Some Facts and Figures

The election is managed under the direction of the Returning Officer, Barnet Council's Chief Executive Leo Boland. He was assisted by Deputy Returning Officers at each counting centre.

There were 162 polling stations in use between 7am and 10pm, manned by 483 staff. A total of 216,717 people were registered to vote in this election. In 2002, there were 201,568 registered voters. A total of 33,892 postal votes were issued this year, which is a record for council elections in Barnet. The previous highest was 29,195 in 2002.

There were 63 seats up for grabs at this election. In Barnet there are 21 wards, each represented by three councillors. 219 candidates stood in this election. Conservative and Labour parties contested every seat. There were three Liberal Democrat candidates in each ward except one. The Green Party contested every ward and the UK Independence Party one. There was one Victory United candidate and two candidates stood as Independents.

The composition of the council before the election was as follows:

- Conservative 31
- Labour 24
- Liberal Democrat 7
- Vacant 1

Following the election the composition is as follows:

Conservatives - 37 seats
 Labour - 20 seats
 Liberal Democrats - 6 seats

The Conservative group has a majority of 11.

SUMMARY BOROUGH ELECTION RESULTS 1964 – 2002

The present London boroughs were created under the Local Government Act 1963 and the first elections for the new councils were held in 1964. Until 1976, elections were held every three years. They are now held every four years. In 1964 Barnet was represented by 56 councillors. This was increased to 60 and following boundary changes before 2002's elections, to 63.

BRUNSWICK PARK WARD PROFILE

Summary Key Facts



Twelve per cent of Brunswick Park residents are retired, the second highest proportion among Barnet wards. Only 9% of economically active Brunswick Park residents work in Health and Social Work, the lowest proportion in Barnet.

1,540 (40.5%) of Brunswick Park's working age population are in the Small employer and own account worker/lower supervisory and technical occupational groups – higher than any other Barnet ward.

A comparatively high proportion of properties in Brunswick Park are semi-detached and terraced. Brunswick Park has the highest proportion of residents owning their homes with a mortgage – 44.4%.

35.1% of Brunswick Park households are couples with children, the highest percentage in Barnet.

Burnt Oak Ward Profile Summary Key Facts



At 7,259 people per square kilometre, Burnt Oak has the highest population density of Barnet's wards. Burnt Oak has comparatively high proportions of its population who are Black African, Black Caribbean and Black Other and the highest proportion of White Irish residents. 16.8% of Burnt Oak residents have a disability, the highest in Barnet. 30.8% of working age residents have no qualification, the highest rate in Barnet. Just over a fifth of the economically active work in routine and semi-routine employment and a further 8.2% have never worked or are long-term unemployed. Both these are the highest proportions in Barnet.

Just under 39% of residents live in households with no car – the highest proportion in the borough. Burnt Oak has the highest proportion of its dwellings in terraced housing: 30.7%. There are 1,054 lone parents in Burnt Oak which, at 17.9% of households, is the highest in Barnet.

COLINDALE WARD PROFILE Summary Key Facts



Of all Barnet's wards, Colindale has the greatest proportion of its population aged under 5 (8%) and the smallest proportions over 64.

Colindale has the smallest proportion of White British residents (just under 40%) and the highest per cent of Black African residents, 12.8%.

11.1% of Colindale residents are Muslim, the second highest in Barnet. Colindale has the lowest proportion of those aged 16-74 who are self-employed and the highest proportion who are unemployed or full time students. A higher proportion of the Colindale workforce works in Hotels & Catering and the Transport, Storage & Communications sectors than any other Barnet ward.

Colindale has the second highest proportion of residents in households without access to a car (37.3%) and, at 84 per 100 households, the lowest rate of car ownership. Just over 27% of Colindale households rent from the council, the second highest proportion in Barnet. At 16.2% of all households, Colindale has the second highest rate of lone parent families.

