#### **Scheduling Format**

16 Conference games. Each team will play a single game (home or away) against all of the other 11 teams and five "mirror" games.

#### 2011 Championship

The 2011 Conference USA Championship will be played March 9-12 in El Paso, Texas (Don Haskins Center).

#### **2011 Championship Format**

Each team qualifies for the tournament. The top four seeds each earn first-round byes with the winner of the championship gaining the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Championship.

# **Credential Requests**

All requests for single-game, working credentials should be made to the sports information office at least one week in advance of the game to be covered. All requests should come from media

entities' sports editors or directors.

Credential requests can be emailed directly to basketball contact Ron Mears at rmears@rice.edu or can be faxed on company letterhead to Mears' attention at (713) 348-6019.

Rice University follows the guidelines set forth by the NCAA and Conference USA in issuing credentials

Credentials will be issued based on the following priority schedule:

- Media agencies which cover Rice and/or its opponent on a regular basis;
- Media agencies which cover Conference USA regularly;
- National media agencies;
- Other daily newspapers with Sunday publication and a minimum circulation of 100,000;
- Other daily newspapers with Sunday publication and a minimum circulation of 50,000;
- Television stations with a full-time sports director;
- 7. Radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting daily talk shows;

- Student publications or departments representing the competing schools only. Student publications of non-competing schools will not be accredited. When available, a maximum of two press row seats and two photo passes are available for visiting student publications;
- Other credential requests considered on the basis of circulation, publication dates and space.

Spouses, dates, minors and non-working media will not be permitted in the press areas. Credentials will be available at the media will call located at the ticket windows adjacent to the lobby entrance to Tudor Fieldhouse. No credentials will be mailed.

Photo credentials will be granted on the same priority schedule as general media credentials.

### **NBA Scouts**

Credentials for NBA scouts should be requested by NBA teams' player personnel/college scouting departments. Credentials should be requested at least one week in advance and will be available at media will call.

Every effort will be made to provide scout seating in the media sections of Tudor Fieldhouse. For certain events, scout seating will be in marked seating of the fieldhouse.

# **Photographers**

Photo credentials will be granted on the same game-day priority schedule as general media credentials.

Photo spots in Tudor Fieldhouse are not reserved.

# **Media Parking**

The Rice University sports information office does not issue parking passes for events. Parking on event nights at Rice is free and available in the commuter lots located just northwest of Tudor Fieldhouse.

West Lot 4, located between Tudor Fieldhouse and Rice Stadium, is available for event parking on game nights.

Ben Braun

With two highly-touted recruiting classes and a group of returning veterans still dominated by a nucleus of underclassmen, Ben Braun begins his third season at Rice University.

In his second year, Rice fielded a team which featured just one senior along with three juniors. The program had welcomed one of the school's top recruiting classes prior to the 2009-10 season, and the Owls' freshman class accounted for 53 starts during the year.

ESPN.com ranked the Owls' 2008 signing class No. 3 among NCAA Division I mid-major programs while Rivals.com ranked the program's early signing class among its Top 10 for mid-majors.

Freshman guard Tamir Jackson led the Owls in scoring while freshman forward Arsalan Kazemi led the squad in rebounding. It was the first time since the 2001-02 season that a freshman had led the Owls in either scoring or rebounding. Kazemi was selected to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team.

Off the court, Rice had two players named to Conference USA's All-Academic Team. Rice is one of only two schools in the league to have at least one All-Academic Team selection in each of the past four seasons. Rice had four student-athletes named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

Braun's inaugural 2008-09 Rice team more than tripled its total victories from the previous season. The Owls won on the road for the first time in two years and notched a win over a higher-seeded team at the Conference USA Tournament.

Six student-athletes from the 2008-09 squad were named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll while senior Aleks Perka was named the league's Scholar Athlete for men's basketball. The academic success, notably Perka's recognition, continued a standard for Braun-coached student-athletes.

Through the 2009-10 season and dating back to his 12 seasons as the head coach at the University of California, Braun has had 18 players named to conference all-academic teams.

