aims to address the over representation of people with intellectual disabilities as victims of crime. The project will develop, present and distribute a training programme to increase personal safety and reduce fear of crime in people with intellectual disabilities.

ROUND 5:

- **Anglicare Victoria – \$500,000 (VIC).** The *Connected Families, Stronger Communities – Karingal Model* project addresses connections between children, their families and the school community at key transition points including Prep, Year 3 and Years 6 to 7. The project aims to strengthen the family unit and reduce family members' involvement in crime.
- **Bethlehem House Homeless Men's Assistance Centre Inc – \$436,140 (TAS).** The *Post Release Options Project* is targeted at inmates with a medium to high risk of re-offending. The project offers a transition service from pre release to post release from prison. Transitional support includes reintegration into family and community, employment and housing options, and aims to reduce recidivism.
- **Cardinia Shire Council – \$445,770 (VIC).** The *Graffiti/Vandalism Management Strategy* Project aims to decrease the incidence of graffiti and criminal damage across the Cardinia Shire, particularly in Beaconsfield, Cockatoo and the Pakenham Growth Corridor through early intervention and prevention programs. The project will include a school based educational program, after school recreational opportunities and a diversionary program.
- **City of Playford – \$479,550 (SA).** The *Shop, Skate and Sing – Youth Outreach* project aims to divert antisocial behaviour of young people and reduce fear of crime within the Elizabeth Shopping Centre Precinct through on-site youth outreach and diversionary youth programmes.
- **Mission Australia – \$500,000 (QLD).** The *Pathways to Participation* is a new initiative under the umbrella of the successful Pathways to Prevention Project. This new initiative aims to work holistically and intensively with families in the Inala community with whom Pathways workers have already built trusted relationships to improve family, children's and school-family relationships. The ultimate goal, based on strong evidence, is to reduce crime in the area by establishing healthy and respectful relationships between children, their carers, peers and their schools.
- **Shire of Broome - \$197,150 (WA).** The *Helping Young People Engage (HYPE)* project aims to enhance community safety by building positive relationships between young people, service providers, local council, the police and community members and fostering young people's inclusion and constructive participation in public spaces. The project will provide young people with information, support and resources and dissuade them from participating in anti-social behaviour.

- **The Salvation Army (Tasmania) Property Trust – \$365,270 (TAS).** The *North West Tasmania Crime Prevention* project is designed to identify and address the needs of young females aged 12 to 17 years at high risk of offending. It will employ a collaborative early intervention approach in partnership with police, youth justice agencies and local schools, through a cognitive skills and education program.
- **Uniting Care West – \$500,000 (WA).** The *Inside Parents* project aims to provide a through care model of support for male prisoners with parenting responsibilities at the Acacia prison. It will provide parenting programmes and innovative family contact opportunities in the prison. Parallel programmes for families of custodial participants will be provided. In addition, specialised re-entry support will be offered for family reunification and child contact once participants leave prison. The programme is designed to address crime prevention and community safety issues by reducing recidivism and intergenerational patterns of crime.
- **Upper Hume Community Health Service Inc – \$480,000 (VIC/NSW).** The *High Water Active Pilot: Youth Crime Prevention Strategies* project utilises a full-time creative education programme to facilitate a whole-of-community response to issues underlying youth crime and antisocial behaviour in Albury/Wodonga. It aims to achieve this by engaging high-risk rural youth in the production of innovative creative resources for use in interagency workshops throughout the region.
- **Yass Valley Council – \$500,000 (NSW).** The Yass Valley's Youth and Community Centre will be developed as a result of the *Yass Valley Integrated Crime Prevention Programme*. This facility will become a focal point to enable the implementation of over 20 crime-prevention initiatives through coordinated interagency intervention using both social and situational approaches. The aim of the project is to stimulate and strengthen partnerships in the community, increase local responsibility for change, strengthen community leadership, enhance law-enforcement measures and address prevention in a proactive approach at the grassroots level.
- **YWCA of Adelaide – \$432,400 (SA).** The *Youth Mentoring* Project engages at-risk young people aged seven to 17 years using an early intervention approach with three key interventions: community-based mentoring, counselling and adventure/recreation therapy. The programme aims to increase resilience and protective factors to reduce the likelihood of young people becoming involved in crime.

