Florida State University Varsity Track & Field Team

1996-1999 -- Event: Pole Vault -- 3 varsity letters -- Practice was from September to May and typically met every weekday -- The competition season was from January to May and there was often a track meet on the weekend that would require travel on Friday -- Practice, including recovery time, lasted an average of 3 hours -- 15-25 hours a week.

Elder Care Day Care

1997-1999 -- Volunteered 253 hours -- Center for senior citizens to stay during the day while their adult children, who they live with, are at work -- Did a wide range of activities from helping clients to eat to attending field trips; however most of my time was spent listening and talking to clients -- Would usually volunteer between my morning classes and afternoon track practices.

Florida State University Track & Field Team Community Service Coordinator

1998-1999 school year -- Implemented a volunteer program to work in conjunction with several Tallahassee, Florida community service projects -- The men's and women's track teams had more than 800 volunteer hours for the 1998-1999 school year -- Spent approximately 2-3 hours a week performing this role.

Student-Athlete Advisory Council

1997-1999 seasons -- Florida State University Men's Track & Field Team representative -- A representative from each varsity athletic team is selected by the coaches to participate in this NCAA mandated organization -- Met bimonthly for approximately 2 hours each meeting.

Seminole Ambassador

Joined: 1998 -- The mission of the organization was to recruit and provide information tours to National Merit Students -- Met 1-2 times a month for about 1.5 hours each meeting.

Student Teacher

1998 -- Assistant teacher for a freshmen college class -- one semester for 3 hours a week.
