Hall of Fame

In 1991, Rockhurst High School established its Sports Hall of Fame, which included five charter members who had distinguished themselves as some of the most prominent performers in the school's rich athletic history. Since that time, many more people have been added to this illustrious group, which represents the best of the best for sports achievement at Rockhurst.

Each year, a committee of alumni and coaches reviews candidates submitted from the general alumni base for consideration for induction to the Sports Hall of Fame. Nominations for the Sports Hall of Fame should be forwarded to either the school's Athletic Director or the Alumni Affairs Office.

Guidelines for selection include the following:

- The candidate must have contributed in some great measure to the success of the Rockhurst Athletic Program. Potential inductees include players, coaches, and anyone who benefited the program.
- A player must have lettered and graduated from Rockhurst.
- A player must have graduated from Rockhurst at least fifteen (15) years before nomination to the Sports Hall of Fame.
- Membership on the Sports Hall of Fame Committee will include a four-year term, with no consecutive repeat terms.
- The Rockhurst Athletic Director and Executive Director of Alumni Affairs and Assistant to the President will make appointments to the Sports Hall of Fame Committee.
- Preferably, all inductees should be present for formal recognition. If necessary, posthumous reception by family members or close friends are acceptable.

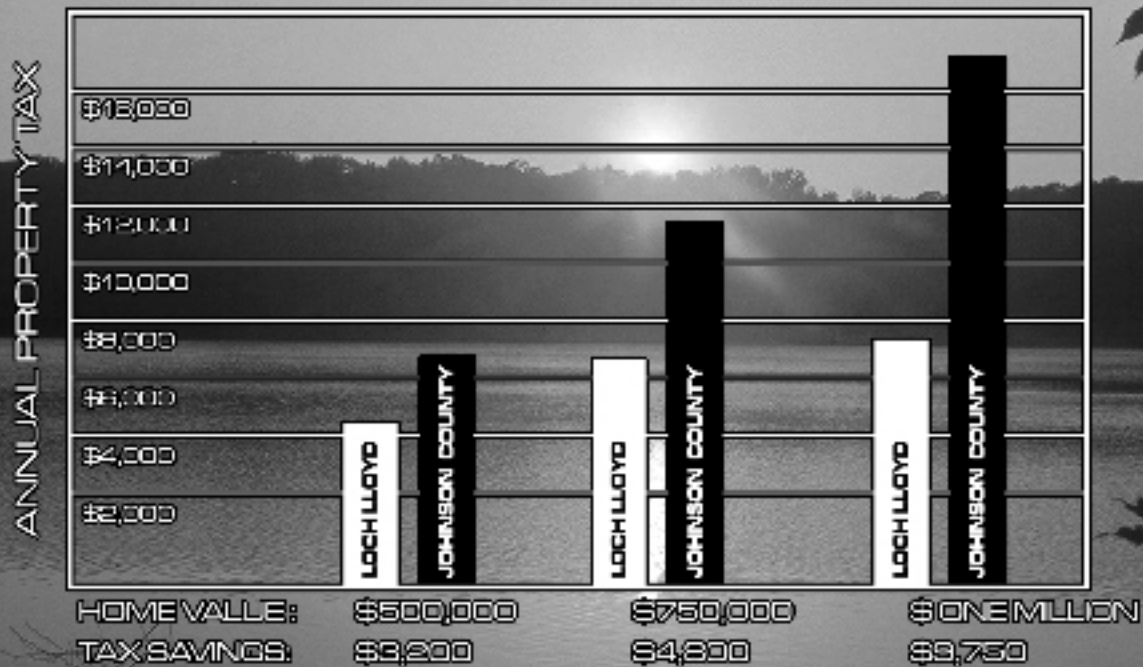

RELOADING

As a mid-July shower poured down outside, the squeaks of rubber against hardwood were loud and constant in the Rockhurst gymnasium. Unable to practice on the grassy fields it was accustomed to, the football team made due indoors for a Friday morning workout.