- **Big Brothers Big Sisters (Melb) Inc – \$149,890 (VIC).** The *Wangaratta Youth Mentoring* project is a collaborative project targeting young people aged 7–17 years living in Wangaratta. The project aims to reduce community crime by improving young people’s self-esteem and life skills and their overall connection with the wider community through one-to-one mentoring.
- **Blackwood Youth Foundation – \$ 150,000 (VIC/NSW).** The *Blackwood Bush Bash* project is a fitness and wilderness camp programme for at-risk young people aged 12–16. The fitness programme will provide life skills, motivation and team challenges that focus on interpersonal communication. The project will be conducted in Victoria and New South Wales.
- **Brisbane Youth Service Inc – \$150,000 (QLD).** The *Staying Out* project is a community based crime prevention project that aims to address recidivist behaviour among young people who are homeless or at risk and have contact with Queensland State Corrective Services. The targeted client group will be provided with supported and meaningful pathways to enable them to break free from their destructive lifestyle and develop new life skills.
- **City of Mandurah – \$150,000 (WA).** The *Safe Train Precinct Community* project seeks to build partnerships between the Mandurah community, users of the train service and government and non-government agencies. The project aims to promote and encourage the safe use of the train service to a wide range of Mandurah residents, including the elderly and young people.
- **Extra Edge Community Services – \$148,130 (WA).** The *Pre and Post Release Parenting Support for Mothers in Custody* project aims to connect with mothers in custody who have children in residence or visiting. Participants will experience positive parent–child relationships and learn how to apply principles learnt in different living environments. The project seeks to assist women, post custody release, to provide a positive, stable and nurturing home environment for their children.
- **Gold Coast City Council – \$150,000 (QLD).** The *Thrower House* project will adopt a collaborative approach between young people, all levels of government, local agencies and other community members to establish a youth and community centre. Young people and community members will work together to address issues of youth crime, antisocial behaviour and fear of crime.
- **Huon Valley Community and Youth Club Inc – \$150,000 (TAS).** The *Huon Valley PCYC Youth Project Centre* project involves the establishment of a project centre within the Huon Valley PCYC, offering activities to young people who have offended, or are at risk of offending, and are disengaged from school. The project aims to reconnect these young people with school and/or provide a pathway to employment.

- **Joondalup Youth Support Services – \$121,270 (WA).** The *Joondalup Youth Support Services Mentoring* project aims to promote purposeful relationships, in which mentors support marginalised young people to develop a positive sense of self and their community. This provides a solid foundation for young people to make positive life choices and will also increase safety in the broader community.
- **Maribyrnong City Council – \$150,000 (VIC).** The *Street Surfer* project will engage with at-risk young people across the city of Maribyrnong, with particular focus on the Neighbourhood Renewal area of Braybrook and Maidstone. The project will provide an opportunity for disengaged young people to connect with youth workers, community agencies, police, and other young people.
- **Marrickville Council – \$90,000 (NSW).** The *Midnight Basketball Marrickville South League* project targets young people and aims to reduce criminal and antisocial behaviour through a diversionary programme that includes a basketball tournament, life-skills workshops and the provision of nutritious meals.
- **Queensland Police Citizens Youth Welfare Association – \$147,870 (QLD).** The *North Queensland Skateboarding Club* project aims to use the promotion and development of sport and music to engage youth and address concerns about safety and crime in parks around the North Queensland Region.
- **Queensland Police Citizens Youth Welfare Association – \$150,000 (QLD).** The *Caboolture Samoan Community* project will employ a Samoan worker to liaise with key agencies to support young Samoan males to address cultural issues, particularly focusing on domestic, intra-family and gang-related violence.
- **Whitelion Inc – \$ 130,000 (TAS).** The *Whitelion Mentoring* project aims to empower young people aged 10 to 21 who are involved or at risk of involvement, with the youth justice system, by developing meaningful relationships with volunteer adults from the community.
- **Youth Off The Streets – \$ 150,000 (NSW).** The *Griffith Youth Outreach* project will train local male and female peer youth workers to meet young people in their own spaces and provide an entry point into safe diversionary and recreational activities for at-risk young people.
- **YWCA NSW – \$ 149,970 (NSW).** The *Community in the Kitchen* project has been developed in partnership with local stakeholders. It aims to reduce youth crime through the implementation of a diverse programme including social, educational and employment opportunities for young people at risk of offending/re-offending.

