INTERVIEW POLICY

The Media Relations Office will assist media personnel with interview requests of WCU student-athletes, coaches or administrators. To arrange interviews, please contact Daniel Hooker at least 24 hours in advance. Head Coach Bobby Moranda will be available for interviews prior to or following each practice. With prior notice, student-athletes will be available for interviews at that time as well. Unless special permission is granted well in advance, no interviews of student-athletes or coaches will be conducted on game days until a 10-minute cooling off period after the contest. Media members may attend practices after obtaining clearance through the media relations office. Media members are asked to refrain from contacting student-athletes at their home or dormitory and student-athletes' phone numbers will not be released by the WCU Department of Athletics. Out-of-town media may set up phone interviews to be conducted in the Athletics Department. Coach Bobby Moranda may be reached weekday mornings, however, it is asked that a specific interview time be scheduled.

WORKING CREDENTIALS

Newsprint and electronic media representatives planning to cover a baseball game at Western Carolina University are asked to request in written form (email or FAX) working credentials from WCU's Media Relations Office. Season passes will be issued to those who cover the Catamounts on a permanent basis. Press passes will be assigned by priority to WCU beat writers, beat writers of the opponents, metropolitan media filing for deadline and specialty publications. If time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, credentials can be picked up on game day (two hours prior to first pitch) at the Hennon Stadium ticket booth. Credentials will be issued only to those attending the game in a working capacity. Spouses, dates, children and other nonworkers will not be permitted in the press box.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Credentials for photographers will be issued on a first-come, first-serve basis with agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis receiving priority. Each photographer must pick up a photo pass prior to the game. Photographers will shoot from designated areas. Photographers wishing to take field-level photos must do so along the fence beyond the dugouts towards the outfield.

Head Coach Bobby Moranda 1st Season at WCU – Eastern Kentucky, 1986

Bobby Moranda was officially introduced as the 10th different head baseball coach at Western Carolina on July 19, 2007. The former Georgia Tech associate head and pitching coach brings nearly 21 years of coaching experience - 18 of which comes from schools in the Atlantic Coast Conference - to WCU.

"Bobby Moranda is one of the most dynamic coaches in college baseball. He has been an important part of successful programs at such

schools as Virginia, Wake Forest and Georgia Tech," Smith said. "His career includes numerous conference championships and appearances in the NCAA post-season play, including two College World Series berths. We are very excited that Bobby, his wife Pamela and their family will be part of Catamount Athletics and Western Carolina University."

Moranda comes to Cullowhee after having spent the past six seasons as the associate head and pitching coach at Georgia Tech where he also served a vital role in recruiting. Prior to his stint with the Yellow Jackets, he spent six years in a similar role at Wake Forest (1996-2001) and was an assistant coach at both Virginia (1990-95) and his alma mater, Eastern Kentucky (1987-89). Overall, Moranda has been a part of 10 conference championships and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances as either a player or a coach.

Under the tutelage of Moranda, a combined 12 pitchers have been selected in the top five rounds of the Major League Baseball Draft, including Matt Wieters, the fifth pick of the 2007 MLB Draft. In all, Moranda has coached 26 players who have been selected in the baseball draft, 20 of which were undrafted out of high school.

"I am extremely excited to be the head baseball coach at Western Carolina," said Moranda. "This is an awesome opportunity. Catamount baseball has a strong tradition and I am humbled and honored to now be a part of it. I look forward to embracing and continuing that tradition while raising the bar and elevating our baseball program."

During his six seasons at Georgia Tech, Moranda helped guide the Yellow Jackets to four, Top 10 finishes, three ACC titles and a pair of appearances in the NCAA College World Series. In 2002, Georgia Tech won a school-record 52 games en route to the CWS thanks in part to a pitching staff which set school records for "Fewest Walks per Nine Innings" (2.54 per 9 IP) and best "Walk to Strikeout" ratio (2.90 to 1) while boasting the best team earned run average since 1994 (4.06) and recorded its most shutouts (6) since 1997.

Amidst the run to the College World Series, Moranda's work with the Georgia Tech pitching staff was more evident than ever as the starting rotation of Kyle Bakker, Chris Goodman and Brian Burks combined for a 5-0 record and 0.77 ERA in NCAA regional play, while the entire staff combined for a 2.40 ERA and held opponents to a .208 batting average.

