



UC San Diego, situated on 1,200 acres of coastal woodland overlooking the Pacific Ocean, is a powerful magnet for those seeking a fresh, next-generation approach to education, research and community service. Since its founding just four decades ago, UCSD has rapidly achieved the status of one of the top institutions in the nation for higher education and research. UCSD's interdisciplinary ethos and tradition of innovation and risk-taking underlie its research strength and ability to recruit top scholars and students.

The UCSD campus is home of the world-renowned Scripps Institution of Oceanography, the San Diego Supercomputer Center, nationally ranked schools of medicine, engineering and international relations, as well as outstanding arts and humanities, social sciences, physical sciences and biology programs.

In the National Research Council's benchmark 1995 study, UCSD faculty was ranked 10th best in the nation. UCSD ranks 7th in the nation in National Academy of Sciences membership and Change Magazine ranks UCSD 7th in the nation in knowledge creation. Sixteen members of the UCSD faculty have won the Nobel Prize, nine of who are current faculty members. In addition, nine faculty members have received MacArthur Foundation "Genius" awards and 146 have been recipients of Guggenheim Foundation fellowships. UCSD faculty have also been awarded the Pulitzer Prize, Fields Medal, National Humanities Medal, Balzan Prize, National Medal of Science, Kyoto Prize and the Enrico Fermi award, among others.

As a campus that views boundaries as frontiers, UCSD is well placed to continue to lead the nation in new interdisciplinary studies of bioinformatics, wireless communications, molecular biology, social sciences and the confluence of technology and the arts.

Economic Impacts

With annual revenues of \$1.8 billion, UCSD is the single largest employer in San Diego and a major engine for economic growth.

UCSD's national economic impact last year was \$5.1 billion, more than 15 times the initial state of California contribution of \$335.1 million. This \$5.1 billion resulted in the creation of 319,000 jobs nationwide.

UCSD's annual research funding is \$627 million. The National Science Foundation ranks UCSD 1st in the UC system and 6th in the nation in federal R&D expenditures.

With 22,790 employees, including 6,404 faculty and academic employees and 16,386 staff, UCSD has a monthly payroll of \$71 million.

Close to 200 San Diego companies have been founded by faculty and alumni of UCSD. More than 40 percent of the people employed in the San Diego biotech/biomed industry work in UCSD spin-offs.