A walk-through of one particular offensive play involved the tailback taking a half-step one way (squeak), pivoting (squeak) and going another (squeak), as the quarterback faked a handoff and rolled out of the pocket (squeak) in the opposite direction.

Confused? Get in line behind the rest of the opposing metro-area high school defenses.

The 2006 squad is all about misdirection, especially as it learns to adapt to circumstances beyond its control.

Gone are the leaders of old, the ones who led last year's team to a 10-2 record and a state semifinal appearance. No

more David Belfonte. No more Sal Capra. Jerome Jackson and Phil Strozier? Also lost to graduation and scholarships to play on some college campus far, far away from Dasta Memorial Stadium.

Think rebuilding year? Think again.

"We never talk about rebuilding," head coach Tony Severino said. "We always talk about reloading."

And so it will go for a team of youth and inexperience, learning from past mistakes and charging toward future glories.

Last season ended with a 59-39 loss to DeSmet in the state semifinals, a defeat even harder to swallow considering the Hawklets built a 20-0 lead to start the game.

“We had a tough night in the secondary,” Severino said. “But some of our young guys learned that no matter how good an athlete you are, there are other guys out there who are just as capable.”

Injuries to Belfonte and Jackson allowed several of those “young guys” to gain unforeseen playing time that will put them in a better position to succeed this fall.

“The only way you get better is through the experience of playing,” said junior safety Ivan Charbonneau, the team’s second-leading returning tackler.

Another player who benefited from the opportunity to fill-in for an injured starter was tailback Steve Jones. As a junior last season, Jones compiled 525 rushing yards and four touchdowns.

This year, Jones expects more, both from

himself and from his team.

“I want to make the All-State team and have a 1,000 yard season,” Jones said. “And as far as the offense goes, we’ve just got to keep scoring 40 points a game.”

Along with Charbonneau and Jones, Severino said senior quarterback Conner Teahan also would be relied upon based on his performance last fall. Teahan completed 58 percent of his passes for 1,780 yards and 21 touchdowns in 2005.

“This team will take time to develop,” Severino said. “It will have adversity early and how we react to it will determine how we play in the second half of the season.”

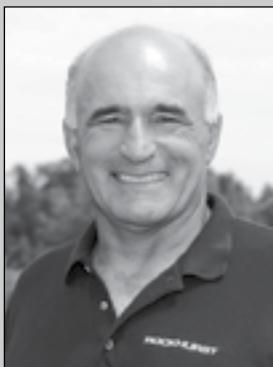
For now, the Hawklets will continue to lead opponents down one path, while moving downfield via another.

Tony Severino

Coach Severino is beginning his 24th year coaching football at Rockhurst. He has already established the most wins by any coach in school history, been inducted into the Missouri Football Coaches Hall of Fame, and been named Missouri Football Coach of the Year in 2002 and USA Today National Coach of the Year in 2000. At RHS, Coach Severino teaches physical education and is involved in many spirit events while also running the annual Rockfest fundraising basketball tournament. He has also coached track and field. Since winning a state championship in

his first year at RHS in 1983, Coach Severino has won a total of six state titles. Previous to Rockhurst he coached at Shawnee Mission West where he coached football and started a baseball program in 1974, winning a state title in 1977. He is the only individual to ever win a state championship in both Kansas and Missouri. He played football at the collegiate level at Kansas State University from 1966-1970. Originally from Cleveland, OH, Tony and his wife Marilyn have three sons: Scott, ('91); Jeff, ('96); Brandon, ('99).

COACHING STAFF BLENDS UNIQUE STYLES AND OUTLOOKS INTO PERFECT SMOOTHIE

Four overtimes into the state semifinal versus Jefferson City in 1989, everyone within a mile radius of the game was on edge.

The tension was suffocating, which made it hard for anyone to speak.

