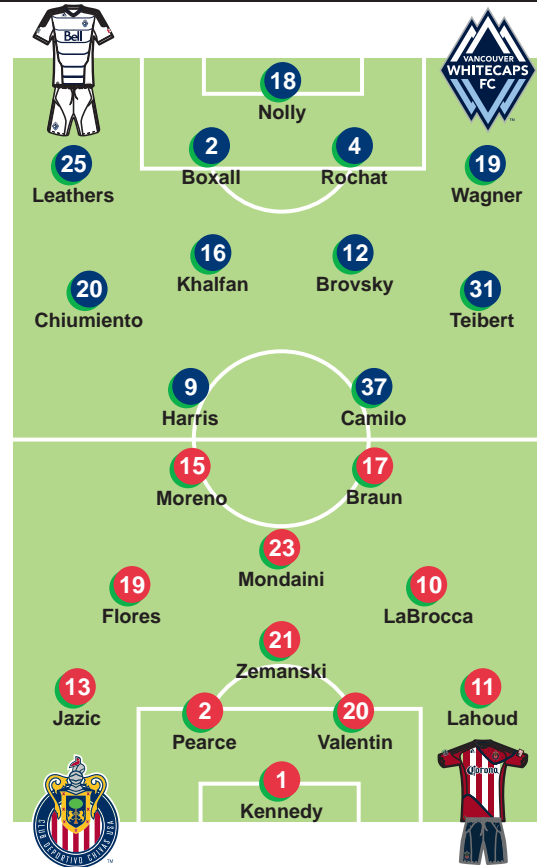

VANCOUVER WHITECAPS FC

Vancouver Whitecaps FC saw their winless streak extended to four games, falling 3-1 to the Houston Dynamo on Sunday evening at Robertson Stadium. Whitecaps FC have 5 points from 5 matches, sitting in a fourth-place tie in the Western Conference to start the week.

LAST MATCH

- The game burst into life late in the first half with three goals in a five-minute span. The Dynamo took the lead in the 37th minute when Cam Weaver pounced on a Brad Davis corner kick that Bobby Boswell had flicked on.
- Whitecaps FC pulled even barely a minute later. Winger Davide Chiumiento slipped a ball through to Camilo after spinning away from the Dynamo defense. The Brazilian striker put a point blank shot over Houston goalkeeper Tally Hall's right shoulder.
- Boswell restored the Dynamo margin in the 42nd minute. After a corner kick was cleared, Danny Cruz's cross found the center back behind the pulled-up Vancouver back line and he knocked a shot past 'keeper Jay Nolly.
- Houston finished off the match in the 76th minute. Rookie Will Bruin beat Nolly to a through ball as the 'keeper raced off his line, skipping around him and sliding the ball into the back of the net for his first professional goal.
- Whitecaps FC head coach Teitur Thordarson made three changes to the team that drew 1-1 with the New England Revolution at Empire Field. Jay DeMerit came into the back four and Davide Chiumiento and Jeb Brovsky into the midfield, with Gershon Koffie suspended and Wes Knight and Terry Dunfield injured.

TEAM NEWS

- Camilo pulled into the Whitecaps FC team lead with his goal at Houston. Camilo joined Eric Hassli with three goals for the season; the Swiss striker was suspended after receiving his second red card of the year.
- After missing three consecutive games, U.S. international center back Jay DeMerit was able to return to the lineup in Houston. But he played only the first half, reaggravating a groin injury suffered on national team duty.
- "I went through three days of full training with absolutely no issues and I felt great," DeMerit said to The Province. "Hopefully, one day, you get through 90 minutes. It didn't happen, unfortunately, and I'm obviously very disappointed because on the second goal I feel it again and leave guys onside and they go and score. At that point, you put your hand up."
- Omar Salgado, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2011 SuperDraft, made his professional debut for Whitecaps FC, coming on in the 84th minute of the 3-1 loss at Houston. Salgado, from El Paso, Texas, saw his first action in front of a number of family and friends.

