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I. Situation Overview & highlights

- On 31 August, the Colombo High Court sentenced journalist J. S. Tissainayagam to 20 years rigorous imprisonment for writing and publishing articles critical of the Sri Lankan Government's treatment of Tamils affected by the war. He is the first Sri Lankan journalist to be arrested and convicted under the Prevention of Terrorism Act (PTA).
- On 2 September, the Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) ordered James Elder, UNICEF Communications Officer, to leave the country on charges of circulating false information about IDPs in Vavuniya. UNICEF regional chief of communications Sarah Crowe has stated that Elder should be allowed to continue his work supporting UNICEF's role as an impartial advocate on behalf of Sri Lanka's most vulnerable women and children.
- On 2 September, the GoSL released on bail the last of a group of five doctors, detained under the emergency regulations on charges of giving false information to the media about civilian casualties in Kilinochchi early this year.
- On 3 September, the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-Moon expressed his concern about the living conditions of Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) held in state-run camps, because "conditions have not improved." He said conditions may deteriorate further when the monsoon season arrives, and civilians should be allowed out of the camps to stay with host families. He made these statements in Geneva, where he was attending the third World Conference on Climate Change.
- On 3 September, the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-Moon and Mahinda Samarasinghe, Minister of Disaster Management and Human Rights in Sri Lanka, met on the sidelines of the Geneva conference. They exchanged views on camp conditions, the speedy resettlement of IDPs and freedom of movement for both IDPs and humanitarian aid workers. Minister Samarasinghe reiterated the GoSL's commitment to care for the IDPs and to resettle them as soon as the demining process is complete and infrastructure and basic services restored. The importance of reconciliation efforts and accountability was also on the agenda, in the light of recent allegations of extrajudicial executions made against the GoSL.
- On 3 September, the Cabinet approved a memorandum submitted by the Ministry of Finance and Planning to obtain a US\$ 70 million loan from the Asian Development Bank to implement the Eastern and Northern Central Provincial Road Project. The loan will be utilized to rehabilitate 150km of roads in the Eastern Province.
- On 4 September, the British High Commissioner Dr. Peter Hayes and the Head of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) Mohammed Abdiker signed an agreement for approximately UK£ 84,000 in support to the rehabilitation and reintegration of ex-combatants.
- On 8 September, the GoSL presented its evidence to support its contention that the Channel 4 execution video had been doctored. UN Heads of Agencies and members of the diplomatic community were invited to the meeting at the Presidential Secretariat. The video was examined by the GoSL's independent technical consultants: Siri Hewawitharana, the former head of CISCO's global broadcast and digital video practice; Dr. Chatura Ranjan de Silva, a Senior Lecturer on Computer Science and Engineering and Director of the Centre for Instructional Technology; Brigadier Prasad Samarasinghe, the Chief Signal Officer of the Sri Lanka Army; and Major P.A. Bandara attached to the Media Centre for National Security. The GoSL has called for a retraction of the video footage and has stated its intention to take legal action against Britain's Channel 4.
- On 9 September, the United States Embassy in Sri Lanka announced that the United States Pacific Command is providing training and equipment to the Sri Lanka Army (SLA) to assist its demining efforts. This training will build additional SLA capacity to clear mines in the Northern Province and expedite the safe return of displaced people to their homes and livelihoods. The training is being conducted at the Sri Lanka School of Military Engineering (SLSME) at Embilipitiya. The U.S. also donated personal protection equipment (vest and visors) and demining equipment (deminer tool set and mine lab F3 detectors) to Sri Lanka.

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- On 11 September, the Resident Coordinator/Humanitarian Coordinator (RC/HC) Neil Buhne sent a letter to the Minister of Resettlement and Disaster Relief Services Rishad Bathiudeen requesting a meeting to discuss humanitarian concerns regarding IDP sites in the north. The letter urges GoSL authorities to expedite IDP returns to their homes, host families or open camps with freedom of movement. These measures would contribute to the decongestion of Menik Farm and other IDP sites, which the HC/RC lists among several priorities to mitigate the impact of the monsoon season on camp conditions.
- The Ministry of Resettlement and Disaster Relief Services (MRDRS) has introduced the SAHANA relief coordination and data management system. This will be the only data collection mechanism related to recovery services for Vanni IDPs. Through discussions with the Ministry, OCHA has agreed to act as the focal point for data collection for UN agencies and international organisations (and donors in the field, if they wish to participate). OCHA and the Consortium of Humanitarian Agencies (CHA) will partner with the Ministry to facilitate the initial data collection process for the SAHANA system. All data will feed into the global 3W system.
- OCHA will liaise with the Disaster Management Centre (DMC), the Department of Meteorology and other partners to look into establishing an early warning mechanism for IDP camps in the north. This measure will enhance steps already underway to prepare the camps to withstand the worst effects of the monsoons.

JAFFNA

- On 11 September, 568 IDPs were moved from IDP transit sites in Vavuniya District to Jaffna District. They are accommodated at the Kaithady University Hostel IDP camp. Movement restrictions have been imposed on these IDPs.