One of the winningest active Division I coaches, Braun has more than 30 years of head coaching experience and has had unequaled success everywhere he has been. He begins his third season at Rice with a 570-434 overall record (.568).

During his 12-year tenure at Cal, Braun directed the Bears to five NCAA Tournament berths and three trips to the NIT. He led the 1998 Bears to a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16 and to an NIT championship in 1999.

In his final season at Cal, Braun coached the Bears to the second round of the NIT before losing to eventual champion Ohio State.

While at the University of California, two of his players earned Pac-10 Player of the Year honors – Ed Gray in 1997 and Sean Lampley in 2001 – while Leon Powe was the 2004 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year. Overall, Braun's players received All-Pac-10 status nine times, Pac-10 All-Freshman notice on seven occasions and Pac-10 All-Academic accolades 15 times.

As a result of his success, not only at Cal, but during previous head coaching stops at Eastern Michigan and Siena Heights, Braun heads into his third season at Rice ranked 15<sup>th</sup> among all active Division I coaches with his 570 career victories. He ranks in the Top 50 on the NCAA's list of all-time winningest Division I men's basketball coaches by victories (No. 46).

Braun was 219-154 in his 12 seasons at Cal.

The 1997 Pac-10 Coach of the Year and a finalist for the 2003 Naismith National Coach of the Year, Braun has posted a 562-411 career record. He finished his Cal career second only to Nibs Price (1925-54, 449-294) in both longevity and wins and his Cal winning percentage of .587 was the best at the school since Hall of Famer Pete Newell guided the Bears to a 119-44 mark from 1955-60.

Generally regarded as one of college basketball's top teachers and strategists, Braun brought his energetic style of coaching to Cal in September, 1996. During his initial season, Braun took a team that was predicted to finish in the conference's lower half, molded it into one that tied for second in the league and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 with tournament victories over Princeton and Villanova. In addition, the 23-9 overall mark gave Braun a school record for most wins by a Bear coach in his first year with the program.

In 1998-99, Braun's club became the first Cal team ever to beat three Top 10 schools in the same season with victories over North Carolina, UCLA and Arizona during the course of the year. Then, after earning a bid to the NIT, the Bears went on a 5-0 run to capture the title – Cal's first postseason tournament championship since the Bears won the 1959 NCAA crown. Cal finished the 1998-99 campaign with a 22-11 record.

A year later, Braun took a freshman-dominated squad back to the postseason as the Bears reached the quarterfinals of the NIT. On Jan. 15, 2000, he picked up his 400th career victory with a 71-65 win at Oregon State. In 2000-01, the Bears returned to the NCAA Tournament and finished with a 20-11 record. Lampley – Braun's first recruit at Cal – became the school's all-time leading scorer late in his senior campaign with 1,776 points.

The Bears again won 23 games and tied for second in the Pac-10 race in 2001-02. Cal reached the semifinals of the conference tournament by defeating UCLA in the opening round and earned a No. 6 seed in the NCAA playoffs, where the Bears toppled Penn before falling to Pittsburgh.

In 2003, Cal reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament behind All-Pac-10 forwards Joe Shipp and Amit Tamir. Shipp ended his career holding third place on the Bears' all-time scoring list, while teammate Brian Wethers finished in the No. 15 position.

Behind tournament MVP Leon Powe, Cal defeated USC and Oregon to reach the Pac-10 Tournament final for the first time ever in 2006. The Bears then earned a No. 7 regional seed in the NCAA Tournament and finished the year with a 20-11 mark. On Nov. 21, 2005, Cal defeated Long Beach State, 88-69, to give Braun his 500th career win.

Braun's 2007 Cal team fought off injuries to a pair of key post players to reach the semifinals of the Pac-10 Tournament for the fourth time in six years. The Bears upset top-seed and fourth-ranked UCLA, 76-69, in overtime in the quarterfinals, and freshman Ryan Anderson was voted to the all-tournament team.

Twice during his final season at Cal, the Bears defeated nationally-ranked opponents, including a 69-64 upset on the road of ninth-ranked Washington State. Sophomore Ryan Anderson was an all Pac-10 selection.