Lucky for the Rockhurst football team, its coaching staff didn't need to share a single word to understand what needed to be done.

"The emotion of that game was back and forth," assistant coach Eric Berg said. "What (the coaching staff) had to do there was more than call plays. We had to handle the emotions of our players."

Whether it was via a glare from Coach Frank Campisano or a bark from Coach John Morris, the Hawklets' collective nerves were held in check. Rockhurst went on to win the game.

"Whenever you have a coaching staff like ours that has been together and knows the program inside out, you don't have to spend time coaching the coaches," head coach Tony Severino said. "We all know what each other is thinking."

After decades of sharing sidelines and strategy sessions, the mainstays on the football team's coaching staff have developed unique roles that fill all ends of the leadership spectrum.

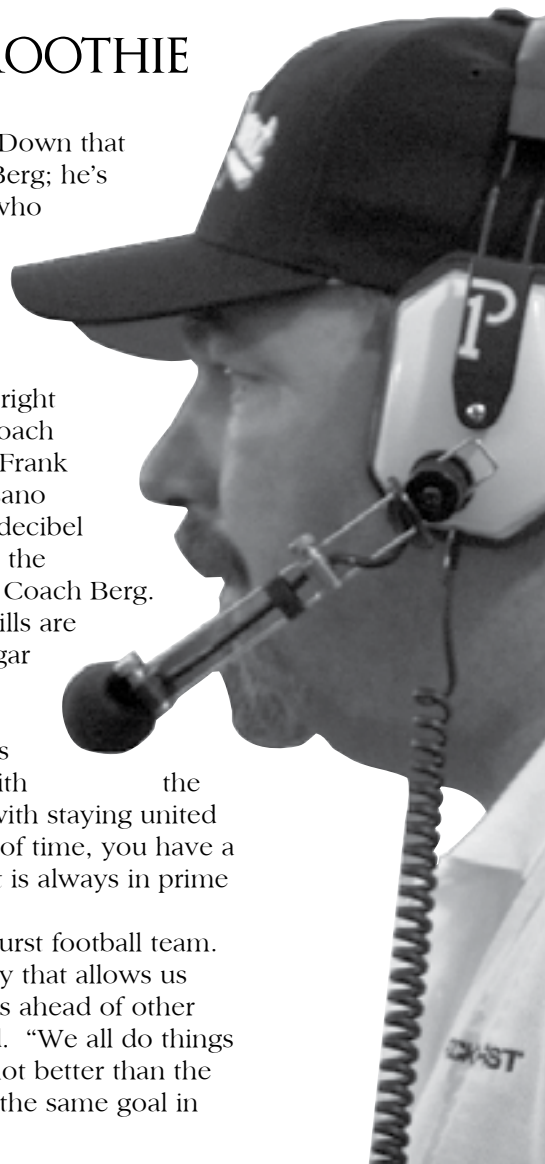
Over there you have the tough love

guy; that's Coach Mo. Down that way you'll find Coach Berg; he's the explainer, the one who really wants you to understand why you're doing whatever it is you're being asked to do.

The mustache twins right there, they would be Coach Campisano and Coach Frank Lyngar. Coach Campisano combines the elevated decibel level of Coach Mo with the clarifying tendencies of Coach Berg. And if repetition and drills are your fancy, Coach Lyngar is your man.

When you combine the strengths and talents of all these assistants with the continuity that comes with staying united for an extended period of time, you have a staff and a program that is always in prime position to succeed.

You have the Rockhurst football team. "We have a familiarity that allows us to start a couple of steps ahead of other staffs," Coach Berg said. "We all do things differently, and one is not better than the others, but we all have the same goal in mind."

What is your favorite quote?

I've always had two. "When you expect more from me than you're willing to do for yourself, then we're going to have a problem."

The second was, "If you don't stretch your limits, you set your limits."

What is the best thing about Rockhurst High School?