TRINCOMALEE

- On 10 September, the first Divisional-level early recovery coordination meeting occurred at the Morawewa District Secretariat office. The meeting was chaired by the District Secretary. It was attended by the area Grama Niladhari and Samurdhi officers, military officials and representatives of humanitarian and development agencies. An orientation on early recovery was given at the meeting and the District Secretary agreed to convene the forum on a monthly basis.

VAVUNIYA

- On 11 September, 1,706 IDPs from transit sites returned to their home districts of Ampara, Batticaloa, Jaffna and Trincomalee.
- In the course of last week, the UN secured the release of 6 individuals related to 2 UNICEF and UNOPS personnel. Among the group were 4 children, including an infant.

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II. Sector Overview & highlights

SHELTER / NFI

- The Shelter and WASH Sectors continue to define areas vulnerable to high groundwater and other potential hazards during the monsoon that may require WASH facilities, as well as shelters/tents, to be temporarily or permanently decommissioned. It is also necessary to identify the number of affected IDPs, the SLA capacity to relocate them to alternative contingency sites and undertake preparatory works in such locations. A possible relocation of Child Friendly Spaces (CFS), Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS), Primary Health Care Centres (PHCC) and other facilities needs also to be considered. The relocation of camp infrastructure may possibly result in further decommissioning of shelters. It has been agreed with the SLA that these issues will be finalised as soon as the current groundwater studies are complete.
- IDPs have been moving into Zone 6A in Menik Farm since 2 September, as the SLA continues to empty the Andiyapuliyankulam, Aruvithodam Sivanantha Vidyalayam (Menik Farm School), Chettikulam, Nelukkulam and Sooduvenhapulavu school transit sites. One block in Zone 6A is currently unoccupied.
- Zones 6B and 8 continue to lack electricity and remain unoccupied. The SLA has not confirmed when IDPs from school transit sites will be moved to these zones. In Zone 8, the tent pegs and securing ropes have not been maintained, while the zone lay empty. As a result, a significant number of tents have fallen and some tent poles have broken. SLA and agency teams have been re-erecting and repairing some 327 fallen tents to avoid further deterioration. Approximately 160 tents still require re-erection and/or repair. The SLA has offered to continue the work, if Shelter agencies can supply spare tent poles.
- Shelter and tent maintenance is continuing on all sites with a limited number of agencies, as the focus is on completing drainage prior to the onset of heavy monsoon rains. Shelter agencies continue to work on the planned handover of maintenance to IDPs. The preparation of training materials is well in progress. Agencies are arranging for the scheme to be supported through their staff resident in the camps and through the existing block networks, including the hygiene promotion and WFP distribution mechanisms. The scheme continues to face challenges concerning the availability of shelter sheeting and other materials, due to dwindling agency stocks and donor constraints upon the direct handover of material to IDPs.
- Shelter agencies report that drainage will be completed on all sites between the end of September and mid-October. The DMC has stated that the main road drainage will be completed before the monsoons. The DMC will also complete channels through debris piles and earth mounds scattered across Menik Farm to permit the road drains to work effectively. Consequently, the DMC has given its assurance that the sites will have adequate road drains (subject to suitable surface drains), which will avoid flooding during the monsoonal rains.
- By 4 September, the drainage work at Menik Farm stood as follows:
 - Zone 0: No shelter or drainage information is currently available.
 - Zone 1: Road drainage is an estimated 85% complete. Surface drainage is pending.
 - Zone 2: Road drainage is an estimated 85% complete. Surface drainage was 60% complete.
 - Zone 3: Road drainage is an estimated 40% complete. Surface drainage was 65% complete.
 - Zone 4: Road drainage is an estimated 65% complete. Surface drainage was 50% complete.
 - Zone 5: Road drainage is at an estimated 40%. Surface drainage is at 45%.
 - Site 6A: Road drainage design and construction is yet to commence. Surface drainage was at 45%.
 - Site 6B: Road and surface drainage construction is yet to commence, although equipment has been mobilised to the site.
 - Site 7: Road drainage design and construction has yet to commence. Surface drainage was at 45%.
 - Site 8: Road and surface drainage construction has yet to commence, although equipment has been mobilised to the site.
- The Shelter Sector is trying to identify agencies to carry out surface drainage and maintenance in the

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Menik Farm blocks, where tents were installed by the ICRC, Shelterbox and the SLA. Agencies have so far come forward to undertake surface drainage in all the Shelterbox and ICRC blocks, except in Zone 1). However, no agency has assumed responsibility for the SLA blocks to date. It is expected that the significant rearrangement of tents in the SLA blocks, especially in Zone 4, will compound the installation of drainage and individual cooking spaces. Thus, the SLA has been asked to address these blocks. Although not present on site, Shelterbox says that it provided spare tents, plastic sheeting, repair materials and mammoties for maintenance and drainage purposes to the Zonal Commanders. SLA has not released these items and are requesting other assistance instead.

