CONFERENCE SPEAKERS

Mr. Michael Brearley - Cured by Love?

Technique and character in Psychoanalytic work and beyond.

Michael Brearley works in private practice as a Psychoanalyst in London. He is currently Chair of the Section for the Application of Psychoanalysis. He teaches and has given papers on a range of psychoanalytic and applied topics. Before training with the British Society, he was a lecturer in philosophy at the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne from 1968 to 1971, and a professional cricketer, captaining England between 1977 and 1981. He wrote *The Art of Captaincy* (1985), revised edition, (2001). He writes occasionally on cricket for *The Observer* newspaper.

Dr. Michael Parsons – External and Internal aspects of Clinical Technique.

Michael Parsons is a Training and Supervising Analyst of the British Society, and works in private practice in London. He is the author of *The Dove that Returns, The Dove that Vanishes: Paradox and Creativity in Psychoanalysis* (2000) and co-editor of the collected papers of Enid Balint under the title *Before I was I: Psychoanalysis and the Imagination* (1993).

Dr. Rosine Perelberg – Space and Time in Psychoanalytic Listening

Rosine Jozef Perelberg is a Training and Supervising Analyst of the British Society. She is currently Chair of the Curriculum Committee and serves on the Admissions and Education Committees of the Institute of Psychoanalysis. She is Honorary Senior Lecturer in Psychoanalytic Theory at University College, London. She co-edited with Joan Raphael-Leff *Female Experience: Three generations of British women psychoanalysts on work with women* (1997). She has edited *Psychoanalytic Understanding of Violence and Suicide* (1998), *Dreaming and Thinking* (2000; 2003) and *Freud: A Modern Reader* (2005).

Dr. John Steiner – Transference Now and Then

John Steiner is a Training and Supervising Analyst of the British Society and works in private practice as a Psychoanalyst. He was formerly a Consultant Psychiatrist in Psychotherapy at the Maudsley Hospital, and from 1972 until his retirement in 1996, at the Tavistock Clinic. He is the author of several psychoanalytic papers and a book entitled *Psychic Retreats* (1993).

Mrs. Margaret Rustin – Analytic work with children and adolescents, reflections on current dilemmas.

Margaret Rustin is an Honorary Member of the British Society, Consultant Child Psychotherapist and Head of Child Psychotherapy at the Tavistock Clinic. She has written widely on child psychotherapeutic practice, co-editing and contributing to *Closely Observed Infants* (1989), *Psychotic States in Children* (1997) and *Assessment in Child Psychotherapy* (2000).