I like the environment, the kids, the families, the administration, the alumni, the professionalism; it's just a great everyday place to be.

What is your favorite part about being a coach?

Seeing the kids develop and having them come back to see you years down the road.

What is the most challenging part of being a coach?

Really, it's putting the pieces of the puzzle together year in and year out to keep the program at a high level.

Coach Berg, who begins his 26th year at RHS, was a three-year letterman at MU and graduated with a Master's degree in counseling. While at MU, Eric was named Most Valuable Defensive Player in the 1978 Liberty Bowl and the 1979 Hall of Fame game. He was also named to the 1979 All-Big Eight defensive team. A counselor at RHS, Eric and his wife, Deb, have two daughters, Rachel and Laura, and two sons, Scott and Kevin.

WHILE THE COACH MAY NOT HAVE HAD THE ROCKHURST CROSS-COUNTRY TEAM IN MIND, THE ADDAGE FITS NONETHELESS. HAVING PUT IN THE MILES OVER THE SUMMER, THE SQUAD IS READY TO SET OUT ON THE PATH THAT LEADS TO STATE.

On a hot June day, a group of young men gather each morning to run. Not to chase after a ball, or run around a field. Just to run. The hot sun and racing cars down Ward Parkway don't stop these kids from spending each morning in the pursuit of a goal: qualifying for state. Cross-country

season may have been months away, but for a team with very concrete and lofty ambitions, there isn't a moment to lose in the battle to shave off seconds.

"This is the first time we've really had this many guys working over the summer," said head coach Michael Dierks. "This team's biggest strength is that they want to perform."

And all the tools are in place for them to do so. The varsity cross country squad returns its top seven runners from a team that made it to sectionals last season – and has a goal of taking it a step further this year.

"Getting to sectionals kind of set a bar for this year. The bar is definitely set at

getting the team to state," said sophomore runner and returning varsity letterman, Michael Neisius.

Last season's sectional qualifying was a feat itself considering the Hawklets run in one of Missouri's toughest districts. The team finished sixth out of eight competing in sectionals with some of Missouri's top teams.

Most promising for the team is the degree of progress – and lower times – they saw throughout the season. The team raced the Lake Jacomo course twice, a month and a half apart, and dropped an average of 33 seconds between the races.

"Last season was a little bit of a growing process," said Dierks. "The team really

started to come together at the end, and hopefully that will propel us into next season.”

Though all seven athletes who ran in the sectional meet (seniors Andrew Bush, Nick Cowing, Colin Looby, James Meiners, Will Tarr, sophomore Avery Tummons, and junior Alex Dobens) will be back for the Hawklets next season, that doesn't mean the top spots on the team are set. The freshman team went undefeated last season, and the coaching staff will be looking to some of the younger runners to push the varsity squad and even challenge for spots.

Looby and Cowing were the team's lone state qualifiers and will lead a senior-heavy squad this season. Leadership, along with new more personalized and scientific means of training will be key for the team's five returning varsity who want to go out with a bang. The team's

district won't make that easy, as Blue Springs, Lee's Summit North, Lee's Summit, and Raytown South, all will be competing for spots, along with the addition of a good Lee's Summit West team. The road doesn't get any easier in sectionals, where Oak Park and perennial powerhouse, Liberty, could be waiting.

But with such talent returning, the team isn't content with another appearance in sectionals. A plaque at districts – given to the top two teams – and a trip to state for the entire team are attainable goals.

“We do a good job of giving kids a really powerful athletic and caring community, but we also want to be challenging the varsity,” said Dierks. “We want to make it a goal for the younger kids to get up there.”