A year later, in 2003, Moranda's pitching staff helped Tech win the ACC championship by sweeping the first triple-header in conference history. The Yellow Jackets defeated North Carolina, Florida State and NC State on the final day of the tournament to capture the league title. Tech's 2003 pitching staff again ranked as one of the better staffs in recent GT history. The Yellow Jackets allowed the fewest hits per nine innings in the last 10 years, while posting the second best ERA in that span.

Three of Moranda's pitchers were selected in the first 20 rounds of the 2003 Major League draft - Goodman (5th round, Kansas City), Jeff Watchko (14th, Colorado) and Bakker (20th, Atlanta).

Prior to making the move to Georgia Tech in 2001, Moranda spent the previous six years at Wake Forest where he helped lead the Demon Deacons to three ACC Championships in his last four seasons. For his work, he was recognized by

Baseball America magazine in January 2001 as one of the country's "Rising Stars" in the college baseball coaching ranks.

After helping lay the groundwork for his first two seasons at Wake Forest as head assistant coach, Moranda helped the Demon Deacons to back-to-back ACC Championships in 1998 and 1999, and a third title in 2001. He helped build the Demon Deacon program into one of the best in the nation through his recruiting efforts and his on-field work with the Wake Forest pitching staff and defense. His pitchers tossed two no-hitters, the school's first in 60 years.

Moranda's recruiting classes were annually ranked among the nation's top classes, while his pitching staffs have attracted national attention from both collegiate baseball experts and professional scouts. His recruiting efforts at Wake Forest resulted in six Freshman All-Americans, including the 2001 National Freshman of the Year, the 2003 ACC Player of the Year, and the first collegiate draft pick in 2003. In 1998 his Demon Deacon pitching staff attracted national attention by throwing five complete games in the six-game ACC tournament. The feat helped Wake Forest win the 1998 ACC Championship and advance to the NCAA South I Regional, the Deacons' first NCAA appearance in 21 years. Moranda and the Deacons followed that 1998 performance with a five game sweep through the 1999 ACC Tournament, a trip to the NCAA Super Regional and a top-10 national ranking.

In his six years at Wake Forest, Moranda consistently developed outstanding pitchers. Ten of his pitchers were selected in the Major League Baseball amateur draft, including two players - Sean DePaula of the Indians and Mike MacDougal of the Royals, who reached the big leagues. Five pitchers earned All-America honors, while his pitchers earned all-ACC accolades seven times in his last five years.

His experience with top pitchers extends back to his days at the University of Virginia, where from 1990 to 1995 Moranda helped lay the groundwork as recruiting coordinator that led to the Cavaliers 1996 ACC Championship team.

During his six years in Charlottesville as Virginia's assistant coach and recruiting coordinator, the Cavs produced more professional players than the program's previous 100 years combined. Prior to Moranda's arrival, Virginia had never produced a first-round draft pick or a first-team All-American. By 1996, however, the Cavaliers had two first round picks and two first-team All-Americans. Moranda's star pupils and recruits were outfielder Brian Buchannan and pitcher Seth Greisinger. Buchannan has played with the San Diego Padres and Greisinger, who starred on the 1996 U.S. Olympic team, reached the Major Leagues in 1998 with the Detroit Tigers.

As a player, Moranda was an All-Region performer at Harper Community College in Illinois and was part of back-to-back championship teams before accepting a scholarship to Eastern Kentucky. The native of Palatine, Ill., batted .307 with 20 home runs and 86 RBI in two seasons at EKU, helping the Colonels win two consecutive Ohio Valley Conference championships and a top-30 national ranking. The Colonels made two consecutive NCAA Regional appearances during Moranda's playing career and were just two games away from advancing to Omaha for the College World Series in 1985.

After gaining his undergraduate degree in broadcast management, Moranda stayed at Eastern Kentucky as an assistant coach for three years while working toward his master's degree in recreation administration, and EKU made another NCAA Regional appearance during his tenure. During that time, Moranda also coached an American Legion summer team in Palatine that featured Major League catcher Todd Hundley.

Moranda and his wife Pamela have been married for 14 years. The couple has two children, daughter Taylor Jade, (9) and son Breyson Kade (5).

