NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL UNIVERSITY

Brief Description

This comprehensive university offers undergraduate and graduate programs leading to the baccalaureate and master's degrees in its Colleges of Liberal Arts, Science and Technology, and Behavioral and Social Sciences, the Schools of Business, Education, and Library and Information Sciences, as well as the first professional degree in the School of Law. The School of Graduate Studies coordinates graduate admissions and enrollment, and the University College coordinates Summer School, Extension, Distance Education, and Degree and Non-degree Credit programs and courses. Continuing its commitment to equal opportunity, North Carolina Central University (NCCU) vigorously recruits, and strives to enroll a larger number of white and other minority students.

History

Founded by Dr. James E. Shepard in 1909 and chartered as the National Religious Training School and Chautauqua to train community leaders. It operated as a private, nonsectarian institution from 1910 until 1923 when it became the state-supported Durham Normal School. In 1925, it became the nation's first state-supported liberal arts college for black people and was accredited as an "A" class institution in 1937. Renamed North Carolina Central University in 1969 and became a constituent institution of the University of North Carolina System in 1972.


