THE GAME • Western Michigan football takes to the road for the second time this season, facing a third-straight opponent from a BCS conference. This week it is Missouri of the Big 12 that will take the field against the Broncos in Columbia, Mo. The Tigers lead the all-time series, 1-0, and are coming off wins over Illinois and Ole Miss. WMU is 0-2 after time ran out on a comeback in its home opener against Indiana.

TELEVISION • The Bronco football program continues to gain regional and national notoriety through television exposre. Western Michigan is scheduled to play on live television at least five times this season. WMU will air on the ESPN family networks twice at home in 2007. The game against Missouri will not be televised.

RADIO • This and all Western Michigan football games will be broadcast live on the Bronco Radio Network and its new flagship station, WZUU - 92.5 FM. Robin Hook (play-by-play) and Monty Porter (analysis) will have the call as they have together for the past nine seasons.

WEB SITE • WMU home football games (not televised by the ESPN family of networks) can be seen live via the official athletics web site (www.wmubroncos.com) by subscribing to Bronco Insider, which can be found on the home page of the site. You are able to listen to each Bronco football game on the Internet by signing up with Yahoo Sports through the link at the bottom of the home page. Live Stats are available for FREE for all Bronco home games by clicking the link atop the home football page. Today's game will be available via GameTracker at www.mutigers.com.

SERIES IN BRIEF • The Western Michigan/Missouri series consists of just one game. On Sept. 18, 1999, the Broncos traveled to Columbia, Mo., for the first time and left with a 48-34 loss. Two members of that team are still with the Broncos. That season was Cubit's last the Broncos' offensive coordinator and it was also the senior season for Jake Moreland (now in his third year as WMU's tight ends coach).

Four current members of the Bronco coaching staff have ties to Missouri; one as a student-athlete, one as a student and two as coaches.

THE COACHES • Bill Cubit (Delaware, 1975) begins his third season as the head coach of Western Michigan. He is 15-11 overall, 9-2 at Waldo Stadium, at Western Michigan and led the Broncos to their first bowl game since 1988 last season. Gary Pinkel is in his seventh season as the head coach at Missouri and boasts a 39-34 record with the Tigers. Pinkel spent 10 years as the head coach at Toledo where he amassed a 73-37-3 record and a MAC title in 1995.

UP NEXT • Western Michigan will take on Division 1-FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) opponent Central Connecticut State at Waldo Stadium on Sept. 22. It will be the first meeting between the two programs and it will also be the first game against a D1-FCS team since playing Southern Illinois in the 2005 home opener.

SLOW START • Western Michigan suffered its second loss to open the 2007 campaign, falling to Indiana, 37-27, on Sept. 8. Despite the 0-2 start, all WMU needs to do is look to two years ago when many of these same student-athletes had the same fate, losing to No. 23 Virginia and Toledo to open 2005. What happened next? The Broncos won seven of their final nine games and had the biggest conference turnaround in MAC history.

The Broncos are also getting off to a slow start literally. Opponents are outscoring Western Michigan, 59-21, in the first two quarters of games. Indiana used a 21-point second quarter to hand WMU its first home-opening loss since 1996 (Eastern Illinois, 20-28).

KO THE COMPETITION • Brandon West had a flare for the dramatic as a freshman returing kicks. He burst onto the scene with kick off returns of 27 and 44 yards against Indiana in 2006, he had a coming out party with returns of 58 and 65 yards at Florida State and put it all together with a 98-yard scoring return in WMU's 2007 home opener. West's kick off return for a score was the first by a Bronco since Tyrone Walker did so against Eastern Michigan on Nov. 9, 2002.

OH WAIT, THERE'S MORE • West's 98-yard returned sparked a 346-all-purpose yardage day for the sophomore, breaking the WMU record previously held by Tony Knox. Knox had 330 yards against West Virginia (Sept. 7, 1996). West amassed 212 yards on five kick returns to not only break the previous Bronco record (Rashad McDade vs. Youngtown State - Sept. 11, 1999) but the previous conference record as well. Eddie Woodward (Kent State) had held the previous mark with 204 against Bowling Green on Oct. 16, 1971.

A LITTLE SOMETHING, YOU KNOW ... FOR THE EFFORT • Brandon West was rewarded for his performance against the Hoosiers and was named the MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week for the second time in his career.

CLIMBING THE HILL • Coming back from a major knee injury was not going to be easy for Tim Hiller and he continues to work his way back from 2005. He is not there yet but career highs in completions, attempts and yards is a sign that things may be headed in the right direction. Hiller finished the Indiana game with 28 completions on 51 attempts for 343 yards - all career-highs. He threw his first three touchdowns of the season during the game but also gave up his third interception, matching his total for all of 2005.

AND THE BAND PLAYED ON • Western Michigan's band, consisting of nearly 300 members, gave the fans plenty to cheer about as the Broncos opened its 2007 home campaign. The band and the fans were a part of the ninth-largest crowd in WMU football history as 32,129 Bronco packed Waldo Stadium on Sept. 8.

SETTING THE BAR • Three Broncos set new career highs in tackles against Indiana. Junior defensive end Zach Davidson registered a career best nine stops, while fellow juniors C.J. Wilson (SS) and Dustin Duclo (LB) recorded a career-high 13 stops apiece.

KEEP IT GOING • The turnover streak for Western Michigan extended to 28-straight games when Andy Dorcely picked off a Kellen Lewis pass in the fourth quarter. It was the first pick of Dorcely's career. E.J. Biggers also forced a fumble but it was recovered by Indiana.