Assistant Coach Nick Mingione

1st Season at WCU - Embry-Riddle, 2000

Nick Mingione (pronounced MEN-gee-own), a former standout player and coach for Embry-Riddle, joined the Catamount baseball staff in early August, 2007. In addition to serving as the program's recruiting coordinator, he also works primarily with the Catamount hitters.

Mingione spent the past two seasons as volunteer assistant coach at Kentucky where he duties included working with the Wildcat outfield-

ers, as well as assisting in overall offensive instruction. In addition to his coaching duties, Mingione also coordinated UK baseball camps. Over the past two seasons, UK won 78 games, tied for the most wins in a two-year period in school history.

In his first year with the Wildcats, Mingione helped direct one of the greatest seasons in the history of Southeastern Conference baseball as the 2006 Kentucky baseball team completed a historic worst place-to-first place turnaround en route to claiming the school's first-ever SEC championship. En route to the title, the 'Cats won a school-record 44 games and set UK records in runs scored (500), walks drawn (337), HBP (80), sacrifice bunts (67) and sacrifice flies (34)

Last season in Lexington, the record-setting trend continued as the Mingione helped the Wildcats put together 19-straight wins at the start of the season to set the school benchmark for consecutive wins and best start (19-0) in 103 years of collegiate baseball. UK also finished atop the NCAA rankings for on-base percentage in '07.

All told, Kentucky set or reestablished 12 team school records and garnered 11 SEC weekly honors in Mingione's two seasons.

Born in Tarrytown, N.Y., the Cape Coral, Fla., native spent two years as an assistant coach at Embry Riddle. Prior to his return to his alma mater, he served as a volunteer assistant at Florida Gulf Coast University for six months.

During his five years as an assistant coach, Mingione helped direct four conference championships with an average of 46 wins per season, while compiling an impres-





sive 232-72 record. He has also made three trips to the NAIA World Series as a coach. His teams finished fifth in 2003, third in 2004, and second in 2005. In addition, Mingione has helped coach 18 players to All-America honors, six of which garnered first-team recognition.

"Nick (Mingione) is a solid baseball coach who has been a part of winning traditions," Moranda said. "He is great with people; that, with his energy and enthusiasm for the game made him an obvious choice to come to Cullowhee and to also be our recruiting coordinator."

An outfielder at Embry-Riddle for four years, Mingione lead the team to three runnerup finishes in the Florida Sun Conference and one conference championship. He played an integral part in the successes of the 1999 team, which was the first team in program history to make a national championship appearance.

As a freshman, he appeared in 45 of the Eagles' 47 games and posted a .324 batting average. After equally successful sophomore and junior campaigns, Mingione capped off his career with a .392 batting average, including 18 doubles and 32 stolen bases during his senior year. Mingione made a place for himself in the Embry-Riddle record books, finishing his career among the Eagles' top ten all-time in games played, runs scored, at-bats, doubles, hits and runs batted in.

In 1997, Mingione was the first recipient of the Kenneth J. Sliwa Memorial Scholarship, which recognized his accomplishments of academic commitment, tenacity, work ethic, enthusiasm, selflessness and hustle. He co-founded the Eagle-Legacy council, an organization comprised of former Embry-Riddle baseball players who seek to enhance the future of the Eagle baseball program.

Mingione graduated from Embry-Riddle in 2000 with a degree in Aerospace Studies and three minors in Business, Psychology, and Humanities. Mingione then returned to his alma mater, Mariner High School, where he served as the Assistant Dean of Students for two years. In addition, he took on the role of Assistant Coach to the football and baseball teams.

Assistant Coach David Haverstick

1st Season at WCU - Bethel (Ind.) College, 1997

David Haverstick (pronounced HAVE-erstick) joined the Catamount baseball staff in August of 2007. He comes to Cullowhee after having spent the past five seasons as an assistant coach at the Savannah College of Art and Design (SCAD) where he worked with the Bees' pitching staff. He assumes a similar role at Western Carolina, working with the Catamount pitching staff.

"Having a pitching background, I became aware of and impressed with David about five years ago. He is a hard-working individual who pitched with three different Major League organizations. I, along with many highly respected peers in the business, feel he is one of the top young pitching coaches whose instruction is on the cutting edge," said Moranda. "Kevin O'Sullivan (current Florida head coach, former Clemson pitching coach) and Derek Johnson (pitching coach at Vanderbilt), among several others, highly recommended David. With every phone call I made, his name kept coming to the top while trying to fill the position."

