With the exception of engineering and agriculture, it is the state's principal center of graduate education and research at the doctoral levels. Its instructional programs are offered through two divisions. The division of academic affairs consists of eight colleges and schools. The division of health affairs includes five schools. There are 80 centers, institutes, and multidisciplinary programs. The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is committed to equality of opportunity. To further diversity, the University actively seeks to recruit and enroll a greater number of students of color.

History

Chartered in 1789. First state university in North America to admit students (1795). Together with North Carolina College for Women at Greensboro, now the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and North Carolina State College of Agriculture and Engineering at Raleigh, now North Carolina State University, became part of a multi-campus institution designated the University of North Carolina in 1931.

Location




