**THE GAME** • Western Michigan opens its 102nd season with a ranked oppnent for the fifth time in program history. West Virginia is ranked third in the Associated Press preseason poll, while the Mountaineers are in the sixth spot on the USA Today/Coaches preseason poll.

**TELEVISION** • The Bronco football program continues to gain regional and national notoriety through television exposre. Western Michigan is scheduled to play on live television at least five times this season. WMU will air on the ESPN family networks twice at home in 2007. The first comes in the season opener against Indiana, airing on ESPNU. Dave Armstrong will handle play-by-play and Mike Gottfried will provide analysis.

**RADIO** • This and all Western Michigan football games will be broadcast live on the Bronco Radio Network and its new flagship station, WZUU - 92.5 FM. Robin Hook (play-by-play) and Monty Porter (analysis) will have the call as they have together for the past nine seasons.

**WEB SITE** • WMU home football games (not televised by the ESPN family of networks) can be seen live via the official athletics web site (www.wmubroncos.com) by subscribing to Bronco Insider, which can be found on the home page of the site. You are able to listen to each Bronco football game on the Internet by signing up with Yahoo Sports through the link at the bottom of the home page. Live Stats are available for FREE for all Bronco home games by clicking the link atop the home football page.

SERIES IN BRIEF • The Western Michigan/Indiana series consists of just three games with the Hoosiers having taken all three meetings. The two teams first met in 1995 and last met in the 2006 season opener. All games have been played at Memorial Stadium in Bloomington, Ind. This game will not only mark the first time Indiana will play a road game in this series, it also marks the first time any team from the Big Ten will play at Waldo Stadium.

Last season, WMU fell to IU 39-20 at Memorial Stadium. Jamarko Simmons led the aerial attack with seven catches for 99 yards, all coming in the first half.

**THE COACHES** • Bill Cubit (Delaware, 1975) begins his third season as the head coach of Western Michigan. He is 15-9 overall at Western Michigan and led the Broncos to their first bowl game since 1988 last season. Bill Lynch takes over the Indiana football program after the tragic passing of former head coach Terry Hoeppner. Lynch has a 82-67-3 career mark in 14 years on the sidelines and is 1-0 with the Hoosiers.

**UP NEXT** • Western Michigan will head back on the road for a showdown with its first Big 12 opponent since 1999. The opponent on that day will be the same on Sept. 15, Missouri. The Tigers took the only meeting between these two programs, 48-34.

## **GAME 2 – WESTERN MICHIGAN VS. INDIANA – GAME NOTES**

**WELCOME HOME** • Western Michigan will have its home opener on Sept. 8, the annual CommUniverCity Night. The game will kick off at 8 p.m. and air live on ESPNU. It will mark the first time a team from the Big Ten visits Waldo Stadium.

**BRING OUT THE TENTS** • Western Michigan's annual home opener has become synonymous with one word — CommUniverCity. An event that started in 1992, this season marks the 16th year of CommUniverCity. It is now known as CommUniverCity Night because the only year the Broncos' home opener was played during the afternoon was during the first year of the event, 1992.

**FAMILY NETWORKING** • WMU's game against Indiana will be the first of two games the ESPN family of networks will be on campus to cover the game. ESPNU will broadcast on Sept. 8 and ESPN2 will air the showdown against Central Michigan on Nov. 6. That will be the first nationally televised game ever played at Waldo Stadium.

**FINDING YOUR SPOTS** • Junior receiver Jamarko Simmons opened the 2007 season as he ended his 2006 campaign, hauling in 14 receptions for 144 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Simmons' 14-catch day against No. 3 West Virginia ties Steve Neal for fourth on the WMU all-time list for receptions in a game. Simmons added his name to that list in the International Bowl with 13 catches, which now ranks sixth. Neal hauled in his 14 grabs against Toledo in 1999.

**WELCOME BACK** • When Tim Hiller stepped onto the field against WVU on Sept. 1 it marked the first time he did so in a game since Nov. 23, 2005. That is a span of 647 days. Hiller finished with 160 yards on 16-of-25 passing. He also ran for a score, the second rushing touchdown of his career.

Also seeing the field for the first time since the 2005 season was senior safety Antwain Allen. Allen missed all of 2006 with a knee injury suffered during spring practice heading into last season.