Under Haverstick's direction, the Bees had the college's first-ever NAIA National Player of the Week honor in 2006 when Eddie Anderson was named National Pitcher of the Week. Haverstick has coached three All-Florida Sun Conference performers, as well as two NAIA All-Region XIV standouts. The Bees' pitching corps finished the season with the second-best ERA (2.58) in the NAIA as well as the fifth-best opponents batting average (.224).

Last season, SCAD had three pitchers with ERAs below 2.37, with five different pitchers striking out 43-or-more batters. Haverstick worked with Ryan Pope, who led





the Bees with a 1.15 ERA in 102.0 innings pitched and was drafted in the third round by the New York Yankees in June's MLB Draft. Pope, who was SCAD's first-ever NAIA All-American, holds the distinction as being the highest player drafted out of the Florida Sun Conference.

Prior to moving to Savannah, Haverstick spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Dallas Baptist University. While at DBU, Haverstick guided the 2001 pitching staff to the lowest team ERA in over nine years. He helped lead the Patriots to NAIA Southwestern Regional and Mid-South Super Regional championships as well as a berth in the 2001 NAIA World Series. While at Dallas Baptist, he earned his Master's degree in organizational management.

Haverstick, who was a 16th-round draft selection by the Arizona Diamondbacks in 1997 and was in the system with the D'backs, Florida Marlins (1999) and Washington Nationals (2005), coached three players drafted by major league baseball teams as well as six All-Americans at DBU. The Patriots posted a 78-35 record in the two seasons Haverstick was on staff.

"Haverstick has coached a at couple of institutions with limited resources, but has always managed to produce talented players," concluded Moranda.

Haverstick, a graduate of Bethel (Ind.) College, earned his bachelor's degree in psychology while playing both basketball and baseball for the Pilots. He was an All-Mid-Central Conference selection in baseball as he helped the Pilots to the MCC baseball championship twice (1995,1997) and a berth in the NAIA Great Lakes Regional Tournament in 1997. On the hardwood, he was an NAIA All-American selection, highlighted by a NAIA Division II National Championship in 1997.

Grant Achilles

Volunteer Assistant Coach Wake Forest, 2005

In mid-August, Grant Achilles was added to WCU first-year head baseball coach Bobby Moranda's coaching staff as a volunteer assistant coach.

Achilles joins the Catamount coaching staff from Charlotte where he spent one season working with the 49er catchers,

assisting with the defense and hitters, as well as coaching first base. He worked with Kris Rochelle, who was named first team All-Atlantic-10 and to the all-tournament team at catcher, and was later drafted in the 22nd round of the Major League Baseball draft by the Detroit Tigers. With Achilles on staff, Charlotte enjoyed one of its most successful seasons in history finishing with a school-record 49 wins and ranked as high as 19th in the country. The 49ers advanced to the NCAA Baseball Regional in Columbia, S.C., breaking 11 school seasonal records.

A native of Lynchburg, Va., Achilles has coached in the summer wooden bat leagues. As an assistant coach in 2006, he helped the Thunder Bay Border Cats to a Northwoods League runner-up finish and last season was the associate head coach of the Wilmington Sharks of the Coastal Plains League (CPL) coaching defense and hitting, and third base. Two Sharks were named CPL All-Stars under the tutelage of Achilles.

An infielder by trade, the versatile Achilles played a host of positions with the Demon Deacons including first base, second base, right field and even worked out behind the plate. He appeared in 56 games during his five-year career - which included a medical redshirt in 2004 - making 19 starts. Achilles hit around .220 for his career with a pair of doubles and two home runs with 11 walks and a dozen RBI. A tri-captain of the 2006 squad, Achilles was best remembered at WFU for his hard-work ethic and team mentality.

Achilles was a first team All-Region and All-State selection as a junior and senior at Heritage High, helping to lead his team to a Region III Championship and berth in the Virginia state title game. He was also an Academic All-State selection for three years. During American Legion play, he batted .495 for Post 16 with 27 stolen bases in 2001, the same year he was named MVP of the World Youth Classic Championship.

Moranda is very familiar with the Achilles family as he recruited both Grant and his older brother, Todd, to Wake Forest while an assistant coach.