- **Adelaide City Council – \$500,000 (SA).** The *Reducing Crime By Design* project aims to reduce crime and antisocial behaviour and improve community safety in the East End Precinct of Adelaide. It will build on strategies already in place and will include a street CCTV monitoring system and a managed Taxi Rank.
- **Baw Baw Shire – \$108,000 (VIC).** The *Drouin Path of Achievement* project aims to minimise the opportunity for crime within the Drouin CBD park and recreation precinct. The project will involve the installation of lighting and development of the Drouin and District Path of Achievement.
- **City of Armadale – \$150,000 (WA).** The *Safer CBD – Jull Street Precinct* project aims to deter and detect criminal activity by installing CCTV cameras at strategic locations within the City of Armadale. In particular, the project seeks to reduce the fear of crime and the incidence of crime.
- **City of Canning – \$150,000 (WA).** The *City of Canning* project will involve the installation CCTV cameras as a crime deterrent in Burrendah Park and the Welshpool and Canning Vale industrial areas.
- **City of Rockingham – \$150,000 (WA).** The *CCTV Monitoring* project will expand the CCTV system in Rockingham to target antisocial behaviour and vandalism in the CBD.
- **City of Salisbury – \$200,000 (SA).** The *Northern Adelaide Security System* project is designed to prevent crime by increasing the surveillance of community infrastructure - including playgrounds, buildings and parks and streets where illegal trail bike and vehicle activity take place.
- **City of Stirling – \$85,000 (WA).** The *Be Seen at Nollamara Shopping Centre (CCTV)* project will involve the installation of a best practice digital CCTV system, including up to 10 surveillance cameras and advisory signage, throughout the public space around the shopping centre to act as a deterrent to crime and to increase safety for the community.
- **Clarence City Council – \$498,330 (TAS).** The *Safety First at Rosny Park* project will install CCTV cameras and improved lighting to provide a safe haven bus stop area (Rosny Park Bus Transit Mall) and to install CCTV cameras on Metro buses servicing the community.
- **Coonamble Shire Council – \$20,000 (NSW).** The *CCTV Extension* project aims to deter ongoing damage, vandalism, graffiti and antisocial behaviour and increase public safety through the expansion of an existing CCTV network.
- **Fairfield Traders Association – \$150,000 (VIC).** *Station St Fairfield CCTV Crime Prevention Program* project aims to deter and detect criminal activity

by installing CCTV cameras within Station St Fairfield shopping precinct. In particular, the project seeks to reduce the fear of crime, property damage, graffiti, theft, drug-related violence and anti-social behaviour.

- **Frankston City Council – \$204,360 (VIC).** The *CCTV Systems in Young St Frankston and at the Frankston Foreshore* project will address crime, instances of anti-social behaviour and improve community safety in the Frankston Central Activities District, the Frankston Foreshore and Frankston Railway Station. The CCTV will deter offenders, increase perceptions of safety and reduce the fear of crime and assist with the management of anti-social behaviour in high pedestrian areas.
- **Glenorchy City Council – \$25,000 (TAS).** The *Improvement of Lighting at Glenorchy Bus Station* project aims to provide a safer night time environment for users of the Glenorchy Bus Station through installation of floodlights in bus shelters and adjoining public toilets.
- **Kingston City Council – \$42,590 (VIC).** The *Chelsea Community Working Together to Prevent Crime* project aims to increase safety through the installation of a pilot CCTV system at the shopping centre/beach entrance to deter crime and enable increased detection of offenders.
- **Latrobe City Council – \$150,000 (VIC).** The *A Better Place To Be* project will implement strategies to reduce crime, improve community safety and increase perceptions of safety in the Traralgon CBD entertainment precinct.
- **Launceston City Council – \$438,720 (TAS).** The *Safe Public Bus Stops and Travel* project aims to enhance Launceston City's crime prevention activities and public bus transport system by providing a surveillance function to deter antisocial behaviour in buses and at bus stops and installing CCTV in buses and at newly identified trouble spots in the CBD which are in close proximity to bus stops.
- **Logan City Council – \$140,000 (QLD).** The *Safety Camera Van – Logan's Mobile Approach to CCTV* project is a pilot project that will provide live and recorded surveillance of hotspot areas across Logan City using a mobile van that will operate 24 hours, seven days a week. The Police Communications Centre will have surveillance access via a live link and the project will assist with undercover operations. The project aims to provide a proactive and reactive response to suspicious antisocial behaviours and crime.
- **Mooroolbark Traders and Community Group Inc – \$150,000 (Vic).** The *Community Safety Real Time Surveillance* project will involve installation of cameras in and around the Mooroolbark CBD that will provide electronic monitoring and recording in real time at the Mooroolbark Police Station.
- **Murwillumbah District Business Chamber – \$87,540 (NSW).** The *Murwillumbah CBD CCTV Initiative* will involve the installation of an Event

Activated CCTV Monitoring System to deter and prevent petty crimes and vandalism in the Murwillumbah Central Business District.