**DEEP IN THE PLAYBOOK** • Western Michigan showed its versatility on offense during its second possession against West Virginia when Herb Martin received the pitch from Hiller only to stop and heave a pass 14 yards to the wide open Jamarko Siimons for the score. It was the second-straight game (dating back to the International Bowl) that WMU used the option pass to score. E.J. Biggers tossed a 76-yard scoring strike for the Broncos' first score against Cincinnati. Simmons has been on the receiving end of both plays.

**YOU ALWAYS REMEMBER YOUR FIRST TIME •** Fourteen Broncos made their onfield collegiate debut against West Virginia with four making their first-career starts.

**TAKE IT AWAY** • After completion by WVU, Bronco safety C.J. Wilson stripped the receiver of the ball, which was recovered by E.J. Biggers. That was WMU's lone take away of the game but it marked the 27th-straight game the Broncos have caused a turnover (either fumble recovery or interception). The last time a WMU opponent came away unscathed was Northern Illinois in 2004.

**CLEAN SWEEP** • Western Michigan swept the Player of the Week honors for the Mid-American Conference West Divsion in Week 1.

#### JAMARKO SIMMONS - OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Simmons hauled in 14 receptions for 144 yards and two touchdowns against No. 3 West Virginia. The 14 catches rank fourth all-time in a single game in WMU history and ties for ninth place in MAC history.

#### AUSTIN PRITCHARD — DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Pritchard led WMU with 11 tackles at West Virginia, registering five solo and assisting on six more. It was the third double-digit tackle performance of his career.

#### JIM LANEY — SPECIAL TEAMS CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Laney recorded seven punts for a 50.7 average, a single-game career best. Laney had a long punt of 59 yards and landed three inside the 20-yard line.

**PUTTING UP POINTS** • After the first week of games, Western Michigan leads the MAC West Division in ponts scored with 24. The Broncos share the point-lead with Toledo, which also scored 24 against Purdue. Ohio and Bowling Green lead the way for the conference overall with 36 and 32 points, respectively.

**GETTING AN EARLY START** • The Broncos played 10 freshmen (five true freshmen) in their 2007 season opener against No. 3 West Virginia. Over the past two seasons, WMU has utilized their youngsters extensively. In 2005 the Broncos played 18 freshmen but that dwindled to seven a season ago.

**HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE** • In 68 seasons at Waldo Stadium, the Broncos boast a 211-132-4 (.608) all-time record at home. That percentage jumps 15 points when talking about what Western Michigan does in home openers. WMU is 51-16-1 (.757) in first home games of seasons and has not lost a home opener since 1996 (Eastern Illinois, 20-28).

Bill Cubit has the best winning percentage among WMU coaches at home. He is 9-1 (.900) and achieved the ninth undefeated season at Waldo Stadium, going 5-0 in 2006. The only blemish is a five-overtime loss to Ball State (57-60) on Oct. 8, 2005.

Western Michigan's longest winning streak at home is 15 games, a feat accomplished from Nov. 16, 1943 (Manchester, 19-14) to Nov. 6, 1943 (Great Lakes NAS, 6-32). WMU's current home winning streak stands at seven.

**FIRST TIME, LONG TIME** • The Broncos have played a Big Ten opponent 30 times with the first meeting coming against Michigan State on Oct. 10, 1908. The Spartans defeated the Broncos, 35-0. All of the past meetings have had one thing in common, they were all played at the home stadium of the Big Ten team. That changes on Sept. 8 when Indiana becomes the first Big Ten opponent to play Western Michigan at Waldo Stadium.

Western Michigan has played a Big Ten opponent four times when that opponent was ranked in the top-25. Wisconsin was ranked No. 7 in 1963 and No. 4 in 2000. Michigan was ranked No. 7 in 2002 and Michigan State was ranked No. 25 in 1997.

**AGAINST THE BIG TEN** • Eight members of the 11-institution Big Ten conference have seen Western Michigan on their schedules at one time or another. WMU holds a 4-26-0 mark against the conference, has registered multiple wins over one (Michigan State) and holds a series edge over one (lowa).

HITTING FOR AVERAGE • Indiana wide out James Hardy had just three catches against Indiana State. That was a good thing for ISU as the 6-7 receiver racked up 153 yards and two touchdowns for a 50.1 yards per catch average. His two scoring grabs were 58 and 79 yards, respectively.

**NO RUNNING IN THE HOUSE** • In last year's meeting, neither WMU, nor Indiana could muster much of a ground game. The two teams were separated by one yard of net rushing with the Broncos holding the edge, 72-71.