HERE COMES THE BOOM • Jim Laney continued the hot start he had at West Virginia through to the Indiana game, booming a career-long 71 yard punt against the Hoosiers. Laney now has a 48.7 yards per punt average, which ranks third in the country and second in the conference.

CATCHING ON • Junior wide receiver Jamarko Simmons laid to rest that the way he finished the 2006 season and started the 2007 campaign was by chance. He hauled in a career-matching 14 catches against Indiana, which resulted in 158 yards and a touchdown. He now has three-straight games with 10 catches or more and has eclipsed the 100-yard mark in four out of his last five games (missing by two yards against Akron on Nov. 24, 2006).

THERE IS SOMETHING VERY FAMILIAR ABOUT THIS PLACE • Inevitably in college football coaches and former players are bound to cross paths with coaches and universities they had been with in the past. That is the case for four members of the Western Michigan football staff when the Broncos travel to Missouri on Sept. 15.

Bill Cubit • Cubit spent a season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Missouri during the 2000 season.

Chris Tabor • Tabor was joined on the Tigers coaching staff by Cubit in 2000. He had spent three seasons (1997-99) as a graduate assistant for Mizzou. The Tigers went to a pair of bowls in two of the four years Tabor was a member of the staff.

A.J. Ricker • Ricker (pictured below) was an All-Big 12 offensive lineman for Missouri from 2000-03. He held the school record for consecutive starts (47) upon graduation, starting 11 games in 2000 and 2001, 12 games in 2002 and a careerhigh 13 games in 2003. He was a three-time All-Big 12 selection by the coaches and a two-time selection by the Associated Press. He was named Academic All-Big 12 as a junior.





Kyle Blecha • Western Michigan's director of medical services was a student at Missouri from 1993-95. He received his master's degree from Mizzou in 1995.

MIZZOU DO's & DON'T'S • Both teams enter this game ranked near the bottom of the nation defensively. Both teams will be looking to improve on those numbers could mean a long day for both offenses or an area to exploit by one team or another.

D0: Western Michigan's offense has playmakers so why not get the ball to them. WMU has talent at receiver, tight end and running back and not just one, but many players with talent, which will give the Broncos quarterback multiple choices to build on the success of the second half of the Indiana game.

DON'T: Until Western Michigan can improve on its penalty totals, this area will be a focus. WMU leads the nation with 27 penalties in two games and those mental errors will slow the flow of the Broncos' offense and defense if not remedied.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES • The Bronco coaching staff underwent significant changes during the offseason, replacing five coaches from its 2006 staff.

Bill Miller comes to Kalamazoo as the program's new defensive coordinator. Miller was most recently at Arizona State where he served as the DC for the Sun Devils. He has been the defensive coordinator Michigan State and Miami (Fla.).

Grant Heard comes to WMU as the program's new receivers coach from his alma mater Ole Miss where he was a graduate assistant for the past two seasons.

Scott Kavanagh is the Broncos' new quarterbacks coach. The former Wisconsin quarterback spent the last three seasons at Cornell where he worked with the Big Red's receivers (2004) and quarterbacks (2005-06) under head coach, and former WMU assistant, Jim Knowles.

Peter McCarty takes over as Western Michigan's defensive line coach, moving Tim Daoust over to coach the Broncos' talented secondary unit. Mc-Carty was most recently on the coaching staff at former Mid-American Conference institution Central Florida. He and Bill Cubit have worked at the same schools (although not during the same years) twice as McCarty has also spent a pair of seasons at

Bob Stanley brings his 37 years of coaching experience to Kalamazoo as the Broncos' offensive line coach. Stanley spent last season at New Mexico after spending 2003-05 at Kansas State.

CLEATS FOR A CLIPBOARD • A starting defensive end for the Broncos last season, Matt Ludeman has turned in his cleats and is now a member of the coaching staff. Ludeman enters his first season as the defensive graduate assistant. His playing career was extended this summer when he participated with Team USA in Japan, winning the USA Football Tournament.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR • Robbie Krutilla and Branden Ledbetter find their names among the nation's elite in their respective positions. Krutilla has been named to a pair of preseason watch lists and Ledbetter has earned a spot on one. Krutilla is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List (the award for the nation's best center) as well as the Outland Trophy (the award for the nation's best interior lineman). It is the second year he has made it onto the Rimington preseason list.

Ledbetter finds himself on the John Mackey Award Watch List (the award for the nation's best tight end) for the first time. He was named the Mackey Tight End of the Week once last season after amassing 101 yards receiving against Miami.

CAPTAIN O' CAPTAIN • It looke as if for the first time in program history, Western Michigan football would not have season captains. This season began with the Broncos choosing game captains for its first two games.

LUCKY NUMBER SEVEN • Western Michigan is coming off back-to-back seasons with seven or more wins - the magic number to ensure bowl eligibility. Impressive as that is, another season with seven or more wins would only rank third all-time. The most consecutive seasons WMU has won seven or more games is six (1990-95). WMU went a combined 42-18-1 over that span. Ranking second is a span of four seasons (1997-2000) when the Broncos wen 31-15, won nine games (2000) for only the second time in program history and appeared in a two-straight MAC title games.

Another eight-win campaign would put this team in a class by itself for being the only one to capture backto-back seasons with eight wins or better.

POLL POSITION • Western Michigan was chosen by the Mid-American Conference News Media Association (MNMA) to not only win the West Division but take the conference crown home to Kalamazoo. WMU has steadily risen up the MAC West standings after finishing last in 2004 with a third-place finish in 2005 and a second-place finish last season.


