ARTISTIC MANAGING DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



A NEW YEAR

Once again we are presenting a thrilling show as part of the PuSh Festival—this time with The Cultch as a partner. But this presentation also marks the retirement of our long-time Production Manager Michael Wood after 33 years at the Arts Club. Michael started at Seymour Street as a stage carpenter and was involved with the transition to the Granville Island Stage in the fall of 1979. Soon after

our arrival here he became Production Manager. During his time with the company he oversaw the opening of the Revue Theatre in 1983, the Production Centre (construction shops and design studios) in 1991, and the Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage in 1998. He looked after countless designers, working on over 400 productions at our theatres and on tours. No theatre company our size—building at least a dozen new shows each season—can survive without a flexible, inventive, and farsighted person who can make sure that the creative forces are made real on stage for our audience members. Perhaps even more important, Michael has supported my programming and helped to make real what might have appeared to some as an impossible dream.

One of Michael's final tasks has been planning the renovation of the Revue Theatre for Anosh Irani's *My Granny the Goldfish*, our first production that will open the theatre in mid-April. So Michael's time with us will come full circle: from the intimate 200-seat Seymour Street Arts Club to the intimate 200-seat New Revue Stage. Thank you, Michael.

discussion about responsibility, roles, and accountability.



DIRECTOR'S NOTES



The line between fact and fiction, dreams and reality, life and death has always been blurry in the work of Poe. This was also the case in his life. Sometimes he deliberately re-created himself, revising the details of his youth or painting himself as an adventurer. Sometimes others reinvented him, as his arch-rival Rufus Griswold did when he wrote his own slanderous biography. And sometimes—not so deliberately—he was tormented by nightmarish hallucinations and haunted by memories that were no less real to him than the fact of his existence. It's difficult to

read Poe's work today without hearing echoes of his own tragic life. It's equally tempting to believe his tales and poems offer insight into the man himself. It remains impossible, though, to ever know his full story. In the end, he will always, to some degree, be someone we create in our own imaginations: a mixture of fact and fiction. This is where *Nevermore* begins. It is a version of Poe's story that unfolds according to the logic of dreams, where the lines between his life and his work remain fluid and where, as Poe himself said, "all that we see or seem is but a dream within a dream".

Production History

Nevermore—The Imaginary Life and Mysterious Death of Edgar Allan Poe, was developed in celebration of the bicentenary of Poe's birth (January 19, 1809). Jonathan Christenson and Bretta Gerecke have long shared an interest in Poe's work and world, and it seemed ideal in this anniversary year to celebrate the literary genius often described as the father of crime fiction. After two early development phases in Banff and at Keyano Theatre in Fort McMurray, Nevermore ran for three weeks in Edmonton in May 2009, followed by a



tour to the National Arts Centre in Ottawa as part of the Magnetic North Festival, and the Winter Garden Theatre in Toronto as part of Luminato. Following its run in Vancouver, Nevermore will be returning to Edmonton for its second run in Catalyst's own venue.
