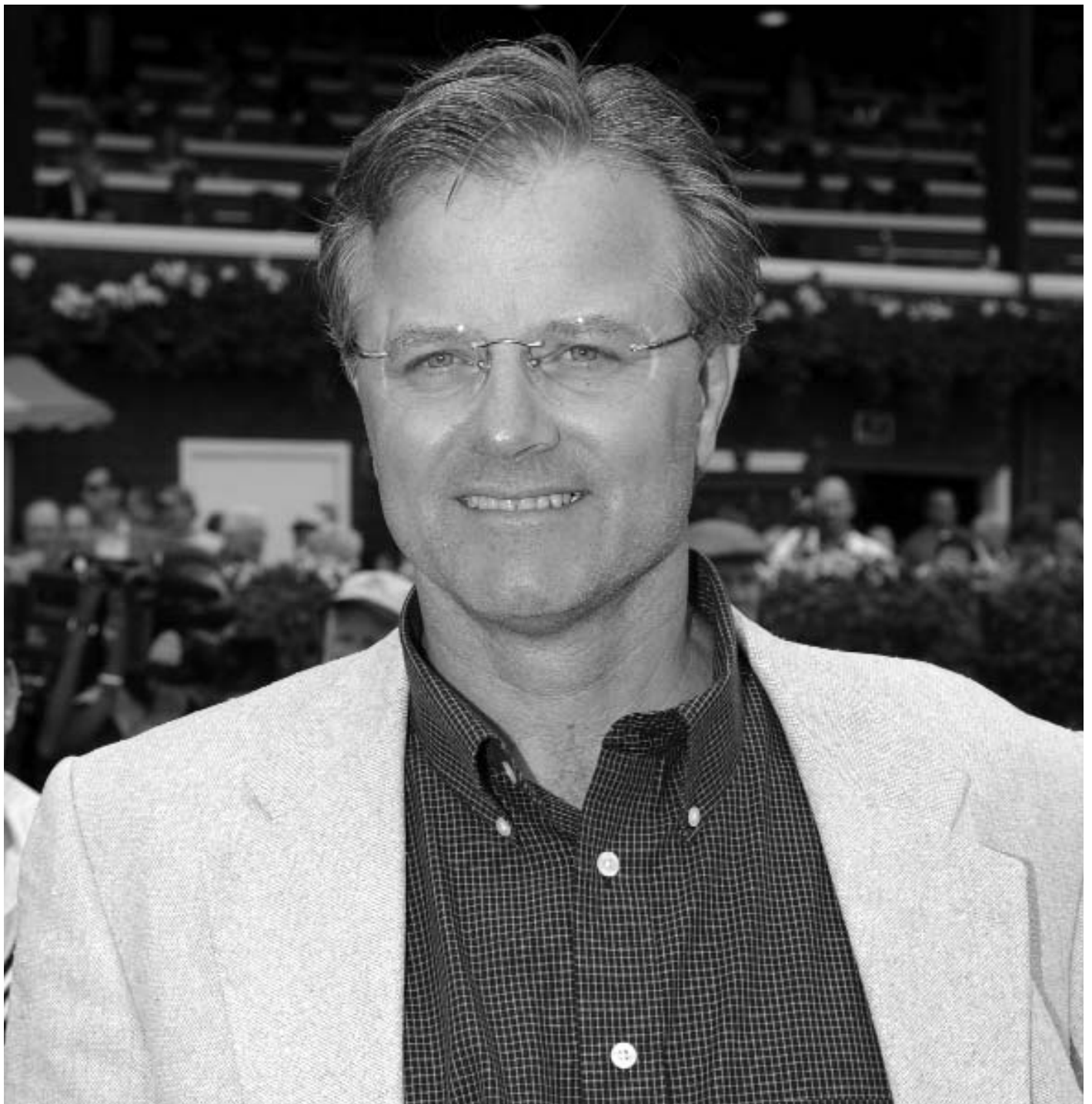

**Bernardini** - Three-year-old (2006)

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:**  
 \* Registered his first official stakes win as trainer on record when Swither won the NATC Sorority Futurity at Delaware Park on September 4, 2004.  
 \* Won his first Grade 1 race with Balletto in Frizette at Belmont Park in 2004. Balletto finished second in the 2004 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Lone Star Park.  
 \* Trained 2006 3-year-old champion Bernardini to Grade 1 wins in the Preakness, Travers and Jockey Club Gold Cup.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**  
 \* Rode as an apprentice jockey in New York and New Jersey. Albertrani says he quit riding after about 60 victories.  
 \* Began working for Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott at age 22 galloping horses such as Heatherton. Became Mott's assistant in 1986 and worked for him for nine years. Wife Fonda galloped Cigar.  
 \* Hired by Godolphin Racing, moved to the United Arab Emirates and worked as an assistant to trainer Saeed bin Suroor in 1995.  
 \* Returned to the United States as the trainer for Darley Stable, an offshoot of the Godolphin Empire, in 2003.  
 \* Currently in the United States year round.

