connected by a cut-work balustrade. A cornice decorates the wide roof overhang. Four posts, one directly over each column, and cut-work railings trim the upper edge of the roof, forming a second-story balcony.

A second porch (or gallery) runs the entire length of the south wall of the rear (east) wing. Four posts support the roof, an extension of the southern slope of the wing's roof.

Roofs

Medium-pitched gable and saltbox roofs cover the main (west) portion and the rear (east) wing respectively. Roof shingles are of asphalt.

Chimneys

Three, single-stack, brick chimneys service "Maple Grove." They straddle the roof ridges of the main portion, one to each end, and the rear (east) wing, centered. Each is trimmed by parallel, projected, one or two-course moldings positioned five or two courses apart.

Decorative details

Decorative features include: 1) entrance portico (already described); 2) lintels and lugsills (rectangular-shaped, stone blocks painted white); and 3) cornices.

Boxed cornices with plain friezes trim the upper edge of the main portion's east and west facades and the north wall of the rear (east) wing. Boxed raking cornices with plain friezes and returns trim the three gable ends.

INTERIOR

Basement

A partial basement of three rooms is under the rear (east) wing and the northern half of the main portion. Brick and concrete floors are in the east two rooms and the west room respectively. Stone walls occur throughout. Access to the basement from the exterior is by a trap door in the west room and by a flight of stairs along the east wall of the easternmost room leading from the kitchen (not original). These rooms house the furnace and provide additional living space.

First floor

Four major rooms comprise the first floor: a parlor (north room, main portion), a bedroom (south room, main portion), a dining room (west room, east wing), and a kitchen (east room, east wing). A fifth room, a bathroom, is at the east end of the central hall which runs the depth of the west portion Form 10-300a (July 1969)

between the parlor and bedroom.

Painted plaster walls; exposed brick walls; and plaster-over-lathe walls occur in the parlor, hallway, and south bedroom; dining room and kitchen; and bathroom. Tongue-and-groove, wood (pine/red oak) flooring is used in all rooms. Linoleum tile and wall-to-wall carpeting cover the flooring in the kitchen and hallway. Classic-style mantels, doorway and window frames, and baseboards are of wood and occur in all rooms. Other wood features include chair rails, picture moldings, and dado panels (parlor and south bedroom) and wainscoting (kitchen). Wallpaper cornices and borders are used in the parlor, hallway, and south bedroom. Ceiling light fixtures (previously gas, now electrified) occur throughout.

A U-shaped stairway along the south wall of the central hallway provides access to the second floor.

Second floor

The second-floor room arrangement duplicates that of the first floor, west portion: a north and south bedroom separated by a central hallway. The finishing of this floor is similar to the first-floor bedroom: each room has a distinctive wallpaper cornice and a clothes press with double-leaf, threepanel doors.

Attic

Access to the attic, located over the rear (east) wing, is through an almostsquare door on the east wall of the second-floor, north bedroom.

ALTERATIONS

Restoration of "Maple Grove" to its current appearance was completed between November, 1968, and July, 1972. Although alterations were made during this renovation, much of the original integrity was maintained. Alterations include:

- 1) addition of interior access to the basement
- 2) lowering of basement floor to provide additional living space
- 3) removal of non-original, Victorian-style, three-bay veranda on the west facade and addition of a one-bay portico
- 4) removal of clothes press from parlor to first-floor bedroom
- 5) removal of upper half of fireplace mantel in first-floor
- bedroom to north wall of first-floor hallway 6) addition of shelves in parlor and first-floor bedroom
- 7) removal of plaster from rear (east) wing walls
- 8) rebuilding of deteriorated chimneys
- 9) replacement of original, worn flooring with in kind materials

An earlier alteration (1889) was the enclosing of the westernmost one-fifth of the rear (east) wing gallery to form a bathroom.

CONDITION

The house is in excellent condition, having been restored (November, 1968, to July, 1972).

SITE

"Maple Grove" is located in north St. Joseph, Missouri. The house, which faces west, overlooks the Great Western Savannah Railroad tracks and a light industrial/commercial business district. Architecturally insignificant, twentieth-century, residential neighborhoods surround the house on the south, east, and north.

Property features include: 1) an L-shaped, gravel drive and parking area on the south; 2) a small flower garden at the foot of the west entrance steps; 3) a reconstructed outbuilding, a smokehouse, to the east (1973); and 4) a brick patio (south of the east wing and east of the main portion) and walkways along the east and north facades of the rear (east) wing. An area of heavy tree cover is south-southeast of the house between the gravel parking area and the residences along the north side of Highland.

PRESENT STATUS

The continued existence of "Maple Grove" is currently assured through sympathetic ownership.

The house is, however, located in an area that could see major industrial development. The "Maple Grove" property is zoned "heavy industrial" (1968) as are surrounding properties (1968 and May, 1974). Many of these adjacent properties are owned by holding companies for the Chicago-Northwestern Railroad.²

in farming and stock raising. He raised hemp and tobacco and sold cattle, oxen, mules, and all kinds of supplies to pioneer emigrants moving west to Oregon, Washington, Texas, Montana, Colorado, and Utah, accumulating considerable wealth.¹¹ Dealing in real estate, he bought lands in the French Bottoms, on the Grand River, in Kansas, and within the city limits of St. Joseph.¹² Davis loaned much money, nearly \$50,000 in his lifetime, charging 6 - 7% interest at six months and holding property as mortgage.¹³ He served as an overseer and/or commissioner for the construction of several state roads between St. Joseph and Savannah, Missouri.¹⁴ Various parcels of personal property were donated or sold, at nominal fees, to the City of St Joseph for the purpose of providing locations for a school and a cemetery.¹⁵

The survey of Missouri's historic sites is based on the selection of sites as they relate to theme studies in Missouri history as outlined in the "Missouri State Historic Preservation Plan." "Maple Grove" (Joseph Davis House) is, therefore, being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places as 1) a significant example of a residential building in a typical Missouri, Classically derived style, in near original condition, in its locale, 2) as the probable earliest surviving brick house in St. Joseph, Missouri, and 3) as the home of one of St. Joseph's early pioneer families.