Bruce Johnson

Student Assistant Coach

Johnson is an undergraduate transfer at Western Carolina, coming to Cullowhee after spending one year playing baseball at South Atlantic Conference-member Newberry College in South Carolina and most recently at Pitt Community College in Greenville, N.C. As a true freshman at Newberry, Johnson hit just under .200 with a pair of doubles and a home run with eight RBI in 27 games.

Each of the past two summers, Johnson has helped coach the Morehead City Post 46 Hurricanes American Legion baseball team. Last year, the squad posted a team all-time best record of 29-5 which came on the heels of a 2006 American Legion State Championship and third-place finish in

the south regional in 2006.

A graduate of West Carteret High School in Morehead City, N.C., Johnson hit .440 during his senior year with five home runs and 38 RBI helping his squad to a final record of 22-4. He was a two-time, all-conference selection and earned All-State accolades as a senior. In the classroom, Johnson was a member of the WCHS National Honor Society and was awarded the school's Academic Achievement Award in 2004.

Phillip Grundy, who was inducteed into the WCU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2005, arguably was Western's best two-way player. Before leaving as a fourth-round pick after his junior year, Grundy posted a 24-16 record on the mound with a 3.09 ERA and struck out 263 batters in 294.1 innings. He ranks ninth on the WCU all-time ERA list, sixth in wins, fourth in strikeouts and third in innings pitched. In just two seasons at the plate, he had .335 career average with 27 home runs and 106 RBI in less than 100 games.




Jim Gudger (above)

Western's head coach from 1951-60; '63; winning 140 games. Gudger was also WCU's head basketball coach and is the program's winnngest coach with 311 victories.

Keith LeClair (right #23)

An outstanding player for WCU from 1985-88, he took over as the Cats' head coach in 1992 after Jack Leggett left to coach Clemson. LeClair won 229 games in six seasons at WCU with three SoCon Coach of the Year honors, six SoCon titles to his credit and four NCAA tournament berths.

The 1981 SoCon Coach of the Year held the reigns of the WCU baseball program longer than any other coach, lasting 13 seasons (1969-81). He won 215 games while coaching WCU greats like Keith Ebersole, Jerry Gaines, Wayne Tolleson, Rick Adair, Don Bright and Jerry Reed.



The university offers more than 120 majors and areas of concentration for undergraduates, and graduate students may choose from 51 areas of study at the master's level, as well as pursue doctoral studies in education.

Western's residential Honors College, the first of its kind in the North Carolina system, now enrolls more than 900 students, providing a focused living and learning environment for those seeking advanced academic challenges and more choices for independent study. Honors Scholars are exceptional students who take tutorial classes to prepare for regional and national research projects and compete for national and international scholarships. Also, freshmen admitted to Western are automatically considered for available scholarships, based on their academic achievements. The university annually awards \$1 million in merit-based scholarships and more than \$30 million in needs-based aid to students. About half of the university's students receive financial assistance through scholarships, grants, loans or work-study.

Students participate in a wide range of non-academic activities, including clubs and honor societies, community service and volunteer organizations, concerts and performances at various venues on campus, Greek life, student-operated media and student government. The university also sponsors outdoor recreational programs such as hiking, rafting and snow skiing that take advantage of the university's location in one of the nation's most popular vacation areas. Western also offers club sports and intramurals that involve about one-quarter of the student body.

Visitors to Western's campus today will find a radically different campus than the one that existed six years ago. With voters' approval of a statewide higher education bond package in fall 2000, the university launched into a building boom of a magnitude never before seen on campus.

Western's share of the bonds — \$98 million – represented the largest single infusion of funds in the university's history. Combined with federal funds and self-supporting projects, the \$130 million in new and renovated buildings and roads has redrawn the campus map as the university prepares for projected enrollment growth in the decade ahead.

Several new facilities already completed at Western are three new residence halls that offer modern conveniences and comfort for students; the Center for Applied Technology, which houses audio and video production studios and engineering laboratories; an expanded student life center; new and improved athletics facilities that support Western's intercollegiate sports programs; and a new One Stop Student Support Center that provides a quick and convenient way for students to receive help and conduct business involving financial aid, registration, cashiers services and many other administrative services. Construction on a new, on-campus student recreation center is expected to be completed by the end of the 2008 Fall semester.

DR. JOHN W. BARDO

Western Carolina University Chancellor

During his 10 years as Western Carolina University's chancellor, Dr. John W. Bardo has propelled Western into the national spotlight as a university that is preparing students to face the challenges of the 21st century.

