HEALTH CARE

STATE LEGISLATORS SHOULD:

- Encourage governors and attorneys general to join the lawsuits that seek to overturn ObamaCare's individual mandate and Medicaid mandate;
- Avoid creating new bureaucracies, applying for federal grants, or expanding state spending in response to ObamaCare;
- Educate the public about the harmful effects of ObamaCare;
- Demand that the federal government grant states flexibility, *not* additional funds, to administer Medicaid and SCHIP programs;
- Eliminate licensing of medical professionals or, as a preliminary step, recognize licenses issued by other states;
- Eliminate licensing of health insurance or, as a preliminary step, recognize insurance products licensed by other states;
- Eliminate "corporate-practice-of-medicine" laws;
- Eliminate "certificate-of-need" laws;
- Enforce private contracts that include medical malpractice reforms;
- Avoid creating special tax breaks for health insurance and medical care; and
- Eliminate existing tax breaks for health insurance and medical care while reducing the overall tax burden.