- Road access within the Menik Farm and smaller sites is an ongoing concern. The roads continue to break down due to heavy trafficking and poor construction. In some zones, this situation is exacerbated by the barbed wire across certain roads, which restricts use to particular access roads. The SLA has informed that there are no GoSL funds available for internal and access road maintenance, since funds have been diverted to support return priorities. Consequently, Shelter agencies anticipate that the progressive deterioration of emergency drainage will further erode the usable surface of the roads and limit the maximum weight of vehicle loads.
- In Zone 4, individual kitchens are being installed. The process is a challenge, as relocated tents have made it difficult to have clear spaces for drainage and cooking facilities. Further, Shelter agencies have been responding to IDP demands for one cooking space per family, rather than one per tent/shelter. The construction of family cooking spaces will rapidly deplete resources and contribute to further site congestion.
- During the NFI coordination meeting held on 28 August, focal point agencies for the distribution of hygiene and baby kits were appointed to all blocks. As a result of movement between zones and releases from hospitals, focal points were requested to do needs assessment. Minor gaps are foreseen on the basic NFI kit. In case agencies do not have their own stock to fill the gap, the NFI Sector Lead agency will provide packs for distribution by partners.
- The full quota of umbrellas for the rainy season NFI kit has been met. It was proposed that a weather-proof plastic envelope should be included as well to allow IDPs to store their documents. A total 86,000 pieces are required and, so far 20,000 have been pledged. IDPs have been provided with slippers by different agencies, but the quantities distributed per family differ. An assessment will be made shortly to calculate how many more slippers are needed.

PROTECTION

- The first return movements of IDPs from camps in Jaffna, Mannar and Vavuniya districts started on 5 August. Protection agencies have interviewed and assisted these returnees in their places of origin. In Jaffna, representatives of 994 families in 10 out of the 15 Jaffna District Secretariat (D.S.) divisions were interviewed. Returnees are happy to have been able to leave the camps and to have returned to their place of origin. Most are staying with relatives. Some are living in their own houses, while a very small percentage has rented accommodation. Almost half of those interviewed indicated that shelter and livelihood assistance is their most immediate need. Some mentioned the need to obtain replacements for their lost civil documentation. In Trincomalee, representatives of 135 families, who returned to Thampalakamam D.S. division, were interviewed. Almost all the families are still living with their friends/relatives. Families with properties have started to clear their lands but mentioned that their houses are damaged or looted.
- The 1,706 IDPs transferred from the Vavuniya camps to Ampara, Batticaloa, Jaffna and Trincomalee districts on 11 September, have not been able to return to their homes. They are temporarily accommodated in transit sites, where they have no freedom of movement.
- Some returns of old caseload IDPs to several villages in Vavuniya D.S. division have begun. Reportedly, 50 families returned to Salambaikulam, 163 families to Parainattakal, 50 families to Nampankulam, 50 families to Katpakapuram and 135 families to Nochchimodai, for a total of more than 1,600 individuals.
- Sooduvenchapulavu, Menik Farm School, Chettikulam, Nelukkulam and Andiyapuliyankulam emergency sites were all closed and IDPs moved to various zones in Menik Farm. No significant

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protection issues regarding the moves were reported, except for the fact that IDPs were only told of their move at the last minute.

- On 2 September, reportedly around 78 elderly IDPs were released from different Menik Farm zones to Samanankulam Elders' Home and Mannar Elders' Home. Samanankulam Elders' Home now cares for 217 elderly IDPs and more IDPs are expected in the coming weeks.
- Since the establishment of the Women and Children's Desks in the Menik Farm Sites, reporting of protection incidents has improved.
- The Presidential Task Force has approved the establishment of Community Recreational Centres in the Vavuniya sites.

CHILD PROTECTION

- Some progress has been made in following the legal processes, set down by the Emergency Gazette, for child surrendees in Poonthotham Cooperative Training Centre. A total of 306 child surrendees have been produced before the Magistrate who has ordered the Department of Probation and Child Protection to prepare social inquiry reports regarding each case. This will form the basis for the Magistrate to decide whether children should return to their families, move to a protective accommodation centre, or stay in the reunification centre (for a maximum of 1 year).
- A Steering Group on Surrendees was launched by the Secretary of Justice.
- A Child Focus Unit has been constructed and opened in Zone 3, block 28 of Menik Farm, to establish coordinated referral and response mechanisms for child protection, by bringing together key stakeholders: National Child Protection Authority coordinators, both Psychosocial and District coordinator, Probation, Women and Children's Police Desk, UNICEF and UNHCR. 62 volunteers have been selected to ensure effective links between community structures, such as the Child Friendly Spaces, the Child Support Groups and the Child Focus Unit.
- The Child Protection Working Group has worked on contingency planning for monsoons, including messages to be distributed through the CFSs and Child Support Groups on safety, preventing separation, emergency accommodation for the most vulnerable and recommendations to minimise flood damage to the CFSs.

EDUCATION

- Education activities began in the Poonthotham Cooperative Training Centre, Trincomalee, at the start of the school term, with 202 children accessing formal education and vocational training.