At age 56, Braun already has 33 years of experience as a head coach, including 11 highly-successful years at Eastern Michigan, where he guided the Eagles to four postseason berths, including three NCAA appearances. During his tenure there, Braun accumulated a record of 185-132, averaging almost 18 wins per season, and was named Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year three times.

In addition, Braun coached at Siena Heights College for eight years and took the NAIA school to a 148-103 record and five postseason tournaments.

Braun's players proved to be successful both on the court and in the classroom, with Golden Bears earning Pac-10 All-Academic recognition 15 times under his direction. In 2001, three players – Morgan Lingle, Dennis Gates and Ryan Forehan-Kelly – were first-team selections, while Donte Smith was an honorable mention pick which gave Cal more than twice as many all-academic members as any other school in the conference. The Bears had at least one all-academic pick in each of Braun's last eight years heading the program.

Braun began his career as an assistant coach at Park High School in Racine, Wis. Within two years, he accepted the head coaching job at Siena Heights. After an 8-21 debut season in 1977-78, his teams posted a 140-82 record over the next seven years, including four 20-win campaigns. His squads qualified for National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) postseason tournaments five times. During his time at Siena Heights, he not only coached, but also taught English at the school. In the summer of 1999, Braun was inducted into the first class of the Siena Heights Athletic Hall of Fame.

Braun accepted the position of associate head coach at Eastern Michigan prior to the start of the 1985-86 season, but midway through the year, on Jan. 15, 1986, he was elevated to interim head coach. Success came quickly and within two years he had the Eagles in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

In 1989, Braun served as head coach of the U.S. men's basket-ball team at the Maccabiah Games. He took an internationally-inexperienced squad to the championship round before bowing to the host Israeli team in the final.

During his career, Braun has coached 17 players who were drafted or went on to play in the NBA. Among the players on that list are Powe, who won an NBA World Championship with the Boston Celtics in 2008, Sean Marks of the New Orleans Hornets and the Orlando Magic's Ryan Anderson. Braun also coached Tony Gonzalez who has gone on to an All-Pro career in the NFL playing for the Kansas City Chiefs and now the Atlanta Falcons. While at Eastern Michigan, he coached both Grant Long and Earl Boykins.

Braun is also on the short list of nine NCAA coaches who have had four or more former assistants who are now Division I coaches. Braun is tied for second on the list with Connecticut's Jim Calhoun., Kentucky's John Calipari and Louisville's Rick Pitino. All four coaches have six former assistants now serving as head coaches at the Division I level. Arizona State's Herb Sendek has eight former assistants currently serving as head coaches.

Former assistant coaches on Braun staffs who are now Division I head coaches include Akron's Keith Dambrot; Murray State's Billy Kennedy; San Jose State's George Nessman; New Orleans' Joe Pasternack; Eastern Michigan's Charles E. Ramsey and Cleveland State's Gary Waters.

A native of Chicago, Braun graduated from New Trier High School, where he starred in both basketball and baseball. He went on to play one year of basketball at the University of Wisconsin-La-Crosse before he transferred to the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He earned a teaching degree in English in June of 1975 with a minor in African-American Studies. Five years later, he earned his master's degree in guidance and counseling from Siena Heights.

Braun and wife Jessica welcomed the arrival of their son, Julius 2).

Associate Head Coach Alma Mater | San Francisco State, 1982 Louis Reynaud

As the Associate Head Coach for Rice Basketball, Louis Reynaud begins his third season as one of the country's most respected and accomplished assistant coaches.

During his first year at Rice, Reynaud helped build the foundation for a rise to the top of Conference USA. The program made immediate strides as the Owls more than tripled their total victories from the previous season.

Reynaud helped Rice sign a recruiting class that both ESPN. com and Rivals.com recognized as one of the Top 10 among midmajor universities. Academically, Rice had six members of the squad

named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league member.

Reynaud joined the Rice staff from the University of California where he worked for 11 seasons on Ben Braun's staff including the last six seasons as Associate Head Coach. In his 11 seasons at Cal, the Golden Bears advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times as well as appeared in three NIT Tournaments, winning the 1999 NIT Championship.

