### **City of Miami Commissioner, Spence-Jones Scores A Win For Her District**



MIAMI - City of Miami Commissioners have unanimously voted to take the first steps toward securing potentially up to a half billion dollars over twenty years in financing for the redevelopment of Overtown/Park West. Funds would be obtained by bonding out the revenues of the Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA).

At today's city commission meeting the city's chief financial officer estimated that over \$100 million in bonds could be issued within one year. In response, city commissioners unanimously directed Miami's city manager to begin the process. Use of the these funds would be restricted to eliminating slum and blight in Overtown/Park West.

Earlier, sitting as the CRA Board, Miami City Commissioners adopted a finding of Necessity Study that would result in the expansion of the CRA boundaries. The next step is for the City of Miami to review the study and forward it to Miami-Dade County to approve the expansion and extension of the life of the CRA.

According to Commissioner Spence-Jones, "these findings demonstrate what we already know there is considerable slum and blight surrounding the existing redevelopment boundaries that must be addressed if we are to be successful in revitalizing Overtown/Park West. If we can support the major projects slated for downtown Miami, then we can do the same for the areas that have the most need."

She went on to state: "I am pleased with the support shown by my colleagues and hope that the City and Miami-Dade County will quickly follow the actions of the CRA and demonstrate their commitment to seeing Overtown and Park West revitalized as a cultural destination where businesses and families thrive."

The City of Miami Gardens has a Mayor-Council-Manager form of government. Under this form of government, the elected City Council sets policies for the operation of the City. The City Council enacts Ordinances, the laws of the City, adopts Resolutions authorizing actions on behalf of the City, reviews plans for development, and establishes the policies by which the City is governed.

The City Council consists of seven members: a Mayor and two Council members elected citywide and four additional Council members elected by individual districts. The administrative responsibility of the City rests with the City Manager, who is appointed by the City Council (upon recommendation of the Mayor). Each Councilmember is elected to a four-year term.







(Miami-Dade County, FL) --Commissioner Barbara J. Jordan hosted two information sessions on Thursday, March 12, 2009 regarding opportunities for small business owners in the event the Marlins Stadium contract is approved by the City of Miami and Miami-Dade County. The sessions were held at Florida Memorial University, with approximately 350 people total in attendance. David Samson, President of the Florida Marlins, and other representatives from the team and Hunt/Moss, construction manager, addressed both companies registered as part of the Miami-Dade Community Small Business Enterprise (CSBE) and other companies interested in becoming certified on bidding opportunities.

"Both the County and City of Miami still have to cast their votes on the fate of the Marlins Stadium, but it's important that we give small businesses and construction companies a chance to prepare should this project become a reality," said Commissioner Jordan. "We need to give these companies a 'heads up' to take advantage of any job opportunities that may come their way."

Currently, the City of Miami is scheduled to vote on the Marlins Stadium contract on March 19. The Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners is scheduled to vote on the project on March 23.



### Young Volunteers Nurture "Green" Projects



Recycling, animal conservancy and landscaping projects flourished with the help of Miami Job Corps Center (MJCC) youth in 2008.

In the fall of 2008, the center bridged alliances with an animal conservation program in South Florida's Redlands. Home to monkeys that once aided medical research for blindness, the Dumond Conservancy now serves as a refuge for these animals. Volunteers from Miami Job Corps Landscaping program planted fruit trees and a large vegetable garden for the monkeys. The project came to fruition through MJCC's alliance with United Way of Miami Dade's Hands on Miami, which is the largest volunteer service agency in all of South Florida. Throughout the year the conservancy also benefits from its volunteer partnerships with The University of Miami and South Ridge High School.



This past spring, Miami Job Corps had its youth rolling up their sleeves once again; this time for the cause of aiding the Habitat for Humanity Restore of Greater Miami. This socially conscious retailer channels its proceeds from donated building materials sales into its humanitarian home building initiatives. The Restore benefits from volunteers, such as skilled helpers from Miami Job Corps Carpentry program. "Habitat does so many good things in the community, we were glad to step in and unload boxes, organize merchandise and help out with deliveries," said Aleyda Rodriguez, MJCC's Carpentry Instructor."

program youth had the chance to make

they live and attend school. The volunteers spent 2 days at the City of Miami
Gardens Police department (CMGPD)
landscaping and beautifying the building's exteriors this past winter. With

Job Corps Community Service Projects like these are pillars for community development. Beyond offering hands on vocational training for youth with cost free labor to non profit/government agencies, they are essential for building lasting community alliances.



