TWIN EVENTS AT HAIR TIZ SATURDAY NIGHT

Sex changes banned at Baptist hospital

OKLAHOMA CITY - Southern Baptist officials met in executive session last week and voted 54 to 2 to ban sex change operations at the Baptist Medical Center, a major U.S. center for such surgery. The operations had been suspended all summer pending a verdict by the board of directors of the Baptist General Convention of Oklahoma. The Rev. Joe Ingram, executive director of the general convention, said the board's ruling would be the final word on the subject that has sparked bitter fighting in the denomination. "This decision will be it," he said. "There will be no ifs, ands or question marks. This will be the decision that stands."

The 67 member board is dominated by Baptist ministers who generally have opposed the operations on grounds that such psychological abnormalities can be righted only through spiritual transformation. The operations were performed at the hospital for four years, during which the sex of more than 50 patients was changed, mostly from male to female. An additional 50 transsexuals were in preliminary stages of the change, awaiting the board's decision.

The revelation that Baptist Medical Center and the University of Oklahoma Hospital were performing sex changes in sufficient numbers to make Oklahoma City one of the nation's centers for such operations sparked a major controversy in Oklahoma Baptist ranks. About half a dozen other U.S. hospitals offer similar surgery.

Baptist Medical Center's lay advisory board, the medical staff and the team of physicians who help in the operations favor resuming them. Dr. David William Foerstler and Dr. Charles Reynolds, speaking for the gender identity team that performs the operations, said the operations are consistent with their religious beliefs. "If Jesus Christ were alive today, undoubtedly He would render help and comfort to the transsexual as He did the leper, the blind and the lame," they said in a joint statement.

Anita asks forgiveness for assailant



DES MOINES, IA. - Anita Bryant and husband Bob Green bow their heads in a prayer for the man who has just thrown a banana cream pie in Bryant's face at a Des Moines press conference. The pie thrower, allowed to go free at Green's request, identified himself as Tom Higgins, and said he was a homosexual from Minneapolis. Bryant has called homosexual activists "a sick segment of society." Her comment on the incident: "At least it is a fruit pie." (AF)

According to the Star from Houston, Anita Bryant's book "The Anita Bryant Story, The Survival of our Nation's Families and the Threat of Militant Homosexuality", is due out within a week. She and her husband are planning a promotional trip to Los Angeles this month. They've put the word out that Bryant's life has been threatened for her L.A. trip. This will put sympathy in the hearts of California when they are told that "the homosexuals are out to get us, but she's going to risk her life and come to California anyway."

News Briefs

DETROIT - The Ku Klux Klan plans to disrupt the National Woman's Conference in Houston this fall because it considers feminists "the misfits of Society," the Detroit news has reported. Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard of the Klan, told the newspaper that the Klan considers the movement a haven for all the misfits of society, including selfadmitted lesbians. Shelton also stated that "Our men also will be there to protect our women from all the militant lesbians who will be there. It's not safe for a decent woman to be there. Some of our women were approached by lesbians at the state meetings." ATLANTA BARB

FOREST HILLS, NY. - Transsexual Renee Richards was defeated recently by Virginia Wade, 1977 Wimbledon champion in the second day of play at the U.S. Open Tennis Championships. Dr. Richards was greeted warmly by the near capacity crowd, which seemed to cheer both players equally. Ms. Wade was earlier quoted as saying that she opposed the entry of Dr. Richards in the tournament She also said that she wasn't worried about the match because she has had experience playing against "forty year old men." ATLANTA BARB NORFOLK, VA. - The Navy is adding a new dimension for people who like to. let their fingers do the walking" Dial-A-Sailor. Instead of a prayer or a Biblical quotation, the Navy innovation can get the caller a dinner guest, a beach companion or someone with whom to enjoy a sporting event. The idea, the Navy says, is to make it easy for Norfolk area residents to meet and greet visiting seamen. DATA BOY

CLEVELAND, OH. - Mayor Ralph Perk recently delivered a strong attack on Gay people. The conservative mayor told reporters following the city sponsored "National Conference on the Blight of Obsenity," that people who feel it necessary to have sex with animals, children, rubber dolls, themselves or with the same sex are not practicing what is normal. I call them pornomaniacs."

MIAMI, FL. - Singer Anita Bryant has been getting anonymous phone calls blaming her for Hurrican Anita, according to her husband. Theatrical producer Bob Green stated that the callers have been saying things like, "I hope you're satisfied, Anita." Green complained that "It has gotten so Anita is being blamed for just about everything that goes wrong in this country." Anita also received "a very nice letter" from the National Weather Service pointing out that the hurricane was not named after her. Hurricane names are selected ten years in advance. BARB

AUSTIN, TX. - The Texas Legislature has passed a statement of intent that encourages state university campuses to attempt to prohibit Gay student organizations. An earlier attempt at an outright ban on Gay student organizations was defeated on a point of order. The statement of intent is a result of a controversy over a Gay student organization at Texas A & M University. The Gay student group there is sueing the university after officials refused to give recognition to the group.

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

On our front page, at first glance, it seemed a good thing to happen. Something that a good many Gays throughout the country would like to have participated in. A pie in the face has always been a part of comedy and slapstick. On the surface, maybe, it seemed like the thing to do.

Deep down, though, the Anitapie episode was not done in jest or
slapstick and must be viewed as a
disservice to the Gay cause. Our anger
or spite should not be shown in such
a manner. Violence breeds violence.
While not advocating the turning of
a cheek, there certainly are more
reasonable and sensible methods of
getting our cry for Gay human rights
across to the country.

The damage is done and she has made the most of it. We must give her another victory, a small one, to be sure, but a victory nonetheless. Let us use our common senses, plan and work together for our common cause.