 \* Began walking hots at 13 for his uncle, trainer Jack Abatemarco, at Belmont Park.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:**  
 \* Has trained more than 20 stakes winners.  
 \* Trained New York-bred Lucky Roberto to victory in the Grade 1 Hopeful at Saratoga in 1998.  
 \* Trained Cherokee Run to victory in the Breeders' Cup Sprint and the Eclipse Award for Champion Sprinter in 1994. Cherokee Run won the 1993 Dwyer Stakes and finished second in the 1993 Preakness Stakes.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**  
 \* Served in the United States Air Force from 1957-61.  
 \* Opened his own business on Long Island in 1961. He bought and sold hunters, showed horses and instructed riders.  
 \* Began his training career as an assistant to Mike Freeman in New York in 1963. Took out his trainer's license later that year in New York.  
 \* In January 1970, he managed Sagamore Farm in Glyndon, Md., for Alfred Vanderbilt. He managed the farm for four years.  
 \* In 1974, he started a public racing stable in Maryland.  
 \* Permanently relocated to New York in April 1987 to work with several owners, including former New York Racing Association Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Barry K. Schwartz.

 \* Alexander: "I grew up around horses, specifically show horses, and obtained a trainer's license in New York in 1963."

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

\* Served at Engine House 234 in Brooklyn and Engine House 273 in Queens as a New York City fireman.

\* Learned craft from trainers Frank LaBocchetta, Howie Teshler, and John Tammaro.

#### INTRODUCTION TO RACING:

\* Aquilino: "I worked as a hot walker and swing man (filling-in for grooms on their days off) part-time for Frank LaBocchetta while I was a New York City fireman. I started working for Frank in 1973; now I'm retired from the Fire Department and training full time."

#### FIRST WINNER:

\* Aquilino: "I got my trainer's license in 1977 while I was still working for Frank (LaBocchetta), and saddled my first winner, Amberdias, in 1977 at Atlantic City."

**Curlin** - Horse of the Year (2007), Top 3-Year-Old Colt (2007)

#### CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

\* Won 555 races in 2004 to set a record for North American trainers. The previous record was held by Hall of Fame trainer Jack Van Berg, who won 496 races in 1976.

\* Leading trainer by wins with 407 in 2002. He was only the third trainer in history to reach 400 in a single season, joining Hall of Famer Jack Van Berg and Scott Lake.

\* Has won training titles at Lone Star Park, Fairgrounds, and Churchill Downs. He is the all-time leading trainer at Lone Star Park.

\* In 2007, trained Horse of the Year Curlin to victories in the Preakness, Jockey Club Gold Cup, and Breeders' Cup Classic.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

\* Father Keith is a former jockey who now trains. Mother Marilyn is also a trainer. The

family runs El Primero Training Center in Laredo, Texas.

\* Brother Cash won the 1979 Eclipse Award as the Top Apprentice. He later became a European riding champion. He is now a trainer.

\* First major horse was Valid Expectations, who won seven stakes races from 1995-97.

\* First Grade 1 winner came on June 26, 1999 when Dreams Galore won the Mother Goose at Belmont Park.

\* Due to a lengthy suspension in 2006, many horses in Asmussen's stable ran under assistant Scott Blasi's name. Blasi's runners won 19 races from 103 starts, including the Spinaway (Appealing Zophie) and Saratoga Special (Chace City).

#### INTRODUCTION TO RACING:

\* After working for family, he began riding professionally at age 16. Rode three years in New Mexico, California and New York before retiring due to his size. Started training Thoroughbreds and Quarterhorses in New Mexico in 1986.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:**  
 \* Won Eclipse Award as Top Trainer in 1997, 1998 and 1999.  
 \* Leading trainer in earnings in 1999 with \$16,841,407 and in 2000 with \$11,817,625.  
 \* Leading trainer at Del Mar for six consecutive years, 1997-2002.  
 \* Leading trainer at Santa Anita Winter/Spring for six consecutive years, 1997-2002.  
 \* Led nation in money-earned in 2001 with \$15,759,410. That total was aided by Captain Steve's victory in the \$6 million Dubai World Cup. He has won multiple training titles at Hollywood Park since 1995.  
 \* Won 20 Grade 1 stakes races with 12 different horses in 1999.  
 \* Became the first trainer to sweep every Grade 1 event at a Del Mar in 1999.  
 \* Only trainer to saddle winners of the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes for two consecutive years: Silver Charm in 1997 and