Reynaud helped develop nine future professional players at Cal including current NBA standouts Leon Powe (Cleveland Cavaliers), Francisco Elson (Milwaukee Bucks) and Ryan Anderson (New Jersey Nets).

Prior to joining the University of California staff, Reynaud compiled an 84-31 record as the head basketball coach at De La Salle High School. He led the school to league titles in 1994 and 1996 and was twice named the Bay Valley Athletic League Coach of the Year. Reynaud's 1996 team captured the Division I NorCal championship and finished second in the state, earning a No. 1 ranking in the Bay Area for the first time in school history.

Reynaud's first head coaching position was at St. Patrick-St. Vincent High School in Vallejo, Calif., from 1990-93. In three seasons the school was 69-39, posted three, 20-win seasons and captured one Sac-Joaquin Sectional title. From 1986-90, Reynaud served as assistant varsity basketball coach at De La Salle High School. In addition to his coaching experience, Reynaud served as Dean of Students at both St. Patrick-St. Vincent and De La Salle High Schools.

In 1997, Reynaud was selected as head coach of the West Squad at the Magic Johnson Round Ball Classic for high school All-Americans and he directed the prestigious ABCD summer camp for five years.

As a high school player, Reynaud was a standout at Archbishop Riordan High School in San Francisco and played for the late Lyle Newcomer at Skyline College in San Bruno, Calif.

Reynaud received his bachelor's degree from San Francisco State in 1982 and a master's degree in health/physical education from Saint Mary's College in 1995. Reynaud has one daughter, Lauren (20).

Mike Roberts

Mike Roberts is in his third season as an assistant coach on the Rice staff. He previously was member of Ben Braun's staff at the University of California the previous two years.

At Rice, Roberts has played a role in the Owls' building a foundation for the future. As a member of the coaching staff, he helped the Owls sign a recruiting class that both ESPN.com and Rivals.com recognized as one of the Top 10 among mid-major universities.

Off the court, Rice had an unprecedented six student-athletes named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll his first season and four more selections following the 2009-10 season. Rice

has also had three selections to the Conference USA All-Academic Team over the past two years.

During Roberts' first season on South Main, Rice more than tripled its win total from the previous year.

At Cal, Roberts served as the video coordinator for the 2006-07 season before assuming an assistant coach position for the 2007-08 seasons.

As an assistant coach on the Cal staff, Roberts was responsible for overseeing the team's academic program and recruiting as well as scouting and game preparation in addition to on-floor coaching. As video coordinator, Roberts was involved in game preparation, self scouting, game film breakdown and other administrative duties.

Prior to his two seasons in Berkeley, Roberts played at Indiana, graduating in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in history with a certificate in management, then served one season a graduate assistant coach at Texas Tech.

The Terre Haute, Ind., native helped the Hoosiers to three NCAA Tournaments, including a national runner-up finish in 2002, as well as one NIT appearance. A two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree and recipient of a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, he served as team captain as a senior in 2004-05.

At Texas Tech, Roberts aided the coaching staff in practices, supervised academic progress of the players and was an analyst for Texas Tech radio and television broadcasts. He also participated in the 2006 ESPN production "Knight School," in which the Texas Tech

coaching staff evaluated 16 walk-ons who vied for one spot on the Red Raiders' roster.

In addition to receiving bachelor's degree from Indiana in 2005, Roberts received a master's degree in interdisciplinary studies from Texas Tech in 2006.

Roberts and his wife, Janet, have a son, Paxton (1).

### Marco Morcos

After two seasons in an administrative role, Marco Morcos begins his first season as an assistant coach for the Owls.

Morcos, a former high school coach, returns to a familiar setting of working with student-athletes on the court and has taken on a more extended role in recruiting.

Morcos was elevated to assistant coach after serving the previous two years as the Director of Basketball Operations. He served in a similar position at UAB during the 2007-08 season. He was part of a Blazer team which posted a 23-11 record and advanced to the second round of the National Invitational Tournament.

Prior to making the move to collegiate basketball, Morcos was a successful high school and AAU coach.