- "I think Omar did well when he came on," said Thordarson. "He didn't have too many goal situations, but he gets into the team and works very hard."
- Alain Rochat started a third different position for Whitecaps FC, beginning the game in central midfield – a position he said he had not played since last year with Swiss outfit FC Zürich. With DeMerit's departure, Rochat moved back to central defense; he's also played left back.
- "It was a hard game and it was like they were one step before us all the time," Rochat said. "When you are always running after the ball, it is not easy to create some chances."
- Center back Mouloud Akloul played the final 11 minutes to make his MLS debut for Vancouver. He broke his ankle last season playing for the USSF D-II Whitecaps and was re-signed a couple of weeks ago.
- Rookie Jeb Brovsky was given the start in central midfield ahead of Kevin Harmse, with concerns about the latter's lack of fitness after being signed after the start of the season.
- The 'Caps are happy to Hassli again available after suspension with their current injury crisis; Gershon Koffie, also suspended for the Houston match, is on international duty. "The situation is bad, that we can't get over these injuries," Thordarson said.

CHIVAS USA

Chivas USA gained a point for a second successive week, playing to a scoreless draw with the Columbus Crew on Saturday evening at The Home Depot Center. Chivas USA have 2 points from 4 games on the season, sitting in eighth place in the Western Conference.

LAST MATCH

- Each goalkeeper made two saves, saving the best for late in the match. In the 74th minute, Chivas USA goalkeeper Dan Kennedy tipped aside Eddie Gaven's breakaway chance at full stretch.
- Chivas USA nearly took the lead five minutes later, but Crew goalkeeper William Hesmer was well positioned to stop Nick LaBrocca free chance. Hesmer later stopped a last-minute header from Chivas defender Heath Pearce.
- Chivas USA head coach Robin Fraser made one change to the team that played to a 1-1 draw with Toronto FC at BMO Field. Zarek Valentin came back from international duty into the back four for Andrew Boyens.

TEAM NEWS

- After opening the season with back-to-back losses, Chivas USA have rebounded with back-to-back draws and started the week ahead of the Portland Timbers in the Western Conference.
- "We feel like at times we've been good enough to win games and probably let a few games get away from us," coach Robin Fraser said. "Tonight, we probably could have stolen the game, or they could have stolen the game. I felt like maybe we weren't as aggressive as we needed to be, and at the end, maybe a draw is a fair result."
- Making his second start of the season, Dan Kennedy recorded the shutout in Chivas USA's scoreless draw with Columbus. It was Kennedy's first shutout since Oct. 11, 2008.
- "A shutout's good," said midfielder Nick LaBrocca. "That's definitely something we wanted to get out of this game. That's No. 1. Obviously, with a win, but you've got to start somewhere, I guess, and a shutout's huge. Something to definitely build on."
- The two shutouts have come since Kennedy took over for Zach Thornton between the posts, after the veteran of the MLS inaugural season conceded four goals in the opening two games.
- "He's had a run of games because he's been pretty good, so would I say that he's No. 1? At the moment yes, because he's the one that's starting, but I think there is a healthy competition between goalkeepers right now," Fraser said.
- Recently returned from international duty with the U.S. U-20 national team, Zarek Valentin was inserted directly into central defense.
- "As a young defender, it's on the job training and you've got to learn very quickly," Fraser said. "And there were a lot of lessons to be learned from this match, some that he picked up on and some that he didn't."
- Michael Lahoud again reprised his role at right back after making his first start of the season, March 26 vs. Colorado, in a holding midfield role. "I think he's tailor-made to be an outside back," Fraser said to ESPNLosAngeles.com.

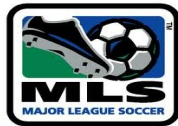

MATCH NOTES

- This is the **first ever competitive match between Whitecaps FC and Chivas USA**. The two sides did meet in preseason in Casa Grande, Arizona, on February 18, with Chivas winning 1-0 on a last-minute strike by Jesús Padilla (who did not make their roster).
- Whitecaps FC's **next encounter with Chivas USA** is Wednesday, June 1 at The Home Depot Center in Carson, California.
- Vancouver have a record of **8-14-8 against MLS opposition** in all competitions and friendlies dating back to 1998.