Since becoming the 10th chief executive officer in Western's history, Dr. Bardo has been a driving force in the university's growing status across North Carolina and the nation as a leader in the application of the tools of technology to teaching and learning. During his decade of leadership, student enrollment has soared 21.8 percent, the average SAT scores of entering freshmen have risen by 62 points, and student retention rates are higher than ever. At Dr. Bardo's suggestion, the university community agreed to require incoming freshmen to have networkable computers, and in 1997 Western became the first institution in the University of North Carolina system to adopt that requirement, and is now moving to increase wireless networking capabilities on campus.

Similarly, it was at Dr. Bardo's urging that Western established a residential Honors College, the first in the UNC system. The Honors College, which began in 1997 with about 70 students, now enrolls more than 900 high-achieving students who welcome the challenge of advanced academic classes and competition for national and international scholarships. More recently, Dr. Bardo has emphasized the importance of service learning, which encourages faculty and staff to incorporate service to the community in many forms as a part of students' academic experiences at Western.

A native of Cincinnati, Ohio, Dr. Bardo also has engineered a university wide effort to "raise the bar" of academic standards at Western. Faculty members have increased their expectations of student performance, and students are rising to meet those expectations. That emphasis on increased academic quality is earning the attention of some of North Carolina's brightest young scholars, increasing the number of National Merit finalists and high school valedictorians interested in Western.

Under Dr. Bardo's leadership, the university has increasingly turned its attention toward reaching out to the citizens of Western North Carolina and promoting economic development as a means of improving the quality of life for the area's residents. Western's new \$8 million Center for Applied Technology is designed to address critical labor force issues facing the region by providing educational programs that will support emerging high-tech, "new economy" industries. Recently developed programs include undergraduate and graduate degrees in entrepreneurship, a degree in construction management, and approval for joint programs in electrical and computer engineering with Charlotte.

In addition, the university has formed strategic partnerships with several regional universities in the fields of biotechnology, bioinformatics and micro-optics. As construction is completed on Western's new "signature" building, a \$30 million Fine and Performing Arts Center, the university has taken numerous steps to boost heritage and cultural tourism in the mountain region, including the establishment of a new performance series of music and art.

Prior to his appointment at WCU, Dr. Bardo had been vice president for academic affairs at Bridgewater State College in Massachusetts since 1990. He assumed the dual role of provost of the public institution in 1993. Like Western Carolina, Bridgewater State was founded in the 19th century as a normal school for the training of teachers and today is a state-supported regional, comprehensive institution. Before moving to Massachusetts, Dr. Bardo held senior administrative posts at the University of North Florida in Jacksonville, serving as assistant to the president for planning and as provost and vice president for academic affairs. A sociologist, he had previously accumulated a decade of teaching and administrative experience at Southwest Texas State University and Wichita State University in Kansas.

Dr. Bardo graduated from the University of Cincinnati in 1970 with a degree in economics. He holds a master's degree in sociology from Ohio University, and earned a doctorate in the field from The Ohio State University. A graduate of the Institute for Educational Management at Harvard University, he also has been a Fulbright Visiting Scholar at Monash University in Australia and a guest visiting professor at the University College of Wales at Swansea.

Dr. Bardo is currently serving a four-term term of service on the NCAA's Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee. The 12-member committee is charged with conducting reviews of issues related to the interests of ethnic minority student-athletes, NCAA minority programs and NCAA policies that affect ethnic minorities.

In fall 2004, Dr. Bardo was appointed to serve one year as chairman of the committee on economic and work force development for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. The committee, composed of presidents and chancellors of AASCU member institutions, is one of six established by the association's board of directors to advance its work in the arena of public higher education.

Dr. Bardo and his wife, Deborah, have one son, Christopher.



CHIP SMITH

Western Carolina University Director of Athletics

Western Carolina Chancellor Dr. John W. Bardo announced on August 23, 2004 the selection of Chip Smith as the Catamounts' Director of Athletics. Smith comes to Western after two years as athletics director at Morehead State University.

His first year on the job at Western was an eventful one as the Lady Catamount basketball team won the 2005 Southern Conference tournament championship. In the spring, Western hosted the 2005 SoCon Outdoor Track & Field Championships, which was lauded for its organization and atmosphere. In addition to overseeing the start of a new program (softball and the construction of the program's new stadium), Smith laid the foundation for the success of three sports, hiring head coaches for men's basketball, volleyball and soccer during 2005.