Gay's Style Power

NEW YORK - According to an article in trendy New York magazine, "Gay men influence what we wear, where we go, how we care for ourselves." Suzanne Slesin, a contributing editor who specializes in home furnishings, quotes designers who believe Gays are gifted with a natural talent and that "their strength lies in being able to put it all together."

In New York City, Gays are definitely style setters. They latch onto a particular look, and it spreads very fast. Says one observer, "For many younger Gays, style is very important. The new generation seems to have expensive haircuts, wear stylish clothes to gain social acceptance, not just in the Gay world, but in the world at large."

In fashion, says Slesin, many factors have contributed to the new understated style - so popular with Gays. But advertisers and retailers are now picking up on what Gays call "last years look." Menswear designer Don Robbie, for one, is showing a line of "WASP ethic clothes. Goofy things are out," he says. Fashion editor Slesin concludes, "The clean-cut preppie look reflects a current trend among Gays towards conservatism: the cotton-knit shirt, crew sweater and shorter haircuts."

LOS ANGELES, CA. - Ignoring a plea from defense attorneys who said their client self-described transsexual Geraldine Elizabeth Carmichael, was persecuted because of the sex change and that "she would be raped" in a men's prison, Judge Harold J. Ackerman directed that the sentence he imposed be served at the California Institution for Men at Chino.

A jury had found Carmichael guilty of fraud. Carmichael had formed the 20th Century Motor Car Corp., which promised production of a three-wheeled car that was to get 70 miles on a gallon of gas, but it never got as far as the assembly line. She was sentenced to two to 20 years and fined \$30,000. She remains free pending appeal.

False Eyelashes Irk Judge

SEATTLE - A 23 year old man who said he had legitimate reasons for wearing women's clothes and accessories was found guilty in Yakima District Court of impersonating a female. Judge George Mullins ordered a presentence investigation for Wayne Lopez Garcia. Maximum penalty for the misdemeanor is 90 days in jail or a fine of \$250.

Garcia said he was wearing his mother's coat when he was arrested because it was a particularly "chilly" day and his coat was at the cleaners. He said the high-heeled sandals he was wearing were bought at a men's shoe store in Phoenix, Arizona. Because the sandals caused undue friction on his feet, Garcia explained, he put on a pair of his mother's hylons to minimize chafing. The hylons were cut in half and went up as high as his knees.

"I wore the blue scarf around my head because it was windy....I had bought the eyelashes three hours earlier at K-Mart. I was just curious to see what it'd look like," he said. The arresting officer said the man was also wearing make-up and errings. He said Garcia wasn't being disorderly, but "his clothing attracted my attention."


"Based on the strict language of the ordinance, he was obviously attired in women's clothing - that was even admitted," Judge Mullins said. "But I think his case goes beyone that." Mullins said there are situations in which males might use cosmetics to cover up blemishes, birth marks or shaving nicks. He said it's often hard to distinguish whether certain sandals or coats are suited strictly for men or women. "But in this case, the guy wearing false eye-lashes gives me a little trouble. Looking at this case as a whole, it seems within the purview of the ordinance," Mullins said.

The ordinance says men attired in women's clothing constitute vagrancy. A salesman from a local men's shoe store testified sandals like the ones Carcia wore are sometimes made for men. He added his store didn't sell any for men with heels quite so high. "We're not saying in this Ordinance that men appearing in public can't wear any single item mentioned," Asst. City Attorney Bob Bounds said. "Who's to say if a belt or a hat is for a man or woman? There are males today who wear earrings, God rest their souls. But you can only go so far." Garcia, who was wearing earrings in the courtroom said he had no intention of dressing like a female. SEATTLE GAY NEWS by Mark Nelson






Review





Perspective

The following editorial appeared in the Aztec Campus News, the Pima Community College Newspaper in Tucson.

A \$5 million civil rights lawsuit was filed in federal court against Anita Bryant and others, charging they incited the murder of homosexual Robert Hillsborough in San Francisco in June. The action was brought by the victim's mother under a federal civil rights statute of 1961 and said that Miss Bryant and her Save-Our-Children Inc. organization in Florida incited an atmosphere that resulted in the stabbing death of Hillsborough.

Americans can be righteously proud of our political system that gave Miss Bryant the ways and means to accomplish her anti-homosexual campaign, but no reasonable person would share in her unfounded and irrational fear of homosexuals. We each have the right to shape the quality of our own life. That basic right certainly includes our choice of sexuality and excludes the self-appointed right of anyone to infringe on our private bedroom behavior.

That's not to say Miss Bryant should be held directly responsible for the murder of Robert Hillsborough. The federal court has that decision to make. What is to say is that Robert Hillsborough had the right to be as he wanted, without interference from Miss Bryant or anyone else, so long as he didn't harm the rights of Miss Bryant or anyone else.

We should all be horrified when prejudice results in discrimination, wherever it happens in our society.




NEWS FROM L.A.D.S

This week the recipe is one you can't refuse, it's from our own Godfather of Tucson, George Rederus. This is a fantastic recipe for Beef Strogan-

- 2 Lbs. sirloin tip of beef cut 1/2 in. thick
- 2 Tablespoons flour
- l Teaspoon salt
- ½ Teaspoon black pepper
- 14 Cups beef bouillon
- 4 Cup finely chopped onion
- 2 Tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 Teaspoon dry mustard
- 1 Can (4 ozs.) mushrooms, not drained
- 14 Cup burgundy
- ½ Cup dairy sour cream

Cut meat into 12 by 1 inch strips. Dredge in seasoned flour. Brown on all sides in butter, turning often. Add bouilion, onion, tomato paste, mustard, mushrooms and burgundy. Cover and simmer about 45 Minutes or until meat is tender Wtir in cream and serve. Do not boil.