WHITECAPS FC NOTES

- Whitecaps FC are **undefeated at home** (1-0-2), but winless on the road (0-2-0).
- Against Sporting Kansas City, Whitecaps FC became the fourth team in MLS history to gain a point after trailing by three or more goals. It matched the **largest comeback from a deficit in MLS history**.
- Whitecaps FC are only the **third MLS expansion team to win their inaugural league match**. The others were Chicago in 1998 (finished 20-12 en route to an MLS Cup title) and Seattle in 2009 (12-7-11).
- Designated Player signing and forward **#29 Eric Hassli is available to play** after serving his second one-game suspension of the season. Hassli scored a goal and received two yellow cards while playing just 11 minutes last Wednesday against New England Revolution in a 1-1 draw. He has 3G 0A in just 3GP, and has scored in every Whitecaps FC home game in which he has played.
- The New England match was the first time Whitecaps FC had been **reduced to nine men** since a June 12, 2009 home match in USL-1 against Miami FC Blues, in which Charles Gbeke and Wesley Charles were both dismissed late in the game.
- Midfielder **#9 Davide Chiumiento leads the league in assists**. He has 0G 4A in 3GP and 156 minutes. He has averaged an assist every 39 minutes in MLS to date.
- Midfielder **Gershon Koffie is away with Ghana's U-20 national team** in preparation for the 2011 African Youth Championship in Johannesburg, South Africa. He will also miss Vancouver's match next Saturday at home to FC Dallas.
- Forward **#37 Camilo leads Whitecaps FC in scoring** with 3G 1A in 5GP. He was named MLS Player of the Week for week three after scoring 2G 1A in the 3-3 draw with Sporting Kansas City. Camilo is the first player in MLS history to score twice in stoppage time.
- Forward **#9 Atiba Harris played for Chivas USA** in 2008-09 scoring 5G 7A in 43GP. This season he has 2G 3A in 5GP and is three goals away from 20 in his MLS career.
- Defender and captain **#6 Jay DeMerit** is still struggling with a groin injury he suffered playing for the US national team in a 0-1 loss to Paraguay in Nashville, Tennessee.
- Winger **#31 Russell Teibert has rejoined the club from international duty** and played the second half in the 3-1 loss in Houston last Sunday. He was with Canada's U-20 squad at the 2011 CONCACAF U-20 Championships in Guatemala, where Canada failed to qualify for the FIFA U-20 World Cup, losing to Mexico and Costa Rica.
- 17-year-old forward **#17 Omar Salgado** was in the youth system at Mexico's Chivas Guadalajara. He made his MLS debut in Houston last Sunday, playing the final seven minutes. He had been away with the USA U-20 squad at the 2011 CONCACAF U-20 Championships where the US failed to qualify for the FIFA U-20 World Cup, losing to hosts Guatemala in the quarter-finals. Salgado, top pick in the 2011 MLS SuperDraft, was recently cleared by FIFA to play for Whitecaps FC this season without having to wait until he turns 18.
- Goalkeeper **Jay Nolly** is five shots away from facing 100 shots on goal in his MLS career. In Vancouver's last home game, he surpassed 10,000 minutes in his Whitecaps FC career and now sits at 10,157. Nolly is second in career minutes by a Vancouver goalkeeper, behind Paul Dolan's 19,913.
- Defender **#25 Jonathan Leathers** is 50 minutes away from reaching 3,000 in his MLS career. He and defender **#4 Alain Rochat** have played every minute this season (450) for Whitecaps FC.
- Defender/midfielder **#32 Kevin Harmse** is 79 minutes away from reaching 3,000 in his Whitecaps FC career. He was with Chivas USA in 2009, but did not see action.
- Midfielder **#15 Phillipe Davies** is 14 minutes away from reaching 2,000 in his Whitecaps FC career.
- Forward **#23 Tan Long** became the first Chinese-born player to appear in MLS history when he subbed in at 88' in Philadelphia.

CHIVAS NOTES

- **Club Deportivo Chivas USA** are an offshoot of Mexican giants Club Deportivo (Chivas) Guadalajara. They share The Home Depot Center with Western Conference rivals LA Galaxy.
- This is the seventh MLS season for Chivas USA. Robin Fraser is the team's sixth head coach. The team is looking for its first win of the season.
- Halifax, Nova Scotia, native and defender **#13 Ante Jazic** faced Whitecaps FC in exhibition play in 2007-08 while with LA Galaxy.
- Midfielder **#10 Nick LaBrocca** previously faced Whitecaps FC in the Nutrilite Canadian Championships while with Toronto FC.
- Goalkeeper **Dan Kennedy** played against Whitecaps FC in USL-1 while with Puerto Rico Islanders in 2005-06.
- Midfielder **#9 Simon Elliott** and defender **#2 Andrew Boyens** are teammates of Whitecaps FC defender **#2 Michael Boxall** on the **New Zealand national team**. Boxall subbed in for Boyens in a recent friendly against China.
- Midfielder **#59 Bryan de la Fuente** is a teammate on the US U-20 team of Whitecaps FC forward **#17 Omar Salgado**.
- Defender **#3 Heath Pearce** was a teammate last year of Whitecaps FC forward **#9 Atiba Harris** at FC Dallas.

