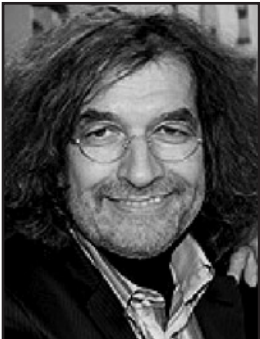

DoRo Produktion is a film company based in Vienna, Austria. DoRo was named after the surnames of founders **Rudi Dolezal** and **Hannes Rossacher**.

Dolezal and Rossacher, also known as “Torpedo Twins”, first started producing television series for Austrian and German stations. Dolezal and Rossacher gained international acclaim and won several awards for their music videos for artists such as Queen, The Rolling Stones, David Bowie, Miles Davis, Michael Jackson, Bon Jovi, Whitney Houston, Bruce Springsteen, Falco and Frank Zappa, as well as several German and Austrian acts such as Trio, Marius Müller-Westernhagen, and Herbert Grönemeyer.

Furthermore, DoRo produced numerous acclaimed documentaries, mostly on musicians, bands and similarly music-related topics.

## EXECUTIVE PRODUCERS:



**Alex Sino** – Executive producer for Leonid Agutin Studio and Ole Records since 1997. For over 7 years is acting as an executive producer for American guitar legend Al Di Meola. Notable projects: “Leonid Agutin – live music is alive” – 2000 (Executive Producer, lyricist), “Leonid Agutin and Al Di Meola – live in Moscow” 2001 (Executive producer), “Cosmopolitan Life” – 2005 (executive producer, lyricist), “Vocal Rendezvous with Al Di Meola” – 2007 (Executive Producer, lyricist), “Cosmopolitan Live – DVD” (Executive Producer, lyricist)



**Claude Nobs** – 40 years ago in 1967, he organized the first jazz festival known today to all music lovers as MONTREUX JAZZ FESTIVAL. In 1971, the group Deep Purple decided to produce and record their album Machine Head in Montreux. This act earned him a mention (as Funky Claude) in the song Smoke on the Water, which is about the incident of fire happened at the time of the recording during Frank Zappa concert. Also, on the inner liner of the original album, Nob's picture was the only one labeled with a name other than those of the band members themselves.

In 1973, Nobs became the director of the Swiss branch of Warner, Elektra and Atlantic. On the live Jethro Tull album Bursting Out (recorded May 28, 1978 in Berne), one can hear Nobs announcing “...herzlich willkommen in Festhalle Bern !” (Welcome to the Festhall of Berne). During the 1990s, Nobs shared the directorship of the festival with Quincy Jones, and made Miles Davis an honorary host. The festival continued to diversify, and was no longer exclusively devoted to jazz. In 2005, the festival attracted more than 200,000 visitors. At the same year, Claude Nobs invited Al Di Meola and Leonid Agutin to perform at Montreux Jazz Festival.



**Jurgen Otterstein** – is the multiple musical Awards winner. He had top executive positions in the European recording industry such as managing director of EastWest Records in Germany. He was a manager for Sarah Brightman, Chris de Burgh, Josh Groban and other artists. Jurgen was the producer and the creator of the multi platinum duet of Sarah Brightman and Andrea Bocelli “Time to say Goodbye”.
