THE WHITBREAD BOOK AWARDS

The Whitbread Book Awards were established in 1971 and encouraged, promoted and celebrated the enjoyment of reading.

There are six awards:

- Novel Award, First Novel Award, Biography Award, Poetry Award and Children's Book Award winners (£5,000 each)
- Book of the Year (selected from five winners above): £25,000
- Total prize fund is £50,000.
