His last role at the merged bank was to head the Global FX Research team out of London, providing regular advise on how to trade around 40 currencies across the globe. In that capacity, he developed several insightful trading models that continue to outperform more traditional alternatives in the FX world. Prior to his London assignment, he was the Head of Research of the Emerging Markets Proprietary Trading Group, a team investing JPMorgan's own capital across all EM asset classes. He joined JPMorgan in 1994 and spent his first two years at the bank as the country economist for Argentina and Chile based in New York. His work has been recognized with the awards: Central Bank Governor of the year, 2004 (Euromoney), Best country economist for Argentina: Institutional Investor (1994-98) and Latin Finance (1997-98).
