- 6 'Long-term unemployed' are those who stated they have not worked since 1999 or earlier.
- 7 First degree; Higher degree; NVQ levels 4 and 5; HNC; HND; Qualified Teacher Status; Qualified Medical Doctor; Qualified Dentist; Qualified Nurse; Midwife; Health Visitor.