He was the head coach at LEAP Academy University Charter School in Camden, N.J., for three years (2004-07). LEAP compiled a 102-20 record during Morcos' three seasons. Beyond wins and losses, Morcos' teams had a 100 percent graduation rate from the college preparatory school and maintained better than a 3.0 team grade point average.

In just his second year, Morcos' team was 27-6 and earned the No. 1 seed to the NJSIAA South Jersey playoffs. LEAP would capture the South Jersey Sectional as well as win the Central Jersey championship. The team went on to finish as runners-up at the New Jersey state championship in 2006. Morcos' successful second year marked the fastest a coach had led a team to a state championship in New Jersey Scholastic history (two years).

Morcos' 2007 team posted a 25-7 record and was ranked No. 7 in South Jersey in the final regional rankings by the Courier-Post.

Additionally, Morcos was the head coach at Rise Academy where he led the team to a 31-8 record.

Morcos previously ran a nationally-competitive AAU program and was responsible for developing over 100 Division I and Division II players during his coaching career. He also coached at the Rise Basketball Northeast Regional All-Star Game.

His coaching experience also includes working as a counselor at the prestigious Reebok All-American Camp (RAAC).

Morcos saw action in 33 games during a two-year playing career for Rutgers-Camden.



### **Video Coordinator** Alma Mater | Central Michigan, 1999 **Mark Vick**

Mark Vick is in his third year as the video coordinator for the Rice basketball program. He joined the Rice staff after a four-year stint in a similar position at Oakland University.

Vick's responsibilities at Rice include creating comprehensive breakdowns of video and cutups for opponent scouting, assisting in the development of scouting reports as well as coordinating film exchange. Internally, he oversees filming and logging games, practices and individual workouts.

He also has extensive responsibilities in coordinating the Ben Braun Basketball Camps.

In addition to his video responsibilities while at Oakland University, Vick was the camp operations director of the program's basketball camps which grew to nearly 500 campers during his tenure. He also served as an administrative assistant, with a wide-range of responsibilities including game management, supervising and coordinating managerial staff, assisting with team travel and developing and leading community service activities.

Vick's prior basketball experience includes experience as both a head coach and assistant coach at the high school level. He also has a wealth of knowledge of the game with 15 years experience working collegiate basketball camps.

Prior to joining the Oakland basketball staff, Vick coached a season each at Smoky Mountain High School and Cherokee High School in North Carolina. He also spent time coaching a number of youth teams in the western North Carolina region.

Vick has served as a coach at summer camps held at Central Michigan University, University of Dayton, Michigan State University, University of Wisconsin and Western Carolina University.

Since 2004, he has also conducted the Mark Vick Championship Basketball Camps each summer in his hometown of Houghton Lake, Mich.

Vick graduated from Central Michigan in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in health fitness and promotion in preventive rehabilitation. As an undergraduate, he was a student manager for CMU's basketball team. He went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Florida State in 2002.

Scott McLafferty is in his fourth season on South Main and enters his second year as the Associate Director of Strength and Conditioning for the Rice athletic program. He joined the Owls' staff on March 5, 2007.

The Stillwater, Okla., native came to Rice from Louisiana Tech where he worked with the football, soccer and softball programs his first season before assuming duties as the men's basketball strength and conditioning coach his last two years.

McLafferty also served as a student assistant at Oklahoma State. McLafferty is a 2007 graduate of Louisiana Tech.

Dean Miller, M.S., A.T.C, enters his second year as a member of the Rice University athletic training staff. Among his responsibilities is coordinating the sports medicine needs of the men's basketball program.

Miller joins the Rice University staff from Diablo Valley College where he served as an assistant basketball coach and was responsible for strength and conditioning as well as nutrition for the team. Since the late 1970s, Miller has also been involved in athletic training for a variety of motorsports teams and drivers. He has been a part of 18 motorsports world championships.

During Miller's tenure at Diablo Valley College (1997-2009), the Vikings won eight conference championships and had 16 student-athletes go on to play for NCAA Division I programs.