Smith additionally was director of athletics at Eastern Kentucky University, as well as holding positions in the athletics departments at Virginia Military Institute, UNC Charlotte and University of North Carolina.

"This opportunity to join Western Carolina University at such an important time in its history is an honor," Smith said. "I couldn't be more excited to be a part of the enthusiasm surrounding the university and Catamount athletics. Dr. Bardo is a dynamic leader who has energized the campus. I look forward to working with him and the entire campus community to continue the strides toward excellence in athletics and throughout the university."

A native of Greensboro who grew up in Siler City, Smith earned his bachelor's degree in education at North Carolina in 1978, where he played football for four years under legendary coach Bill Dooley. He earned his master's degree in athletics administration at North Carolina in 1989.

He began his career in athletics as a high school teacher and coach, first at Hickory High School and then at Garinger High School in Charlotte. He worked as ticket manager for the Durham Bulls baseball club before joining the Educational Foundation Inc., at North Carolina in 1983 as assistant to the executive director of the athletics fund-raising organization also known as the Rams Club.

Smith was a member of the athletics department administration at UNC Charlotte from 1984 though 1991, first as business and ticket manager, then as assistant athletic director for development. He joined the staff of Southern Conference member VMI in 1991 as assistant athletics director, advancing to associate athletics director. He joined the administration at Eastern Kentucky University in 1999, rising to the position of director of athletics in 2001. He has served as director of athletics at Morehead State since August 2002.

Smith is married to the former Gale Thompson, who swam collegiately at North Carolina. They have two children; daughter Chesley (21), who is a senior at UNC Greensboro, and a son, Cort (17), who is a junior at Smoky Mountain High School.

RONNIE G. CHILDRESS FIELD AT HENNON STADIUM

The 2008 season will mark the 31st season that the Western Carolina University baseball program has called Ronnie G. Childress Field its home. The facility was officially renamed Childress Field at Hennon Stadium in a dedication program on April 23, 1994.

The Catamounts moved approximately 200 yards to the east from Haywood Field early in the 1978 season and have won over 72 percent of their home games since then, with a 526-201 record in 30 seasons. Bill Haywood, head baseball coach from 1969 through 1981, and Mr. E.J. Whitmire, longtime supporter and benefactor from Franklin, were the driving forces behind the building of the facility.

Childress Field, built at an initial cost of \$125,000, was dedicated April 26, 1978, and named in honor of the late Ronnie G. Childress, an avid supporter of WCU athletics and a special friend of the baseball program. Childress, through his family's radio station (WRGC) in Sylva, N.C., pioneered broadcasts of WCU's baseball games. He died in May 1975 as the result of an electrical accident at the radio station. The James B. Childress family established the Ronnie Childress Memorial Fund Scholarships in 1975 and scholarships have been awarded annually to one or more WCU baseball player for the past 28 years.

The facility received a \$500,000-plus face lift over an eight-year time period, thanks in large part to the generosity of Mr. Lamar Hennon of Dalton, Ga., and has become a showplace of Southern Conference baseball. Permanent bleacher seating, grandstand chair-back seats, and the facility's first-ever press box were installed prior to and during the 1990 season. A modern scoreboard, concession stands, rest rooms, and a new infield were added prior to the 1991 season.

The growth of the facility continued as part of Western's new building projects. Lights and a new sound system were added to the ballpark in the Fall of 2002. Western played its first ever night game on March 25, upsetting 10th-ranked Clemson, who is led by former WCU head coach Jack Leggett. In the summer of 2003, Childress Field was completely refurbished with nearly \$500,000 worth of improvements, including new drainage and irrigation, a new burmuda playing surface, new infield dirt and a new warning track. A new clubhouse on the first-base side and stadium seating design are planned for the upcoming seasons (see inside cover for artist renderings).

The field's dimensions are 325 feet down each line, 375 feet to the right and left center power alleys and 390 feet to straight away center field. The "Purple Monster" in left field is 100 feet long and is divided into two 50-foot levels. The first and tallest level is 20 feet high and the second level is 14 feet tall.

WCU hosted the 1984 and 1986 Southern Conference Tournaments at Childress Field and has welcomed out-of-conference teams representing such schools as Clemson, Georgia, Tennessee, South Carolina and North Carolina State to the facility.

