VAUXHALL CONTINUES TITLE SUCCESSES

Vauxhall is celebrating its 17th and 18th Dunlop MSA British Touring Car Championship titles after securing the 2007 driver and manufacturer honours at Thruxton this weekend.

In a nail-biting finale to the season Fabrizio Giovanardi clawed back a nine-point deficit to former championship leader Jason Plato after some exceptional driving in the Vauxhall Vectra.

With eight touring car titles to his name, Giovanardi is now firmly recognised as one of the greatest touring car drivers of all time, and Vauxhall is delighted the Italian will be coming back in 2008 to defend his title.

'This is great for Vauxhall, for VX Racing and for all the people who have helped me get here," said Giovanardi. "Roberto Ravaglia has seven titles so I think now I have more than any other driver! It's very special because it was very big effort to win this one. Working hard for something makes it more special.

After two 1-2 finishes for Giovanardi and Plato early in the day, 2007's BTCC racing culminated in a dramatic final round as the two title protagonists started side-by-side on the grid with just one point separating them in the title table.

Giovanardi launched off the line and into third by the first corner as Plato found himself locked in a gruelling battle with VX Racing's Tom Chilton.

"For me it was very stressful before the start and then again in the end," said Giovanardi.

"I thought I was in trouble with my tyres so when I saw Jason try to make everything to try and catch me it was very stressful. One lap more might have been a different result.'

The team was full of praise for Chilton and the instrumental role he played in the third race following his great pass on Plato in the opening stages. His Vauxhall Vectra remained under intense pressure, however, with Plato getting alongside at one point, raising a gasp around the packed Hampshire circuit.

<mark>"It's mega; couldn't have been any better!"</mark> said Chilton, who held off Plato's advances for a hard-won third place. "It's been a perfect weekend for me except for the puncture in race one.

I've had pole position, registered fastest lap and ended on the podium.

"I've helped my team-mate out on several occasions and I'm really pleased for him and for Vauxhall. They deserved it and it feels fantastic to be

part of that."

Here, some of the past champions give their reactions to the BTCC's latest champion Fabrizio Giovanardi, and the team effort that helped him to his eighth touring car title.

"It went down to the wire and it was a bit nip and tuck but I think Fabrizio was probably cooler and calmer than Jason. I was happy Vauxhall won it and I was happy Fabrizio won it. He's an international champion and it's good

for the championship that it's got an international flavour. "He's won many titles in the past but the BTCC has always been regarded highly by any touring car driver in the world. It's the one they want to win. It's an amazing feeling."

"It's been a great championship and Fabrizio is a great champion. We've had some great battles all year and it was down to the best two drivers. He's a worthy winner."

You only know how much it means when you see the trophy that they present. The list of names like Franck Gardner and Win Percy; you reel off the names and it's very special to have your name on the end. Fabrizio has

been a massive name over the last decade in touring cars and fully deserves his place on that special trophy."

Some of Vauxhall's VXR Racing Driver of the Year finalists got their first insider-view of a racing paddock after being shown around Thruxton by Vauxhall's Dunlop MSA British Touring Car Championship (BTCC) works team last weekend. The competitors were trackside Saturday and Sunday, learning the ropes as the prestigious team battled to secure BTCC title honours.

"It was the busiest meeting of the year for us," said Giovanardi, after winning the BTCC Driver title. "They got a very good taste of what racing is like; something different to do every minute!

"I had a good talk with a few of them and they all want this prize very much. I don't blame them; this kind of thing could be very helpful to someone wanting to get into racing todav.'

Thruxton is actually my favourite circuit in the UK. I championship? have many, many very good memories from here. In 1998. Thruxton was hosting the season opener and I was racing for victory against Rickard Rydell. We overtook each other over and over again and on the last lap it started to snow, and I won the race.

How did you get on with VX Racing?

"I know many people in the team as I raced for the Renault Williams touring car team in 1992 and with some of the same operational staff, so it's great to be back in the championship with the team!"



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What is your best memory of the BTCC? The best memory is definitely winning my first title as I came second in the previous three years and it was a long time coming."

You have competed in so many championship and prestigious races, such as Le Mans. Which in your

opinion is the best? The BTCC in the early 90s was definitely the best championship ever around. It was like a mini world championship as we had so many experienced drivers and nine manufacturers. It was great racing!

What's next on your agenda? Would you like to

return to the BTCC for a full season? "If the offer came up I would definitely like to do it again. however, I will probably stay in World Touring Cars next year as I'm still missing the world title."