Miller first became involved in motorsports in 1978 when he

served as athletic trainer and sports medicine consultant for Kenny Roberts, the first American to win the 500cc Road Racing World Championship (1978, 1979 & 1980). He served in the same capacity for Kenny Roberts, Jr., and Team Sazuki's World Grand Prix racing team from 1999-2007. The junior Roberts won the 500cc World Championship in 2000.

Miller's involvement in athletic training and sports medicine has also included serving as a consultant to teams and drivers involved in Grand Prix and AMA superbike motorcycle racing as well as Indy Car racing.

Prior to joining the staff at Diablo Valley College, Miller was on staff at De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. (1977-87 and 1989-97). During his tenure at De La Salle, he was the head athletic trainer, a part-time instructor and also served as an assistant basketball coach.

Miller is a 1976 graduate of California State University, Sacramento and received his M.S. in Physical Education Athletic Training from the University of Arizona in 1977. He has been a certified member of the National Athletic Trainers Association since 1977.

Miller also serves as Member Emeritus of the Board of Directors for Riders for Health Charity in Northampton, England, and is a member of the Sports Advisory Board for Advocare Nutrition.

## 2009-10 Rice Season Review

### **Storylines**

- ▶ Rice closed out the 2009-10 season by giving Tulsa, the host of the GMC Sierra Conference USA Championship, a run for its money during the first round of the league tournament. The Owls jumped out to a 41-26 lead at halftime before the Golden Hurricane came back in the second half, taking the lead for good with 5:28 to play. Tulsa advanced to the quarterfinals of the tournament with a 73-62 win over the Owls.
- ▶ Rice freshmen and sophomores accounted for 70.3 percent of the Owls' scoring production; 65.2 percent of rebounds and 75.4 percent of the team's assists.
- ▶ Rice had 229 steals during the season which is the third-most in school history. The 2003-04 Rice team had a school-record 275 steals and the 2002-03 squad had 244.
- ▶ After setting a school record with 218 three-point field goals during the 2008-09 season, this year's squad knocked down 164 treys which is ninth-most since the three-point line was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season.
- ▶ Rice loses only one senior who played during the 2009-10 season – Lawrence "Cliff" Ghoram. Ghoram averaged 8.1 points per game and his loss represents 13 percent of the

Owls' offense from the 2009-10 season. Ghoram scored over 800 career points while playing in 120 contests, which ties for third most in Rice history.

#### **Rookie Standards**

- ▶ The Rice tandem of **Tamir Jackson** and **Arsalan Kazemi** set several new freshman records during the 2009-10 season. The pair became the first Rice freshmen to lead the Owls in scoring or rebounding since **Michael Harris** back in 2002.
- ▶ Jackson was the team's leading scorer most of the season and finished the year scoring 334 points (10.8 pg).
- ▶ Jackson finished the season with 53 steals, breaking the former Rice freshman record of 48 set by **Elbert Darden** better than 30 years ago (1975-76). Kazemi was a steal shy of equaling Darden's 1976 total.
- ► Kazemi finished the year with 272 rebounds. With 12 rebounds at Houston the final week of the regular season he moved past **Michael Harris**, who formerly held the Rice freshman record with 248 set during the 2001-02 season.
- ► Kazemi's 272 total rebounds ranks as the ninth-best season total in school history.
  - ▶ With 26 blocks, Kazemi moves onto the all-time sea-

son list and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> with **Tony Barnett** who also had 26 blocks during the 1983-84 season. Barnett had 27 blocks as a senior during the 1984-85 season.

#### More on Kazemi

- ► Arsalan Kazemi capped his first season at Rice by being named to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team.
- ▶ During the 2009-10 season, Kazemi was featured on ESPN (College GameDay, Jan. 30) as well as online at Sports Illustrated's web site, si.com.
- ► Kazemi posted double-doubles in nine games during his freshman season including four straight during the heart of the conference schedule in mid-February.
- ► Kazemi was named Conference USA's Rookie of the Week following the Jan. 30<sup>th</sup> game against East Carolina. The recognition came after a 14-point, 14-rebound double-double in the Owls' road win.