- **Nhulunbuy Corporation Limited – \$48,430 (NT).** The *CCTV Cameras for Hot Spots Town Centre* project will expand upon existing CCTV camera infrastructure and will involve the installation of an additional seven cameras in identified hot spots to deter criminal activity.
- **Northern Suburbs Hebrew Congregation Perth Inc – \$40,000 (WA).** The *Security Upgrade* project is to upgrade security cameras, lighting, gates and fences at the Noranda Synagogue and establish speedier communication with the Community Security Group and the police. This will create a safe environment for staff and congregants without the threat of vandalism, abuse, break-ins, criminal damage and anti-Semitic graffiti.
- **Orange City Council – \$150,000 (NSW).** The *CBD Crime Prevention Through CCTV* project involves the installation of data capture surveillance cameras in the Orange CBD. The project aims to enhance citizen and shopper safety, deter potential acts of vandalism and assist in detection of antisocial and criminal behaviour.
- **St Joseph’s Catholic Church – \$40,000 (NT).** The *Fencing around the Precinct of the Church* project will involve the construction of a metal fence to secure the church and the churchyard from the activities of intoxicated persons and vandals and prevent damage to the church and other buildings in the churchyard.
- **Shoalhaven City Council – \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Nowra CBD CCTV* project will install CCTV cameras at strategic points in Junction Street to deter antisocial behaviour and criminal activities, and identify perpetrators.
- **Southern Mallee District Council – \$10,640 (SA).** The *Safe Play* project will involve the installation of security lighting in the playground area of the Pinnaroo Lion’s Park to provide a safer more family friendly environment and prevent crime.
- **Temora Shire Council – \$147,020 (NSW).** The *Community Safety and Crime Prevention* project will involve the installation of CCTV Cameras in three public parks and in the main street of Temora. The project aims to increase surveillance to improve public safety and to reduce vandalism and antisocial behaviour.
- **The Bell Street Mall Traders Association Inc – \$129,550 (VIC).** The *Bell Street Mall Community CCTV Upgrade* project will install CCTV security-monitoring equipment in and around the centre's buildings, laneways and carparks in the West Heidelberg Mall shopping precinct to ensure the safety of people using the area.
- **The Entrance Town Centre Management Corporation Inc – \$134,000 (NSW).** The *Entrance Security Monitoring System* project aims to establish a

safe and secure environment within The Entrance Town Centre for the benefit of the public and business community through the installation of a CCTV monitoring system targeting antisocial behaviour, vandalism and theft.

- **Thuringowa City Council – \$50,000 (QLD).** The *Riverway – Pioneer Park CCTV Network Expansion* project will extend the existing CCTV network at Riverway in Thuringowa to deter crime, protect property and prevent antisocial behaviour in public spaces and at events.
- **Tweed Shire Council – \$120,000 (NSW).** The *Kingscliff CCTV* project will involve the installation of a 24-hour video surveillance system to monitor the public areas along Marine Parade, Kingscliff to increase safety for residents and tourists.
- **Warwick Shire Council – \$73,990 (QLD).** The *Safer Parks for the Community* project aims to prevent and reduce crime, vandalism and antisocial behaviour within four of Warwick’s parks by upgrading lighting and installing an extra CCTV security camera in Leslie Park.
- **Alice Springs Youth Accommodation & Support Services Inc – \$150,000 (NT).** The *Deadly Treadlies* project aims to reduce antisocial behaviour, criminal behaviour and substance abuse through rebuilding bikes and incorporating a range of education activities and life skills into bike workshops.
- **Brisbane Indigenous Media Association – \$141,950 (QLD).** The *Young, Strong and Safe* project aims to involve young people in detention and those at risk in producing music, radio segments and printed and on-line material on the prevention of youth crime. Participants will have the opportunity to undertake nationally accredited training.
- **Community Business Development and IT Services – \$145,400 (NSW).** The *Reverse the Trend* project aims to reduce crime and the likelihood of petty offenders committing more serious criminal offences. It uses a three-pronged approach encompassing education and recreation programmes, education for parents and a media campaign against violence.
- **Community Restorative Centre – \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Indigenous Transition Programme* will provide casework support and mentoring to indigenous people transitioning from custody into the community in the inner suburbs of Sydney. By building the capacity of local services and community networks to provide appropriate support services, the project aims to successfully reintegrate indigenous former offenders into the community, and reduce recidivism and the over-representation of indigenous people in prison.
- **The Song Room – \$146,600 (NT).** The *Barkly Community Rhythm Project* is an early intervention project for children, youth and families in remote