“There's a collective goal on the team for this to be the year.” n

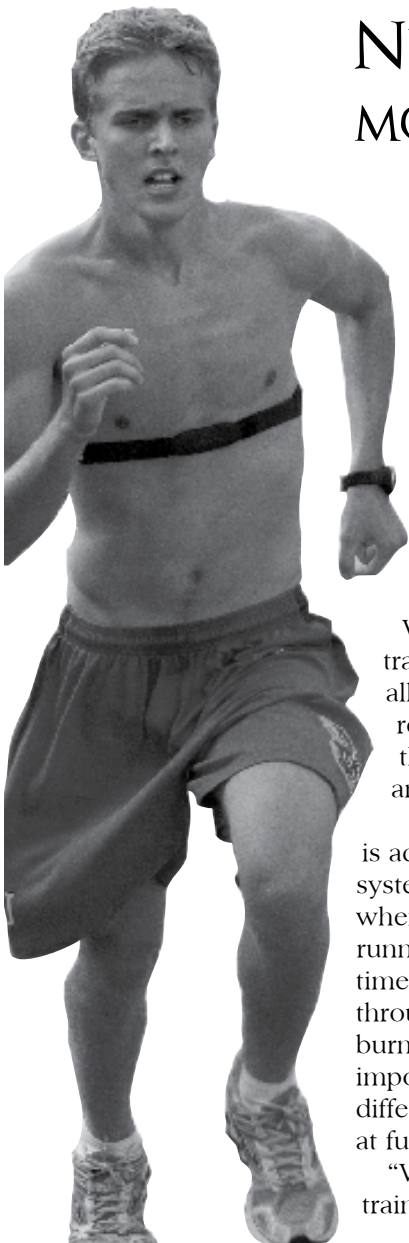
Mike Dierks

Coach Dierks begins his 10th year as head coach of the cross country program. Under his tenure the program has qualified for the state championship twice (out of the four times in the school's history). Coach will serve as president of the Greater Kansas City Cross Country Coaches Association in 2006 and has helped increase participation at RHS to about 80 athletes.

His experience in the sport includes running both track and cross country at Rockhurst from 1988 to 1990. From

there he went to the University of Notre Dame and ran middle distance while earning a monogram in 1992.

Coach Dierks emphasizes personal responsibility and a family atmosphere to motivate his athletes. Within the school he teaches journalism and newspaper courses and is the adviser for the award winning Prep News. He is also the arts department chair and coached track and field for nine years including three years as head coach.



NEW GADGETS AND GIZMOS HELP TEAM MONITOR IMPORTANT ELEMENT: REST

Science is the 2006 Rockhurst cross country team's secret weapon.

Don't worry, there will be no steroid scandals on the team. This science is all about biorhythms, anaerobic and aerobic, and heart rate monitors.

"Running is not just going out and running miles," said head coach Michael Dierks. "What we're doing here is standard procedure for training everywhere."

What their doing is individualizing training for each runner to make sure all are getting rest when they need rest, and running at their peak when they need it: at districts, sectionals, and state.

The idea behind the training is that it is actually possible to "over train" certain systems in the human body, to the point where working too hard can plateau a runner, and may even be hurting his time. Because the body produces energy through three processes – burning fat, burning oxygen, and glycolysis – it is important for runners to train each of the different systems so that each is running at full potential during races.

"We're trying to teach them about training more than just saying go more

than five miles and run until you can't talk," said Dierks. "Cross country is about endurance, strength, and speed. We have to ask 'What percent should you run at to maximize each system?'"

Though the team has been individualizing training for several years, 15 new heart rate monitors will allow the team to accurately measure mileage, heart rate, calories burnt, and loads of other useful information for each runner. Hosting several meets this season gave the team enough money to purchase the monitors.

Coach Dierks stressed that more and more programs are using this type of science to help runners train, making sure to keep heart rates at certain levels (the monitors come with alarms that can be set to beep when a runner goes out of a certain range) and not to work runners too hard.

But he acknowledges that even the best science can't make the best runners.

"We don't want to take the sport and make it too much science. We still want them to still be athletes, and it ultimately comes down to your overall fitness and how hard you're willing to push," Dierks said.

Not that having a secret weapon is a bad thing.