# U.S. Rep. Kendrick B. Meek (D-FL) Calls for Full Inquiry into Medical Mistakes at the Miami Veterans Affairs Healthcare Center

MIAMI GARDENS, FL - On March 23, the Miami Veterans Affairs Healthcare System (MVAHS) notified Congressman Kendrick Meek that between May 2004 and March 12, 2009 approximately 3,260 veterans who received a colonoscopy using endoscopic equipment at the Miami VA were exposed to possible risks of hepatitis B, hepatitis C, and HIV.

This occurred because attached tubing to the colonoscopy equipment was apparently not serviced and sterilized according to the manufacturer's guidelines. Approximately 2,500 former patients are believed to be in the Miami area and letters are being mailed today to those veterans asking them to under-

go tests at the Miami VA Medical Center, the Broward County VA Clinic, the Homestead VA Clinic and the Key West VA Clinic.

Upon learning of the situation this morning, Congressman Kendrick B. Meek (D-FL) spoke with Eric K. Shinseki, Secretary of the Department of Veterans Affairs and Mary Berrocal, Director of the Miami VA Healthcare System to learn the latest facts of the situation, thank them for their renewed effort, and also recommend that a regional, statewide and if need be, a national door to door campaign be adopted to notify the veterans that their health status may be comprised because of the procedure they underwent. Rep. Meek also requested an Official Inquiry into the matter by Mr. George Opfer, Inspector General of the VA in Washington, DC.

"Given the awful circumstances, the Miami VA Healthcare system has acted expeditiously to notify veterans of this personal health and public health danger. Needless to say, hepatitis B, hepatitis C, and HIV are communicable and what may affect as many as 3,260 individuals could quickly expand to include a


much larger pool of people. While we can never adequately pay back our veterans for their service to our country and dedication to the uniform they wore, we can try to assist by providing them with the top level of medical care they deserve. The VA is a model of the type of healthcare we provide our veterans and when mistakes like this occur, it undermines the efficacy of the entire system," said Rep. Meek in his letter to the Inspector General of the VA in Washington, DC.

"Infection control is a critical concern for patients, as well as healthcare workers. Infection control measures are designed to combat everything from the spread of colds and flu to hepatitis B and C, SARS, HIV/AIDS, and other potentially life threatening diseases. That, somehow, these standard protocols were not followed will undoubtedly leave our veterans with serious misgivings about our VA system despite everything you've done in a very short time to give them renewed confidence. I know you are acting quickly to find and test the 3,260 patients. We share in the hope that these veterans are found to be healthy and safe," said Rep. Meek in his letter to VA Secretary Shinseki.

The MVAHS has set up a Special Care Call Center that is available seven days a week, 24 hours a day. Veterans may call (305) 575-7256 or toll free 1(877) 575-7256 to speak with health care staff who will be available to answer their questions and schedule an appointment for either blood test screening or to see a provider. Additionally, the MVAHS has established a Special Care Program which includes an information center which includes an information center and Special Care Clinics that are available at the Miami VA Medical Center, the Broward County VA Clinic, the Homestead VA Clinic and the Key West VA Clinic. If the veteran is located outside South Florida, the MVAHS will arrange for them to receive service at a VA facility most convenient to them. Wherever veterans receive service related to this issue, there will be no co-payment associated with the appointment or testing.

U.S. Rep. Kendrick B. Meek represents the 17th Congressional District of Florida which includes parts of Miami-Dade and Broward Counties. He serves as the lone Democratic Floridian sitting on the House Committee on Ways and Means.

# Commissioner Joe A. Martinez Unveils "Ashley Valdes Street" to Honor Local Girl Killed in Hit-and-Run Accident



(Miami-Dade County, FL) -Surrounded by Ashley Nicole Valdes'
family and friends, Commissioner Joe
A. Martinez unveiled "Ashley Valdes
Street" on Wednesday, March 4, 2009
at the southeast corner of SW 152
Avenue and SW 80 Street. A portion of
SW 80 Street between SW 147 Avenue
and SW 152 Avenue was named after
the 11-year-old girl who was killed in a
hit-and-run accident this past January.
The ceremony took place on what
would have been Ashley's twelfth birthday.

Ashley's story made local headlines when she was struck and killed by a pick-up truck while walking home from an after-school program on January 8, 2009. After an eight-day search and dozens of tips from concerned residents, police were able to identify the suspect and arrest him. Although her death was untimely, Ashley had already touched the lives of many in her neighborhood. She was a source of help for her mother, Adonay Rosete, who was a single mother and

studying to be a paramedic. When not in school, Ashley spent much of her time taking care of her younger sister Amanda, who is mentally disabled. She was also very involved in school activities, and was known for her love of animals.