THIS IS THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

The Southern Conference, which enters its 87th season of intercollegiate competition in 2007, has become known as one of the nation's leaders in emphasizing the development of the student-athlete and defining the league's role in helping to build lifelong leaders and role models.

The Southern Conference is the nation's fifth-oldest NCAA Division I collegiate athletic association. Only the Big Ten (1896), the Missouri Valley (1907), the Pacific 10 (1915) and the Southwestern Athletic (1920) conferences are older in terms of origination.

The Southern Conference has excelled as the premier Football Championship Subdivision conference since earning that classification in 1981. SoCon member Appalachian State has won the last three Football Championship Subdivision titles. The Conference currently consists of 11 members in four states throughout the Southeast and sponsors 19 varsity sports and championships that produce participants for NCAA Division I Championships.

Throughout its history, the Southern Conference has been an innovator in college athletics. The Southern Conference was the first

"super conference" with its charter membership including the likes of Alabama, Auburn, and North Carolina.

The SoCon, as it has come to be known by headline writers throughout the country, is the league that gave birth to the three-point shot in college basketball at Western Carolina University, and was the college home of such sporting greats as Arnold Palmer, Jerry West and Charlie "Choo Choo" Justice.

Academic excellence has been a major part of the Southern Conference's tradition. League athletes have been recognized countless times on Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-America and district teams. A total of 19 Rhodes-Scholarship winners have been selected from the conference.



The Southern Conference was formed on February 25, 1921 at a meeting in Atlanta, Ga. Fourteen institutions from the 30-member Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association (SIAA) reorganized as the Southern Conference. Those charter members included Alabama, Auburn, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi State, North Carolina, North Carolina State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Washington & Lee. Athletic competition began in the fall of 1921.

In 1922, six more schools - Florida, Louisiana State, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tulane and Vanderbilt - joined the fold. A year later, the University of the South joined the ranks. Virginia Military Institute became a member in 1925 and Duke University came into the fold in 1929. Since then, conference membership has experienced a series of membership changes with 42 institutions having been affiliated with the league. The league has undergone two major transitions during its history.

The first occurred in December 1932 when the Southeastern Conference was formed out of the 23-school Southern Conference. The league's 13 members west and south of the Appalachian Mountains reorganized to help reduce the extensive travel demands that were present in the league at the time. In 1936, the Southern Conference invited The Citadel, William & Mary, Davidson, Furman, Richmond and Wake Forest to join the membership.

The second major shift happened in 1953 when Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest officially withdrew from the league to form the Atlantic Coast Conference. This change was brought about due to the desire of many of those schools to schedule a greater number of regular season basketball games against their local rivals.

Today, the league continues to thrive with a 11-school membership that spans four Southeastern states. Current league members are Appalachian State, College of Charleston, The Citadel, Davidson, Elon, Furman, Georgia Southern, UNC Greensboro, Chattanooga,

Western Carolina and Wofford. On July 1, 2008, Samford will officially join the league, bringing membership of the conference to 12.

CHAMPIONSHIPS HISTORY

The first Southern Conference Championship was the league basketball tournament held in Atlanta in 1922. The North Carolina Tar Heels won the tournament to become the first recognized league champion in any sport. The Southern Conference Tournament remains the oldest of its kind in college basketball.

The Southern Conference began sponsoring women's sports during the 1983-84 season. That year, volleyball, basketball and tennis championships were held in the league. Cross

country joined the mix in 1985 and the league began holding indoor and outdoor track championships in 1988. Most recently, the conference instituted golf and softball championships in the spring of

1994 and added soccer in the fall of 1994.

The Southern Conference currently declares champions in 10 men's sports - football, soccer, cross country, basketball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, baseball, tennis and golf - and nine women's sports - soccer, volleyball, cross country, basketball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis, golf and softball.

Women's sports are relatively young in the league's history. In 1992-93, the Southern Conference celebrated its 10th Anniversary of women's athletics. Furman golfer Dottie Pepper was named the SoCon Women's Athlete-of-the-Decade in conjunction with that event. Appalachian State's Mary Jayne Harrelson won the NCAA Outdoor title at 1500 meters in 1999 and 2001. Most recently, Furman's Brandi Jackson won the NCAA Women's Golf East Regional in the spring of 2003.