Coppetts has a higher than average proportion of its population who are middle aged and a lower proportion in the over 65 age group. The ward has the highest proportion of Mixed White and Asian residents, 1.4% (200).

A higher proportion of Coppett's workers than any Barnet ward use buses to get to work, 14.5% (1,029) and a lower proportion than any other ward, work from home. One in four of Coppetts' households comprise one person under retirement age, the highest in Barnet.

EAST BARNET WARD PROFILE

Summary Key Facts



At 83%, East Barnet has the second highest proportion of its residents born in the United Kingdom. Three-quarters of the ward's residents are White British, again the second-highest rate in the borough.

At 62.8% of residents, East Barnet also has the second highest Christian population and the lowest proportion not stating their religion. A higher proportion of East Barnet workers are employed in the construction industry than any of Barnet's other wards.

East Barnet has a comparatively low proportion of residents who have never worked or are long-term unemployed. With two mainline stations in the ward, East Barnet has the highest proportion of workers using trains to get to work: 10.4%.

Summary Key Facts



East Finchley has the second largest number of households of Barnet's wards and the fewest people per household. The ward has the second highest proportion of people aged 20 to 64: 65% of all its residents.

More people in East Finchley than any other Barnet ward said they had no religion: 19%. Over half of East Finchley's residents aged 16 to 74 are in paid employment and it has the lowest proportion of residents who are not economically active because they look after a home or family.

Almost 40% of East Finchley residents of working age travel to work by Underground, the highest percentage in Barnet. At 55.4%, East Finchley has the highest proportion of households living in flats, maisonettes or apartments. One in ten of East Finchley's residents lives in households renting from a Housing Association or other Registered Social Landlord.

Edgware has the fewest households of Barnet's wards and the second highest number of people per household. With the second highest proportion of Jews in the borough (36.9%), Edgware also has the lowest proportion of residents who are Christian or who have no religion.

1,537 Edgware residents provide unpaid care: at 10.4% the highest proportion in Barnet. Edgware has the smallest proportion of its 16 to 74 year old population in paid employment (45.7%) and, of its economically active residents, the second highest proportion working in the Wholesale, retail trade and car repair sectors.

There are just over 130 cars for every hundred Edgware households, the highest rate of car ownership in the borough. At 21.2%, Edgware has the largest percentage of households living in detached houses.

There are comparatively low rates of disability and poor health and over one quarter of Finchley Church End workers are in the real estate, renting and business activities sector, the second highest proportion in Barnet.

Finchley Church End has the second lowest proportion of residents in the 16 to 74 age range who have no qualifications, 14.1%.

37.2% of Finchley Church End residents own their homes outright, the second highest rate in Barnet. Conversely, the ward has comparatively low rates of households in council housing and other kinds of social housing.

At 37.1% of the population, it is the ward with the highest proportion of Jews, and they are its largest religious group. Garden Suburb has the smallest proportion of its population reporting they have a disability. 1,895 Garden Suburb residents aged 16 to 74, 18.1%, are self-employed, the highest proportion in Barnet.

Almost two-fifths of Garden Suburb workers are in the real estate, renting and business sector and the ward has the highest proportion of workers in the financial intermediation sector. 54.6% of Garden Suburb residents aged 16 to 74 have a degree (or equivalent) or professional qualification, compared with a borough average of 35.5%. Over two-fifths of Garden Suburb households own their home outright, the highest proportion in Barnet.

Summary Key Facts



Within Barnet there is a correlation between wards having a high Jewish and White Other population and those not stating their religion. Hendon has the third highest percentage of its population who are Jewish and the fourth who are White Other: it also has the second highest proportion who preferred not to state what their religion is. One possible explanation for this is that many Jewish refugees from Fascism in Europe are likely to describe themselves as White but not British and to have a disinclination to provide information about their religious beliefs to the state.

Hendon has the second highest proportion of its population aged 16 to 74 who are students: 15%.

53.2% of dwellings in Hendon are flats, maisonettes or apartments, the second highest proportion in Barnet.