ABOUT WHITECAPS FC



- This is Vancouver's 36th season of professional soccer, and 25th consecutive season. Whitecaps FC are the **longest running pro soccer club in US and Canadian history**.
- Whitecaps FC are the 17th team admitted to **MLS**. This is the league's 16th season, having begun play in 1996, and it now has 18 teams. When Vancouver joined the NASL in 1974, that league was starting its seventh season, and had 15 teams.
- Whitecaps FC are looking to **qualify for the playoffs for the 15th consecutive year**. Vancouver have reached the playoffs 31 times in 35 seasons, failing only in 1974, 1975, 1994, and 1996.
- **Last season** in the United States Soccer Federation Division-2, Vancouver finished with a record of 10W-5L-15T, good for fifth place. Whitecaps FC lost in the playoff semi-finals to Puerto Rico Islanders 2-0 on aggregate in extra time.
- Head coach **Teitur Thordarson** is a former Iceland international and has 20 years of pro European coaching experience, including eleven in Norway's top flight, and was head coach of Estonia's National Team (1996-99).
- The Pacific National Exhibition's **Empire Field** is a temporary stadium with 21,000-seats in its normal soccer configuration. It is located on the site of old Empire Stadium, which from 1974 to 1983 served as the original home of the Whitecaps when they played in the North American Soccer League. The Empire Field temporary stadium was constructed in just 111 days by Nussli Special Events (Canada) using a modular design developed in Switzerland and it officially opened on June 15, 2010. Its artificial playing surface is FIFA-approved 2-Star FieldTurf.

WHITECAPS FC PLAYER PROFILES

- Goalkeeper **#1 Joe Cannon** has over a decade's worth of MLS experience. Cannon joined Whitecaps FC after being selected in the eighth round (16th overall) of the 2010 MLS Expansion Draft. A two-time MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, the former San Jose Earthquakes shot-stopper played for the previous edition of the Earthquakes (now Houston Dynamo), Colorado Rapids, and L.A. Galaxy. This included an MLS Cup title with San Jose in 2001.
- Goalkeeper **#18 Jay Nolly** joined Whitecaps FC's MLS roster on Nov. 26, 2010, after three highly successful seasons at the North American second division level with the club. The native of Littleton, Colorado, has previous MLS experience with Real Salt Lake and D.C. United.
- Goalkeeper **#24 Brian Sylvestre** is just 18-years-old and is in his second season with the club. The native of Hollywood, Florida, arrived in Vancouver in February 2010, as a member of Whitecaps FC Residency program.
- Centre back **#2 Michael Boxall** joined Vancouver's MLS roster on March 17, 2011, after being the top pick in the 2011 MLS Supplemental Draft on January 18. He has represented New Zealand at the U-20, U-23, and senior international levels including three starts for the All Whites during the 2007 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Canada. The native of Auckland, New Zealand, enjoyed four seasons in NCAA Division I with the University of California, Santa Barbara.
- Defender **#3 Bilal Duckett** joined the 'Caps on March 15, 2011, after being the top pick in the third round (37th overall) of the 2011 MLS SuperDraft on January 13. A native of Peachtree City, Georgia, Duckett was the starting right fullback with the University of Notre Dame during his junior and senior year, where he was a Big East Conference Academic All-Star selection in 2009 and 2010.
- Defender **#4 Alain Rochat** joined Whitecaps FC from Swiss club FC Zürich on Jan. 21, 2011. The Canadian-born native of Yverdon-les-Bains, Switzerland, initially signed with Vancouver in Aug. 2010 before joining FC Zürich on loan.
- Defender **#6 Jay DeMerit** is a US international and played every match for his country at the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. DeMerit became Whitecaps FC's first MLS signing on Nov. 18, 2010. The native of Green Bay, Wisconsin, comes to Vancouver after six seasons with England's Watford FC, where he was team captain.
- Central midfielder **#7 Terry Dunfield** has represented Canada at both youth and senior international level. Dunfield joined Whitecaps FC's MLS roster on Dec. 10, 2010, after a successful second half of the season with his hometown club in the USSF D-2 Pro League. Dunfield has spent the majority of his career in England.
- Right fullback/midfielder **#8 Wes Knight** joined Whitecaps FC's MLS roster on Nov. 26, 2010, after two highly successful seasons at the North American second division level with the club. The native of Easley, South Carolina, was first spotted by Vancouver at the United Soccer Leagues Men's Player Showcase in Dec. 2008.
- Forward **#9 Atiba Harris** was a member of the 2010 MLS Cup finalists FC Dallas and joined Whitecaps FC after being selected in the second round (fourth overall) of the 2010 MLS Expansion Draft. A Saint Kitts and Nevis international, he has had spells in England, Spain and with MLS sides Real Salt Lake and Chivas USA.
- Central midfielder **#11 John Thorington** joined Whitecaps FC after being selected in the tenth round (20th overall) of the 2010 MLS Expansion Draft. Born in Johannesburg, South Africa, the native of Palos Verdes Peninsula, California, spent time with European clubs Manchester United FC and Bayer Leverkusen before embarking on a six-year career with MLS club Chicago Fire. He was named Whitecaps FC alternate captain on March 2, 2011.
- Defender/midfielder **#12 Jeb Brovsky** joined Whitecaps FC on March 15, 2011 after being selected as the top pick in the second round (19th overall) of this year's SuperDraft. The native of Lakewood, Colorado, had a stellar NCAA Division I career at the University of Notre Dame, where he was 2010 All-Big East Conference First Team in his senior year.
- Midfielder **#13 Michael Nanchoff** is an attack-minded Generation adidas midfielder that helped the University of Akron to the 2010 NCAA College Cup title. Nanchoff joined Whitecaps FC after being selected eighth overall in the 2011 MLS SuperDraft. A native of North Royalton, Ohio, Nanchoff was one of five Akron players to be selected among the first eight picks by MLS clubs in the 2011 SuperDraft.

