ASA Member James "Chico" Hernandez brings home Silver from British Open!

James Chico Hernandez, 53, of Washburn, Maine won the Silver medal in the Veterans Division at the 2007 British Sambo Championship (FIAS) held March 24 at the Swallow Leisure Center in Sittingbourne.

Chico competed in the Open Class (no weight class) defeating Oktam of Uzbekistan 1-0 in the Quarterfinals. He defeated returning Silver medallist Graham Mann of Norfolk, England by Total Victory in the semi-finals. Hernandez was leading 8-0 before he slammed his opponent to his back while remaining standing for Total Victory. In

40 plus lifetime Sambo and competitions; it was Chico's very first win by Total Victory.

Chico was defeated in the finals by Darren Richardson of Portsmouth, England. It was a close match at 2-0.

This is Chico's third time to win British Silver. He also won in 2004 and 2005. Hernandez representing TEAM IRISH of Bangor, Maine and the American Sambo Association.

Countries present at the 2007 British Open included France, England, Scotland, Russia, USA, Uzbekistan, Armenia, and Poland.

USAW Sombo Nationals Results!

U.S. World Team determined at U.S. Sombo Nationals and World Team Trials

LAS VEGAS - The 2007 U.S. Sombo World Teams for both men and women were determined at the U.S. Sombo Nationals and World Team Trials, held at the Las Vegas Convention Center on Saturday.

Winners in each weight class were crowned national champions, and qualified to compete at the World Sombo Championships in Antalya, Turkey, Sept. 7-9.

Among the champions was 2006 Sombo World bronze medallist Leigh Jaynes (Colorado Springs, Colo./U.S. Army), who claimed the women's title at 63 kg/ 138.5 lbs.. Jaynes won a best-of-three series over Julieta Okot (New York, N.Y./ J.E.T.S./No Limits).

It was the second national title for Jaynes in two days, as she was also the U.S. Women's National freestyle champion at 59 kg/130 lbs. on Friday night.

Okot won the first match of the series, 1-0, but Jaynes came back with wins in the next two matches, both by 4-0 scores.

Another competitor from the U.S. team at the 2006 Sombo World Championships who claimed an individual title was Carlos Dolmo (Bronx, N.Y./Blast Double NY), the champion at 120 kg/ 264.5 lbs. Dolmo placed seventh at the 2006 World Sombo Championships.

Dolmo won four matches during the round robin tournament, including a 2-0 victory over runner-up Gabe Beauperthuy (Colorado Springs, Colo./unattached).

Selected by the officials as the Outstanding Wrestler in the men's division was the champion at 74 kg/163 lbs., Seth Bregman (Aurora, Colo. /Colorado BJJ). In the championship finals, Bregman stopped Roman Mitichyan (Glendale, Calif./Hayastan), 5-3 for the gold medal.

Claiming the title at 66 kg/ 145.5 lbs was Jake Bohn (Irvine, Calif./J.E.T.S./No Limits), who won a six-athlete round-robin at his division. Bohn won four of his five matches, including a 9-0 decision over runner-up Phil Rizzo (St. Petersburg, Fla./Team Pursuit).

The men's champion at 84 kg/ 185 lbs. was Scott Garcia (Mesa, Ariz./American Pankration) who defeated teammate Jeff Funicello (Mesa, Ariz./American Pankration), 6-0 in the finals.

Capturing the 96 kg/211.5 lbs. title was Douglas Fournet (Baton Rouge, La./Gladiators Academy), who stopped Aram Ghukasyan (Los Angeles, Calif./Kenam's Judo Club), 4-3 in an intense finals match

Ghukasayan had defeated 2006 Sombo World Champion Jeff Zastrow (Whitewater, Wis./Warhawk WC) in the semifinals, 9-6. Zastrow ended up fourth,

losing his bronze medal match to Paul Jones (Boys Ranch, Texas/Roughrider Wrestling), 4-3.

Winning titles uncontested in the men's division were Eric Albarracin (Colorado Springs, Colo./EA Kombat – Modern Army Combatives at 55 kg / 121 lbs and Alfredo Varela of (Noble, Okla./Underdog Inc.) at 60 kg/132 lbs.

Missouri Valley College in Marshall, Mo. had a pair of individual champions in the women's division, Tanya Miyasaki at 48 kg/105.5 lbs. and Courtney Martell at 121 pounds.