IU DO's & DON'T'S • Indiana is a team with talent. These two teams know each other, having played a season ago. Not only will both teams of tape from their respective season openers, but they will have tape from last season's meeting to develop a game plan.

**D0:** The best thing for Western Michigan is to get off to a good start. It always helps to get the home fans into it if the home team can post an early score or make an early stop, especially after coming off a loss.

**DON'T:** Western Michigan hurt itself with penalties against West Virginia. Unforced errors make it difficult to sustain drives and momentum.

**NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES** • The Bronco coaching staff underwent significant changes during the offseason, replacing five coaches from its 2006 staff

**Bill Miller** comes to Kalamazoo as the program's new defensive coordinator. Miller was most recently at Arizona State where he served as the DC for the Sun Devils. He has been the defensive coordinator Michigan State and Miami (Fla.).

**Grant Heard** comes to WMU as the program's new receivers coach from his alma mater Ole Miss where he was a graduate assistant for the past two seasons.

Scott Kavanagh is the Broncos' new quarterbacks coach. The former Wisconsin quarterback spent the last three seasons at Cornell where he worked with the Big Red's receivers (2004) and quarterbacks (2005-06) under head coach, and former WMU assistant, Jim Knowles.

Peter McCarty takes over as Western Michigan's defensive line coach, moving Tim Daoust over to coach the Broncos' talented secondary unit. McCarty was most recently on the coaching staff at former Mid-American Conference institution Central Florida. He and Bill Cubit have worked at the same schools (although not during the same years) twice as McCarty has also spent a pair of seasons at Stanford.

**Bob Stanley** brings his 37 years of coaching experience to Kalamazoo as the Broncos' offensive line coach. Stanley spent last season at New Mexico after spending 2003-05 at Kansas State.

**CLEATS FOR A CLIPBOARD** • A starting defensive end for the Broncos last season, Matt Ludeman has turned in his cleats and is now a member of the coaching staff. Ludeman enters his first season as the defensive graduate assistant. His playing career was extended this summer when he participated with Team USA in Japan, winning the USA Football Tournament.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR • Robbie Krutilla and Branden Ledbetter find their names among the nation's elite in their respective positions. Krutilla has been named to a pair of preseason watch lists and Ledbetter has earned a spot on one. Krutilla is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List (the award for the nation's best center) as well as the Outland Trophy (the award for the nation's best interior lineman). It is the second year he has made it onto the Rimington preseason list.

Ledbetter finds himself on the John Mackey Award Watch List (the award for the nation's best tight end) for the first time. He was named the Mackey Tight End of the Week once last season after amassing 101 yards receiving against Miami.

**CAPTAIN O' CAPTAIN •** For the first time in program history, Western Michigan football will not have season captains. This season the Broncos will have game captains selected prior to each game.

LUCKY NUMBER SEVEN • Western Michigan is coming off back-to-back seasons with seven or more wins - the magic number to ensure bowl eligibility. Impressive as that is, another season with seven or more wins would only rank third all-time. The most consecutive seasons WMU has won seven or more games is six (1990-95). WMU went a combined 42-18-1 over that span. Ranking second is a span of four seasons (1997-2000) when the Broncos wen 31-15, won nine games (2000) for only the second time in program history and appeared in a two-straight MAC title games.

Another eight-win campaign would put this team in a class by itself for being the only one to capture back-to-back seasons with eight wins or better.

**POLL POSITION** • Western Michigan was chosen by the Mid-American Conference News Media Association (MNMA) to not only win the West Division but take the conference crown home to Kalamazoo. WMU has steadily risen up the MAC West standings after finishing last in 2004 with a third-place finish in 2005 and a second-place finish last season.

FAR EAST MEETS WESTERN MICHIGAN • For the entire 2007 season a Japanese collegiate football coach will be shadowing the Western Michigan program. Masatoshi Isowa spent all of spring and preseason camp in Kalamazoo learning coaching techniques from the staff. He will stay with the program until the conclusion of the season. He is also shadowing math courses in order to bring different teaching techniques back to Japan.

PROFESSOR KNOX • Western Michigan football will infiltrate the world of academia as director of football operations Tim Knox will teach an undergraduate class in the Health, Physical Education and Recreation department. The class is Football 1350 and is intended to equip future physical education teachers with the ability to relay the techniques of the game to their students. The class will take place during the 2007 Fall semester.