- Centre back **#14 Greg Janicki** previously played in MLS with D.C. United. The native of Rochester, Michigan joined Whitecaps FC's MLS roster on Dec. 10, 2010, after a fine season with Vancouver at the North American second division level.
- Midfielder **#15 Philippe Davies** became Whitecaps FC's first-ever Major League Soccer homegrown player and Canadian signing on Nov. 26, 2010. A member of the Whitecaps FC Residency squad, the native of Longueuil, Quebec, has represented Canada at U-17, U-20, and U-23 levels and has fine abilities on set pieces.
- Midfielder **#16 Nizar Khalfan** joined Whitecaps FC's MLS roster on Feb. 9, 2011, becoming one of the first players to be signed to an international roster spot by the club. The native of Mtwara, Tanzania, spent one-and-a-half years with Vancouver at the North American second division level. He can play in the middle or on the right.
- Forward **#17 Omar Salgado** is a Generation adidas signing who joined Whitecaps FC after being selected first overall in the 2011 MLS SuperDraft. A dangerous striker who scored on his debut with the US U-20 national team as a 16-year-old, Salgado is a native of El Paso, Texas. He had previously trained with Vancouver's USSF D-2 Pro League squad in Aug. 2010.
- Defender/midfielder **#19 Blake Wagner** joined the Whitecaps FC roster on March 11, 2011, after spending the 2010 USSF D-2 Pro League season with Vancouver. A left-sided winger who can also play fullback, the native of Tampa, Florida, previously spent four seasons in MLS with FC Dallas.
- Midfielder/forward **#20 Davide Chiumiento** is a skilful playmaker, who can play on either flank or as an attacking midfielder. Chiumiento joined Whitecaps FC's MLS roster on Mar. 8, 2011, after spending three seasons in his native Switzerland with FC Luzern. Known for his skill, and playmaking abilities, Chiumiento has also played in the top-flight leagues of Italy and France.
- Midfielder **#22 Shea Salinas** is speedy and skilful winger who joined Whitecaps FC after being selected in the fourth round (eighth overall) of the 2010 MLS Expansion Draft. The native of Lubbock, Texas, has previous Major League Soccer experience with expansion clubs San Jose Earthquakes and Philadelphia Union. His full name is Robert O'Shea Salinas.
- Forward **#23 Long Tan** became the first Chinese-born player to sign in MLS when he joined the Whitecaps FC roster on March 11, 2011. The native of Dalian, China played last season for FC Tampa Bay in the USSF D-2 Pro League.
- Defender **#25 Jonathan Leathers** spent the past three MLS seasons with Kansas City Wizards (now Sporting Kansas City), Jonathan Leathers joined Whitecaps FC after being selected in the ninth round (18th overall) of the 2010 MLS Expansion Draft. The native of Athens, Georgia, is a former US U-23 Olympic team player.
- Central midfielder **#27 Alexandre Morfaw** signed March 17, 2011, after making six USSF D-2 Pro League appearances for the club last season. A Cameroon international at U-17, U-20, and U-23 level, he has previously played with Sweden's Bodens BK.