#### **Fountain of Youth**

- ▶ With just four upperclassmen (one senior, three juniors) active on 2009-10 squad, Rice was one of the youngest teams in Conference USA.
  - ► Headlined by Tamir Jackson and Arsalan Kazemi, Ben

**Braun's** first early signing class received national recognition.

▶ Tamir Jackson (30.6 minutes per game) and Arsalan Kazemi (27.9 mpg) led Rice in playing time during the season. Sophomore **Connor Frizzelle** was third on the team in that statistics category at 27.6 mpg.

#### **Scoring & Shooting Trends**

- ▶ Rice shot 40.4 percent from the field for the season.
- ► The Owls shot better than 50 percent just once during the year (52.7 percent against Furman). The Owls shot 45 percent or better in five games during the season.
- ▶ Rice had just two, 20-point games during the season. **Trey Stanton** scored a season-high 23 points in the Owls' win over Furman early in the year. **Tamir Jackson** scored 22 points in the Owls' loss to East Carolina in late February.

#### **Free Throw Trends**

- ▶ The Owls struggled shooting free throws the final third of the season. Rice shot 64.7 percent from the line for the year but over the team's last 10 games the owls managed to make just 52.5 percent of their attempts.
- ▶ Rice freshmen Tamir Jackson and Arsalan Kazemi went to the free throw line more than any other players on

the team during the year but combined to make 191-of-301 attempts (63.4 percent).

- ▶ Not many players on the Rice roster were spared from slipping numbers at the line. Rice sophomore Connor Frizzelle led Conference USA with an 86.6 free throw percentage during the 2008-09 season as a freshman. For the 2009-10 season, Frizzelle's numbers slipped but his .768 percentage was still very respectable.
- ▶ Rice had just one player shoot over 80 percent at the free throw line. Sophomore **Lucas Kuipers** was 29-of-35 at the line (.829).

#### **More Trends: Rebounding**

- ▶ Rice finished the season with +1 rebounds ... not a +1 or even a +0.1 rebounding margin but 1097 total rebounds to opponents' 1096.
- ➤ Through the first nine games of the Conference USA schedule, Rice outrebounded eight league opponents. East Carolina outrebounded the Owls 40-39 in the teams' first meeting.
- ▶ The Owls lead C-USA in rebounding margin in conference games by as much as a +5.9 margin during the first half of league play. Rice finished with a +1.7 rebounding margin against league opponents which ranked sixth in C-USA.

▶ Behind **Arsalan Kazemi's** 9.1 rebounding margin, Rice had no player average better than five rebounds. **Trey Stanton** was second on the squad with a 4.5 rebounding average.

#### **Stout Finish**

- ► Over the last four games of his junior season in 2009-10, Rice forward **Suleiman Braimoh** averaged 11 points and 8.2 rebounds.
- ▶ In addition to 12 points and seven rebounds in the Owls' loss to Tulsa at the Conference USA Championship, he also equaled a career high with three blocks.
- ▶ Braimoh posted new career highs with 14 points and 13 rebounds in the Owls' road loss at Houston the final week of the regular season.
- ▶ Braimoh averaged 4.5 points and 3.8 rebounds for the year.

#### **Lone Senior**

- ▶ With the loss of **Cory Pflieger** to a torn ACL during the preseason, **Lawrence "Cliff" Ghoram** was the lone senior on the 2009-10 season
- ► Ghoram played in 120 career games, tying for the third most in school history.

- ► For the season, Ghoram averaged 8.1 points and 3.7 rebounds.
- ▶ Ghoram scored 814 career points and had 363 career rebounds. He also tallied 120 career assists, 75 steals and 26 blocks.

#### **A Little Thievery**

- ► Rice forced a season-high 23 Santa Clara turnovers during nonconference play, scoring 27 points off the miscues.
- ▶ Led by freshmen Tamir Jackson and Arsalan Kazemi, the Owls had 17 steals in the game. Jackson finished with five while Kazemi had four.
- ▶ Prior to playing host to Santa Clara, the previous time a Rice team had 15+ steals in a game came in an 81-76 win over Louisiana-Lafayette on Feb. 21, 2004. The Owls had 15 steals in the win over the Ragin' Cajuns.

- ► For the 2009-10 season, Rice had 229 steals which ranks third-most in school history.