Ashley's death sparked a new Miami-Dade alert system on January 21, 2009. County Mayor Carlos A. Alvarez joined Commission Vice-Chairman Jose "Pepe" Diaz and the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD) Director Robert Parker to announce the launch of the Ashley Nicole Valdes Public Safety Alerts program, which notifies subscribers of current public safety events in which community assistance is being sought. Text alerts can be instantaneously sent to any cell phone or mobile device with information on crimes that just occurred, major events that involve multiple road closures, or child abductions. Anyone can sign up for the text alerts online at

"This was an emotional day for Ashley's family and residents in this neighborhood," said Commissioner Martinez. "My heart goes out to her loved ones. While they can never get Ashley back, I hope they take some comfort that her name will serve as a reminder to drive safely."








# MAYOR CARLOS ALVAREZ UNVEILS 2008 YEAR-END CRIME STATISTICS

Miami-Dade County Mayor
Carlos Alvarez and Miami-Dade Police
Department Director Robert Parker
announced the 2008 year-end crime
statistics for unincorporated MiamiDade County, on February 18, 2009, at
the Miami-Dade County Police
Department Headquarters. Officials
announced that crime continues to
decline throughout unincorporated
Miami-Dade County. Forcible sex
offenses are down 16%; motor vehicle
thefts are down 9%; burglaries are
down 5%; and robberies are down 4%
from last year.

"It has been a challenging year, but we are keeping crime in check. In the three areas where a police presence has the highest impact - robberies, burglaries and auto thefts - we saw reductions. We continue to focus on areas of concern and are using a number of strategies to stay one step ahead of criminals," said Mayor Alvarez.

During the news conference, Mayor Alvarez also revealed the successful results from the Gun Bounty Program, which makes it possible for residents to get a \$1,000 reward for turning in someone with an illegal gun. To date, 266 illegal guns have been seized, which resulted in 165 arrests. The Mortgage Fraud Task Force's efforts, which combines education, legislation and regulation with law enforcement, has resulted in more than 100 arrests. Hundreds more cases are under investigation.

# MAYOR MANNY DIAZ PRAISES PRESIDENT OBAMA FOR COMING TO THE AID OF SMALL BUSINESSES

# FIVE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS RECOGNIZED IN THE COLLEGE BOARD'S 'AP REPORT TO THE NATION'

Five Miami-Dade County public schools are among 16 schools across the nation being recognized for increasing access to Advanced Placement (AP) courses among traditionally underserved students. The College Board released their fifth annual "AP Report to the Nation" today. The public schools earned the distinction of having the largest number of African American and/or Hispanic students from the class of 2008 achieving success (a score of 3 or higher) on specific AP Exams.

- " Barbara Goleman Senior High School had the largest number of Hispanic students achieving success on the AP Art History Exam.
- " Coral Reef Senior High School had the largest number of Hispanic students achieving success on the AP English Language, AP English Literature, and AP European History Exams.
- " Design and Architecture Senior High School had the largest number of African American and Hispanic students achieving success on the AP Studio Art Exam.

" Miami Killian Senior High School had the largest number of Hispanic students achieving success on the AP Human Geography Exam.

" Miami Palmetto Senior High School had the largest number of Hispanic students achieving success on the AP Environmental Science Exam.

AP prepares students for college success and helps offset college costs. Research shows that AP students are much more likely to earn a bachelor's degree in four years than their peers. Participation and success in AP courses also helps students qualify for college scholarships.

The College Board is a notfor-profit membership association whose mission is to connect students to college success and opportunity. The College Board's AP program offers 37 courses and exams and provides students with the opportunity to take college-level courses and earn college credit or placement, while still in high school.

### Chairman Moss' Press Conference Generates \$50,000 for The Liberty City Shootings Crime Stoppers Reward Fund

On Thursday, January 29, 2009, Chairman Dennis C. Moss held a press conference to announce that the reward amount for information leading up to the arrest/s of the suspect/s responsible for the recent Liberty City shootings went up to \$50,000. Commissioners Dorrin D. Rolle, Audrey M. Edmonson, and Barbara J. Jordan joined Chairman Moss to implore the community to come forward with information. Commissioners Katy Sorenson, Carlos A. Gimenez, and Rebeca Sosa were also present in support of their colleagues. Members of the Florida State delegation also expressed their concern and pleaded for residents who may have information to reveal it as soon as possible. Miami-Dade Police Director Robert Parker and Crime Stoppers Executive Director Richard Masten stressed their commitment to finding the person responsible for this terrible crime.