Miyasaki won all three of her bouts in a four-athlete round robin, including a 2-0 victory over runner-up Amantha Hordagoda (Bakersfield, Calif./Spartan WC).

Martell won a three-athlete round-robin, including a 5-1 victory over Missouri Valley teammate Samantha Schuman, the silver medallist at the weight class.

The women's champion at 59 kg / 130 lbs. was Samantha Phillips (Manteca, Calif./Spartan WC), who won a three-athlete round-robin, including a 6-1 win over runner-up Amberle Montgomery (Colorado Springs, Colo./J.E.T.S./No Limits.

Three women champions were uncontested: Jessica Ortiz of (Vallejo, Calif./Spartan WC) at 51 kg/ 112 lbs., Bethany Harris (Irvine, Calif./J.E.T.S./No Limits at 67 kg/ 147.5 lbs and Marina Piccolotti (Pacifica, Calif./Spartan WC at 72 kg / 158.5 lbs.

Serge Gerlach Sambo Seminar in San Francisco!

Combat Sambo Champion Serge Gerlach presents a full day of 'incremental' instruction in this highly regarded Russian full-contact martial art.

Day one:

Will cover the core movement series that will elaborate from large-body movements and refine into protective rolling/break falls, takedowns and counters and striking. We'll use posture drills, partnered unbalancing and restoration drills and some efficient footwork that will assist in quickly gaining command of stand-up Sambo work. All of this will then be connected to groundwork where, if we can't walk like men then we will "move like a snake". Every movement in Sambo is useful in all phases and this will be the focus of "day one". There will be a light sparring session to end the day.

Day two:

Will focus on the various "keys" that quickly teach an excellent repertoire of knife/stick/choke/punch/kick et. al. defenses and maneuvers. The previous movements we be explored will elaborated into more detailed throws and follow-ups with an eye toward more realistic application (i.e. increased resistance). We'll have a short sparring session to see how everything is being absorbed. After that, we will go through arm & leglocking series and, depending on interest, chokes, no-gi work and weapons work. Again, we will finish with a sparring session to properly tire ourselves out and celebrate our manhood;)

Materials to bring:

I'll bring my sledgehammers but if you have one or two kicking around bring it along (doesn't everybody?), stick (single-stick/escrima rattan), training knife, a mouthpiece if you're comfortable with one. A kurtka (Russian jacket), judo-gi or anything approximate to that. Wrestling shoes, sambofki, or the like. Bring gloves if you like to hit people/stuff, same goes with shin/foot protection.

2007 ASA Pioneer of Sambo Awards. Send in Your Nominations!

We are now accepting nominations for the 2007 American Sambo Association **Pioneers of American Sambo Award**.

In 2006 the American Sambo Association launched the annual *Pioneers of American Sambo* award to be given at the annual North American Freestyle Sambo Championships. This award is intended to recognize individuals who have made great strides towards promotion of Sambo in the United States. In 2006 three awards were given to mirror our first three years of existence as an Association.

Past inductees include:

2004 - Oleg Taktarov 2005 - Dr. Khassan Baiev

2006 - Dr. Sandy North

This year we will be giving one award for 2007.

The award process takes place as follows:

The ASA will receive nominations through July 2007. Once nominations are received, the ASA Board will review/compile submitted nominations and create a ballot. The ballot will be distributed to all ASA members in August, 2007 for voting. While anyone may submit a nomination, only current ASA members will be eligible to vote in the award election.

Nominations for this annual award are based on any one (or combination) of the following possible criteria:

- 1. Competition history;
- 2. Promotion of Sambo in the US;
- 3. Literature contributions:
- 4. Popularization of Sambo in the US;
- 5. Character attributes that represent the best of our sport:
- Notable achievements in US Sambo;
- 7. Any other honorable contributions you may feel appropriate.

*Winners need not be members of the American Sambo Association.

Nominations MUST INCLUDE the following information to be accepted for review:

1) Name of nominee

- 2) Address, phone, and e-mail of nominee. If the nomination is posthumous, contact information for the person who may accept the award on the recipient's behalf must be provided.
- 3) A clearly written document outlining the nominee's history in Sambo and their contributions to the sport's growth in the United States.
- 4) Name, address, phone, and e-mail of the person making the nomination.

The 2007 winner will be presented his/her award at the 2007 North American Freestyle Sambo Championships in October and will be honored on the awards page of our website:
