UIC Reaches National Top Ten, Leads Nation in Defense

Indianapolis, Ind. -- The University of Illinois at Chicago carried the Horizon League banner into the national spotlight in 2006, spending most of the season among the nation's top-ranked teams. UIC became the League's first entry into the top ten in nearly four years, racing to a 6-0-2 start to garner the No. 9 spot in the Sept. 19 NSCAA/adidas rankings and a No. 10 status according to *College Soccer News*.

The Flames drew immediate attention with a 1-0 victory at perennial power Saint Louis University to open the season, and also earned a road triumph over a (then-)seventh-ranked University of California-Santa Barbara team that eventually won the national championship. UIC suffered a pair of 1-0 losses away from home--at the University of Wisconsin and at Butler University--during the regular season, and was eliminated in the semifinals of the League Championship following a penalty-kick shootout versus eventual League titlist Loyola University Chicago.

UIC led the nation with a 0.36 goals-against average, the fifth-lowest mark in NCAA Division I history and the best since the University of Evansville set the record at 0.24 in 1990. Indiana University (0.25 in 1979), George Mason University (0.35 in 1982) and Clemson University (0.36 in 1983) are the only other Division I programs that can claim better season-long averages than UIC.

On an individual basis, UIC redshirt freshman Jovan Bubonja ranked fourth in the nation with his 0.373 goals-against average. Bubonja allowed only eight goals (never more than one in any match) while stopping 76 shots in his 1,930 minutes of play for a .905 save percentage which ranked third in Division I. The Flame netminder posted a school-record ten shutouts in 2006, earning the League's Goalkeeper of the Year award and First-Team All-League honors.

Bubonja's play helped UIC to its first League title in six years as the Flames' 5-1-1 loop ledger topped the circuit's regular-season charts. Coach John Trask's group advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2000 and defeated Western Illinois University, 3-0, in the opening round before falling 1-0 at the University of Notre Dame to settle for a 13-3-5 overall record. UIC was ranked 20th in the final *Soccer Times* national poll, tied for 25th according to the NSCAA/adidas canvass, and 30th in the *College Soccer News* listings.

Meier, Mongillo Tabbed Academic All-America Honorees

Indianapolis, Ind. - University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee senior Billy Meier and Butler University senior Paul Mongillo received Second-Team Academic All-America recognition from the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), putting them among 33 players to be recognized by the organization. The awards are sponsored by *ESPN the Magazine*.

Meier was the League's Defensive Player of the Year, anchoring a Panther unit that posted six shutouts and a 1.07 goals-against average on the way to a 8-9-2 record. Milwaukee tied for third place in the loop standings with a 4-2-1 League ledger, aided by Meier's efforts which garnered First-Team All-League recognition in 2006. He also tied for second place on the team charts with three goals (two match-winners) and added two assists for eight points.

Meier earned Scholar All-Region accolades from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) last fall after helping the Panthers to a fourth consecutive League Championship.

Mongillo played in all 20 games for the Bulldogs, making key contributions to a defensive effort which posted four shutouts. Butler also allowed only one goal in each of six other contests this season, compiling a 1.49 goals-against average on the way to a 7-11-2 final ledger. Mongillo's defensive work limited scoring opportunities, but he set up one of two BU strikes versus Xavier University on Sept. 13.

In the classroom, Meier carried a 3.795 grade-point average while pursuing his master's degree in business. Mongillo touted a near-perfect 3.946 GPA as a finance major.

Southern Methodist University goalkeeper Matt Wideman received Academic All-America of the Year honors after leading SMU to the top spot in the national rankings for several weeks during the regular season. Gonzaga University's George Josten, the University of Alabama-Birmingham's Lukasz Kwapisz and Eugene Brooks from California State University-Fullerton comprised the forward line, with St. John's University's Jeff Stepan, Dartmouth College's Nick Christman and Tyler Hemming of Hartwick College in the midfield. The defense included Stephen Hall from the University at Albany, along with Matt Haney of the University of Delaware, Greg Cass from Columbia University and Devin Sheppard from Campbell University.

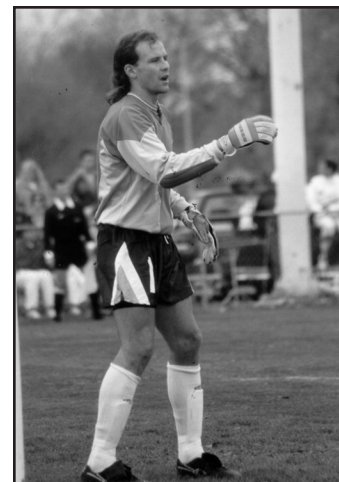

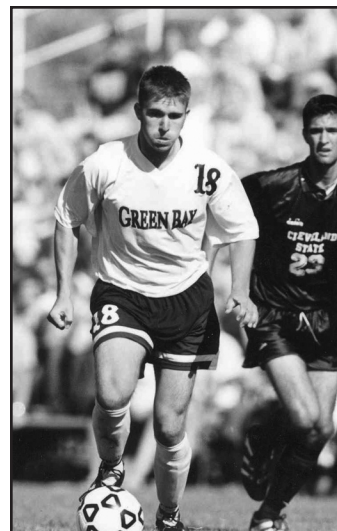

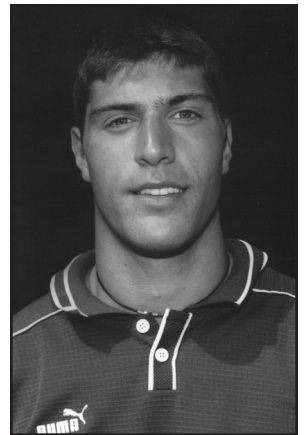
