Dr. Martin Luther King gave his life on April 4, 1968, in Memphis while supporting striking city sanitation workers who were demanding recognition, respect and dignity. He stood with workers who were demanding their dream: The right to bargain collectively for a voice at work and a better life.

MARCH ROUTE



- 4:45 Assemble at 555 California, BofA (aka Bank of America Building) at the "Banker's Heart" statue
- 4:55 Local 2 contingent arrives at 555 California from the Palace (up Montgomery)
- 5:05 March leaves 555 California, marches straight on California to Sansome
- 5:10 Arrive at Chase Bank (California & Sansome)
- 5:20 Continue marching down California
- **5:25** Arrive at 101 California (Morgan Stanley / Deutsche Bank / et al)
- **5:45** Leave 101 California, toward Davis/Drumm Streets
- 5:50 Turn right on Sacramento and cross over to One Market
- 6:00 Continue down Market Street, picket at Federal Reserve Building