"We offer our condolences to the family of the victims and we want them to know that we are united as a community and that these constant and senseless killings have got to stop!" stated Chairman Moss who has hosted numerous anti-crime rallies in neighborhoods throughout his commission dis-

From their discretionary funds, Miami-Dade Mayor Carlos A. Alvarez, Chairman Moss, and Commissioner Rolle donated \$7,500 to Crime Stoppers reward fund. Commissioner Edmonson donated \$5,000 and Commissioner Jordan \$7,000, increasing the reward amount to \$50,000 as Comp USA and a federal agency who did not want to be recognized came up with the difference.

Brandon Mills, 16, and Derrick Gloster, 18, were killed when someone fired a barrage of bullets into a crowd on a Liberty City corner on January 23. "We know that somebody saw or knows something," exclaimed Commissioner Rolle. It was in his district where the tragedy occurred. On January 28, both

he and Commissioner Edmonson went door to door and handed out prepaid postage cards to Liberty City residents so they could mail in tips about the shooting, or any other criminal activity, anonymously. "The no snitch policy must end," declared Edmonson. "We are in the beginning of a new era, let's act like it and let's stop the black on black crime."

"For the last three years I have been trying to get the U.S. Congress to reinstate the federal weapons ban," said Commissioner Jordan. The state representatives present affirmed their support to ban assault weapons.

Detectives believe the Liberty City gunman/men used an AK-47, a weapon designed for warfare. "On September 12, 2004, police officer Kenya Hubert was shot and killed with an assault weapon, just a day before the ban expired," added Parker. "On September 13, 2007, Officer Jose Somohano was also killed with a high-powered firearm."

"Today, I tell the family or friends of the perpetrator/s to urge them to go to their pastor or priest and turn themselves in," stressed Commissioner Jordan. "You or your child could be the next victim."

"Thirty-five agencies are looking for the suspect/s," added Director Parker. "You will be apprehended."

Crime Stoppers Executive
Director Richard Masten reiterated
that for the past 28 years callers'
identities are zealously protected.
"Callers are given "tip" numbers that
they can later use to anonymously
collect a reward. We don't ask for
your name and can't even tell where
you're calling from," Masten added.
"We don't have Caller I.D."

City of Miami Commissioner Michelle Spence-Jones cast her vote for the Marlins Stadium because of two important factors: 1) to ensure that the promises and commitments made to Overtown/Park West by the City and County are kept and 2) that businesses and residents in her district benefit from the project during construction and throughout the life of the stadium's operation.

The Marlins agreed to support these principles by amending the agreement to include: a minimum of 50 percent of jobs for City of Miami and Dade County residents; union participation that includes apprenticeship programs and training; support for small businesses and contractors; support for City parks and youth programs; and penalties that will go into a trust fund to benefit small businesses and youth programs.

"I am extremely happy with the outcome of today's meeting; three weeks ago I would not have supported the baseball stadium because it did not benefit the residents of my



district and the City of Miami. Today I can truly say that based on the Marlins stepping up to the plate and amending the agreement, that the building of the baseball stadium will truly benefit the community."

Over the last three weeks
Commissioner Spence-Jones has met
with several community stakeholders,
city and county officials, organized
laborers, the Marlins organization, small
contractors and her constituents to
address the issues and concerns with
the agreement.

"Our building industry is on its death bed, our unemployment rate is out of control and our families are hurting. The baseball stadium provides a stimulus to job creation and this is about jobs, jobs, and jobs," said Commissioner Spence-Jones "A deal of this nature is not perfect and voting to approve this project does not insure that it will happen. There are multiple challenges that this project faces but it is one of many major construction projects ready to move forward to employ some of our unemployed workers and struggling small businesses".

# OPA-LOCKA MAYOR KELLEY SWORN-IN AS PRESIDENT MIAMI-DADE BLACK CAUCUS OF ELECTED OFFICIALS

Kelley and Commissioner Dorothy "Dottie" Johnson were among the officers sworn-in at the inception of the Miami-Dade Black Caucus of Local Elected Official (MDBC-LEO), at the First Annual Installation Gala held at Miami Dade Community College, North Campus at 8:00 p.m.