#### The First 72

- ▶ Rice opened with three games in as many days for only the third time in school history. Each time the Owls swept all three games.
- ▶ It was the first time the Owls opened at home with three games as the squad defeated Sacramento State (81-51), South Alabama (71-69) and Houston Baptist (60-46) and win the Rice Basketball Challenge presented by Holiday Inn Hotel & Suites Medical Center.
- ▶ Rice opened the 2003-04 season with three straight wins at the BP Top of the World Classic played in Fairbanks, Alaska, Nov. 21-23. The Owls posted a 66-49 win over Washington State in the championship game en route to a 22-11 season.
- ▶ The 1934-35 squad also opened its season with games on three straight days (two at home against Texas A&M-Kingsville followed by a road game at Sam Houston State). That Rice team won its first nine contests en route to a 20-3 record and a Southwest Conference Championship.

#### **Recapping the Rice Basketball Challenge**

- ► Sweeping three games the opening weekend of the season gave the Owls only their fifth tournament championship in which multiple games were played.
  - ► Rice's **Connor Frizzelle** was named the tournament's

Most Valuable Player. **Tamir Jackson** led the all-tournament team which included South Alabama's Tim Williams and Martino Brock along with Sacramento State's John Dickson and Houston Baptist's Mario Flaherty.

- ► Frizzelle averaged 14.7 points per game over the tournament. He made 10-of-14 three-point attempts over the course of the three games.
- ▶ Jackson averaged 10.3 points during the three-game tournament.

#### **Scholar-Athletes**

- ▶ Rice is one of only two Conference USA teams to have a player named to the league's all-academic team each of the past four seasons. Sophomores Connor Frizzelle and Lucas Kuipers were both named to the 2010 Conference USA All-Academic Team.
- ▶ Kuipers became the second consecutive Rice basketball student-athlete to be named a C-USA Scholar Athlete of the Year. A year earlier Aleks Perka was named a C-USA Scholar Athlete of the Year. The awards are annually presented to the top student-athlete in each conference-sponsored sport. The awards are based on academic achievement (GPA), athletic achievement and service.



- ▶ Capped by a three-pointer by 7-0 forward Hassan Whiteside, the Thundering Herd utilized an 8-2 run to extend an early lead out to 23-12 with 5:41 to play in the first half. ### Rice vs. Houston Game Notes

- ▶ The nation's leading scorer, Aubrey Coleman, helped spark a late rally that saw Houston extend a one-point lead to 11 points in a matter of a few minutes. With the Cougars leading 67-65 with 3:39 to play, Coleman scored a fast-break layup and the next time down the floor connected on a three-pointer to give UH a 72-65 lead. A Rice turnover led to a Zamal Nixon fastbreak dunk. Another turnover led to another fastbreak basket by Nixon and the Cougars' lead was 78-65 with 1:24 to play.
- After trailing by as many as 15 points early in the second half, Rice clawed its way back into the game. The Owls were down 60-46 before scoring 11 straight points culminating in an Arsalan Kazemi fastbreak dunk. Kazemi had scored three of the Owls' four baskets at the end of the run but went to the bench right after the dunk when he was whistled for his fourth personal foul at the other end of the floor.
- Both Braimoh and Kazemi posted double-doubles in the loss. Braimoh registered career highs with 14 points and 13 rebounds. Kazemi scored 11 points and had 12 rebounds en route to his ninth career double-double. The game marked the first time since Feb. 15, 2006 that the Owls had two, double-doubles in the same game. Morris Almond and J.R. Harrison did it against East Carolina.
- With his 12 boards, Kazemi set a new Rice freshman season record for rebounds. Through the Houston game, he had 251 rebounds, passing the former mark of 248 set by Michael Harris during the 2001-02 season.
- Tamir Jackson's three steals against UH gave him 51 or the season as he past Elbert Dardan (49 steals during the 1975-76 season) to grab another Rice freshman record. Through 29 games, Jackson was tied with Adam Peakes for the most steals in a season
- ▶ Rice played without juniors Bryan Beasely and Trey Stanton who were suspended for breaking team policies.
