11.	Boundary Post	Waltham Road, south side, near Long Green	City of London Coal Duty Post, cast iron; dated c.1860
12	Homefield	Back Lane	Early 20th century rendered dwelling. Designed by Inigo Triggs (1876-1923) a well-known English architect, author and landscape garden designer.