The MDBC-LEO consists of approximately 25 committed members of Black Elected Officials from all over Miami-Dade County, with an anticipated increase in membership due to the interest which followed directly after the installation ceremony. Although he was attributed as the visionary for the local organization, Mayor Kelley stated that several Black officials saw the need, but his willingness to step to the forefront



resulted in establishing the chapter in the latter part of 2008. On this night, Mayor Kelley took the oath of office to serve as President, along with Commissioner Johnson, who was sworn in as the Secretary/Treasurer. Officers will serve for a term of one year, during which time meetings on the fourth Monday of every month will be held at Town Center, 780 Fisherman Street, 2nd Floor, Opa-locka Florida, at 6:30 p.m.

The primary goals of Mayor Kelley this year, will consist of getting the MDBC off to a running start by setting policies, laying the foundation through technology on the internet, reaching out to businesses for support, recruiting membership and promoting participation.

Kelley stated that the local chapter of the Black Caucus is modeled after the State and National Organization, therefore will operate in the Spirit of Excellence. According to Leo E. Longworth, President of the Florida Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials, "Organizations such as ours are created to discuss diverse perspectives and formulate solutions to critical domestic issues confronting the African American Communities." Kelley added that during the embryonic stages, "There is much to accomplish, but before my presidential term is completed, I would like to establish scholarships, schedule summits and develop programs to mentor the young people in our community that are interested in Public Service."

Looking forward to the work ahead, Kelley stated, "We welcome volunteers, and we are recruiting anyone committed addressing the issues in the African-America community." One issue he specifically sited as "a serious problem in our neighborhoods, and is in need of immediate attention, is the use of AK47s." He noted, "On issues of this

Food for the Poor facility where Haitians in need can go to receive food for themselves and their families. Commissioner Rolle was able to distribute food to visitors who attended the facility. The center feeds thousands of Haitians daily.

Commissioner Rolle has been an advocate for providing humanitarian aid to Haiti. Last September, in collaboration with renowned Haitian musician, Sweet Micky, he hosted the successful "HELP FOR HAITI" concert in Miami, which attracted more than 9,000 attendees and collected enough food and supplies for the island to fill two (2) 40-foot shipping container, as well as more than \$30,000 in monetary contributions.

"I am thankful to be able to join with Commissioner Rolle in a way that would positively impact Haitians in Miami and at home," said Sweet Micky.



### TIPS FOR BUYING USED CARS



Shop for newer used cars that still have at least a portion of their original manufacturer's warranty remaining: Most late model used cars have at least three-year/36,000 mile basic warranty coverage (and often longer "powertrain" coverage on the engine and transmission). This means you'll get at least a year or so of peace of mind if you buy a used car that is less than three years old. (Important: Be sure to confirm the used car warranty is fully transferable.)

Check into Certified, Pre-Owned (CPO) vehicles: These are late model used cars and trucks that typically have less than 50,000 miles and have been given multipoint inspections -- with any needed service or upkeep taken care of before the used car is put on the lot. CPO programs are backed by the automakers (Ford, GM, Volvo, etc.) and the vehicles often include a nocost extended warranty on major parts such as the engine and transmission. CPO used cars are usually clean and well-maintained -- the "cream puffs" of the used car market. Do a "background check" for indications that the particular used car make/model you are considering might be a problem car: One with an unusual record of either recalls or consumer complaints. You can find information about recalls and safetyHighway Traffic Safety Administration's Web site (www.nhtsa.dot.gov), and information about consumer satisfaction at JD Power & Associates (see www.jdpower.com/cc/index.jsp ). Consumer Reports is another good place to poke around (go to www.consumerreports.org/main/hom e.jsp and click on "autos"). It's also a very good idea to do a simple Google or Yahoo! Web search; just type in the make and model of the vehicle and "lemon." You can bet if the car has a history of problems. there will be complaints all over the Internet.

4) Ask to see the used cars' service records: If these are available, it's usually a good sign the car was well cared-for, and perhaps more importantly, proof (if the records are complete) that there weren't any unusual repairs or problems. If the used car records are not available, you should be suspicious. It doesn't necessarily mean the used car is a bad car, but you have to wonder why the seller would not have kept such a strong selling point as evidence of proper upkeep and maintenance. In such a case, it is doubly important to have a mechanic you trust give the used car a thorough once-over before you commit to buy.

Lastly, jot down the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN): Located on a stamped plate on the top of the used cars dashboard, and run a CARFAX Vehicle History report to check for used car deal-killers such as evidence of a prior accident, odometer fraud, manufacturer "buy back" (a lemon) and so on. A CARFAX report costs less than \$25, and is well worth the expense.