Real Quiet in 1998. Both were denied the Triple Crown by narrow defeats in the Belmont Stakes.  
 \* Baffert also saddled War Emblem for victories in the 2002 Kentucky Derby and 2002 Preakness Stakes. War Emblem failed to win the Triple Crown when he finished eighth in the 2002 Belmont Stakes.  
 \* Won the Preakness Stakes, Belmont Stakes, Haskell and Travers with Point Given in 2001. Duke of Magenta (1978), Grenada (1880), Native Dancer (1953) and Damascus (1967) are the only other horses to sweep those four races.  
 \* Leading trainer in wins (139 winners from 538 starters) and earnings (\$15,000,870) in 1998.  
 \* Won the 2001 Dubai World Cup with Captain Steve and the 1998 Dubai World Cup with Silver Charm.  
 \* Trained 1998 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Silverbulletday. She was named Top 2-Year-Old Filly in 1998.  
 \* Thirty Slews, the first Thoroughbred yearling he purchased at auction, became his first Breeders' Cup starter and first Breeders' Cup winner in the 1992 Sprint at Gulfstream Park.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**  
 \* Bode Lake Baffert, the first child for Bob and Jill Baffert, was born in December 2004. Sons Taylor, Canyon and Forest, and daughter Savannah are from a previous marriage.  
 \* Switched completely from training Quarter Horses to Thoroughbreds the day after he trained three winners on California Cup Day in 1991. Owner Mike Pegram, who remains a major client, bankrolled the switch.  
 \* Cites the Breeders' Cup as his primary motivation for making the switch: "That's what got me really interested in Thoroughbred racing, watching the 1984 Breeders' Cup on television."  
 \* Co-authored his autobiography "Dirt Road to the Derby" in 1999.

**INTRODUCTION TO RACING:**  
 \* Grew up on a cattle ranch in Arizona. Parents Bill and Ellie Baffert purchased the ranch in 1952, four months before Bob was born.  
 \* At age 12 he groomed and galloped Quarter Horses owned by his father.  
 \* Began training his father's Quarter Horses at Sonoita and Rillito in 1971 while enrolled at the University of Arizona Race Track Industry Program.

**FIRST WINNER:**  
 \* First Quarter Horse win was with Baron at Flagstaff, Ariz., in 1971.  
 \* First Thoroughbred win was with Flipper Star on Jan. 28, 1979 at Rillito Park in Tucson, Ariz.

European trainer Brian Meehan saddled Buy the Sport for the victory, but she was moved into Barbara's barn after the race.

\* Saddled Same Old Wish to victory in the

1996 Kelso Handicap. Same Old Wish later finished third in the 1996 Breeders' Cup Mile at Woodbine at odds of 47-1.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

\* Began at the track as a jockey in 1969.

\* Abandoned race riding after totaling 11 winners in New York in 1970-71 because of his size.

\* Served as the NYRA Outrider for eight years from 1971-79.

\* Worked as an assistant trainer for Steve Schaeffer.

\* Began training for Sabine Stable in early 1985.

#### CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

\* Enjoyed a successful early part of 2002 when Mongoose won the Donn Handicap (Gr. 1) at Gulfstream Park and Buddha won the Wood Memorial (Gr. 1) at Aqueduct.

\* Trained Behrens to four consecutive graded-stakes victories during the early part of 1999, a streak which culminated with the Suburban Handicap at Belmont Park.

\* Behrens was beaten a nose in two high profile races at Saratoga: the 1997 Travers by Deputy Commander and the 1999 Whitney Handicap by Victory Gallop.

\* Assumed training duties for Val's Prince in Fall 1999 and trained the then 7-year-old gelding to back-to-back wins in Grade 1 Belmont Park races - the Man o' War and the Turf Classic Invitational.

\* Won with 27 percent of his starters at Saratoga in 1997. He was second to John Kimmel's 28 percent.

\* Won the 1996 Travers with Will's Way. He beat eventual Top 3-Year-Old Skip Away.

\* Saddled L'Carriere to a seven-length upset of favored Unaccounted For in the 1995 Saratoga Cup to highlight a season that included six victories and a game second to Cigar in the \$3 million Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

\* Started galloping horses when he was 11.

\* Took out his trainer's license when he was 16.

\* Several years ago, on the advice of his aunt, he decided to play up his famous name (shared with the fictional secret agent in Ian Fleming's movies and novel series) and now sends all his horses to train wearing saddle-cloths bearing the "007" logo.

\* Owns a 50-acre farm in Victor, N.Y., named Song Hill and a home in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

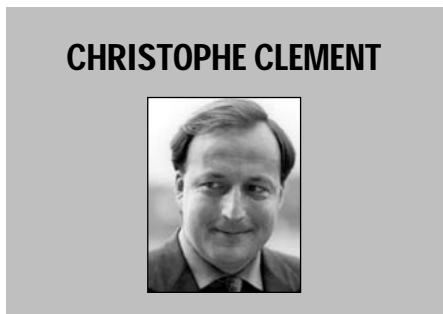
