GRADE 12 OPTIONAL PROVINCIAL EXAMS

The B.C. Provincial Government (Ministry of Education) has designated all grade 12 Provincial exams, with the exception of Language Arts 12 (English 12 & Communications 12) and BC First Nations Studies, as OPTIONAL for students on the 2004 Graduation Program. It is the student's decision, not the school's, whether to write the optional Provincial exams.

NOTE: English 12 & Communications 12 exams are REQUIRED.

Optional exams are offered in the following courses at Lambrick Park:

Biology 12 History 12 French 12

Chemistry 12 Geography 12 Spanish 12

Physics 12 Math 12 (Principles, Applications & Essentials)

Students who are registered for an optional exam but who do not attend the exam sitting will receive their school mark as their final mark for the course.

Students who are registered for an optional exam and who sign in for the exam, *regardless of whether they answer any of the questions*, will be considered to have made an exam attempt. Once an attempt has been made the exam will count toward the final mark, i.e., students can not opt to take their school mark only once they have attempted the exam. This attempt will count for 40 percent of the student's final letter grade for the course. It is **extremely important** that students are aware of the implications of signing in for and attempting an exam.

If writing an optional provincial exam causes a student's final grade in a course to drop below 50%, graduation status may be affected.

OPTIONAL PROVINCIAL EXAMS & POST-SECONDARY REQUIREMENTS

University of Victoria & Camosun College

Currently, both Camosun College & UVic encourage students to write their provincial exams, but they don't require them. If students choose to write provincial exams, these institutions will use the higher score of EITHER the student's final class mark, OR their final, blended mark (class mark + provincial exam mark combined).

UBC, SFU & some BC Colleges

Provincial exams <u>are</u> required for September 2008 entrance to the University of BC, Simon Fraser University & some BC colleges.

Students & parents are advised to check with the specific institution if they are considering any other post-secondary schools.

OPTIONAL PROVINCIAL EXAMS & SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Students <u>must</u> write optional provincial exams in order to be considered for the BC Government's Provincial Examinations Scholarships. Students must achieve scores of at least 86% on at least 3 provincial exams to be eligible for these \$1000 scholarships.

Provincial Exams are not required for UVic Entrance Scholarships.