indigenous communities. It aims to reduce antisocial behaviour and juvenile crime through music and arts programmes that enhance participants' social skills, self-esteem and community engagement. The project will also develop the skills and qualifications of local Aboriginal men and women for sustainable outcomes. The Song Room, which is located in Victoria, will deliver this project in the Northern Territory.

- **Yuendumu Community Government Council – \$24,000 (NT).** The *Domestic Violence Media Campaign* will produce and broadcast radio and television advertisements about domestic violence. The advertisements will feature local community members speaking in language and with cultural authority. The project will contribute to ongoing efforts to address family violence.
- **ADRA Australia Ltd – \$150,000 (NSW).** ADRA's *Breaking the Cycle* project endeavours to break cycles of antisocial and criminal behaviour in young offenders, reduce recidivism and prevent younger siblings from engaging in criminal activity. The project will focus on the family, the offender and younger siblings, and aims to build individual and family resilience and reduce stress levels as well as improve parenting skills, coping mechanisms, family relationships, and communication and connectedness by providing a range of support services.
- **Bankstown Multicultural Youth Service – \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Breaking the Cycle* project aims to divert youth in the Bankstown area away from the criminal justice system and increase their engagement within the local community. A caseworker will work with participants to develop a case plan, which will identify participants' needs and goals and link participants to mentors and other supports.
- **Blacktown City Council – \$10,000 (NSW).** The *Emerton Youth Recreation Centre – Home guard* project involves installation of a CCTV system and other security related infrastructure in the Emerton Youth Recreation Centre (EYRC) to increase the safety and security of youth accessing the centre. EYRC works closely with the local youth community and provides a range of programmes and services.
- **Drug and Alcohol Multicultural Education Centre – \$150,000 (NSW).** The *Transitioning: Support for Vietnamese Drug Offenders* project aims to prevent relapse into drug use and criminal recidivism of Vietnamese drug offenders in the south-west Sydney region. The project will provide offenders and their families with intensive case management support and referrals for three to six months following offenders' release from prison.

- **Joan Harrison Support Services for Women Inc – \$145,310 (NSW).** The *Aboriginal Women Against Violence* project will address family violence in the local Aboriginal community and increase the community's capacity to ensure a safe environment for women and children. A series of education programmes will be specifically designed, developed and conducted to train indigenous women, who will then train and mentor other local Aboriginal women to become future trainers and advocates for their own communities. The project will also establish a Violence Against Women Committee within the Aboriginal community to address the specific needs of Aboriginal women.
- **Katoomba Chamber of Commerce and Community – \$60,000 (NSW).** The *Katoomba CBD Crime Prevention Strategy* involves installing a CCTV system and improved lighting in strategic areas adjacent to and including the main street of Katoomba. It is anticipated that the strategy will lead to a reduction of theft, assault, property damage and antisocial behaviour in Katoomba's retail and tourism precinct.
- **Wollondilly Shire Council – \$20,000 (NSW).** As part of the *Perimeter Fencing – Kipara Crescent Reserve – Warragamba* project, the Wollondilly Shire Council will construct perimeter fencing fronting the Kipara Crescent Reserve. The project aims to restrict access by unauthorised vehicles and decrease vandalism in the park, as well as improve safety for park users.
- **Wollondilly Shire Council – \$25,000 (NSW).** Under the *Perimeter Fencing – Gundungarra Park* project, the Wollondilly Shire Council will construct perimeter fencing around Gundungarra Park. The project aims to restrict access by unauthorised vehicles and decrease vandalism in the park, as well as improve safety for park users.
